

Frankie McGinnis, 26, Robinson Circle Lenoir City, was charged with Littering, and DUI. On 08/10/2014 Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, observe a 2000 Dodge, on Highway 11 East when the driver of the afore mentioned vehicle through a cigarette butt from the window. After running the vehicles registration with Loudon County E911 the reg-

istration showed it belonged on a maroon vehicle however was displayed on a silver Dodge. Deputy conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle on Highway 11 at Robinson Drive. After the initial contact Deputy identified the driver as Frankie Lynn Mc-Ginnis and noticed a strong and distinct odor of alcoholic beverage coming from the driver, as well as McGinnis admit to littering the cigarette butt. Deputy also observed McGinnis to have

red/watery bloodshot eyes, had a difficult time retrieving documents with slurred speech. Deputy asked McGinnis to exit the vehicle to conduct Standardized Field Sobriety Tasks. McGinnis did poorly on Standardized Field Sobriety Tasks as well as did admit consuming 2 miller light beers about one
