Officer Brandon Gentry LCPD, made the arrest.



Deputy did have Whitehead exit the vehicle in order to ascertain if the smell of alcoholic beverage was emitting from his persons, the passenger (Lawhorn) or both.

After exiting the vehicle Whitehead had extremely exaggerated movements as well as Deputy could see his red / watery bloodshot eyes. Deputy asked Whitehead to perform a series of standardized field sobriety tasks, which he agreed to. Whitehead did poorly on standardized field sobriety tasks. After doing poorly on all field sobriety tasks, Whitehead was placed under arrest for driving under the influence. 




