Rufus had at least two other avenues of escape which would have presented much less resistance. Instead of using either one of them Rufus did intentionally and knowingly use a large SUV as a weapon by aiming it at Deputy Shoultz and accelerated wildly in his direction striking Schultz with the center front of the vehicle with the intent to kill Deputy Schultz.

Deputy Schultz was thrown through the air and landed on pavement causing serious injury to his head that required medical treatment, Rufus did not
