Experiencing God

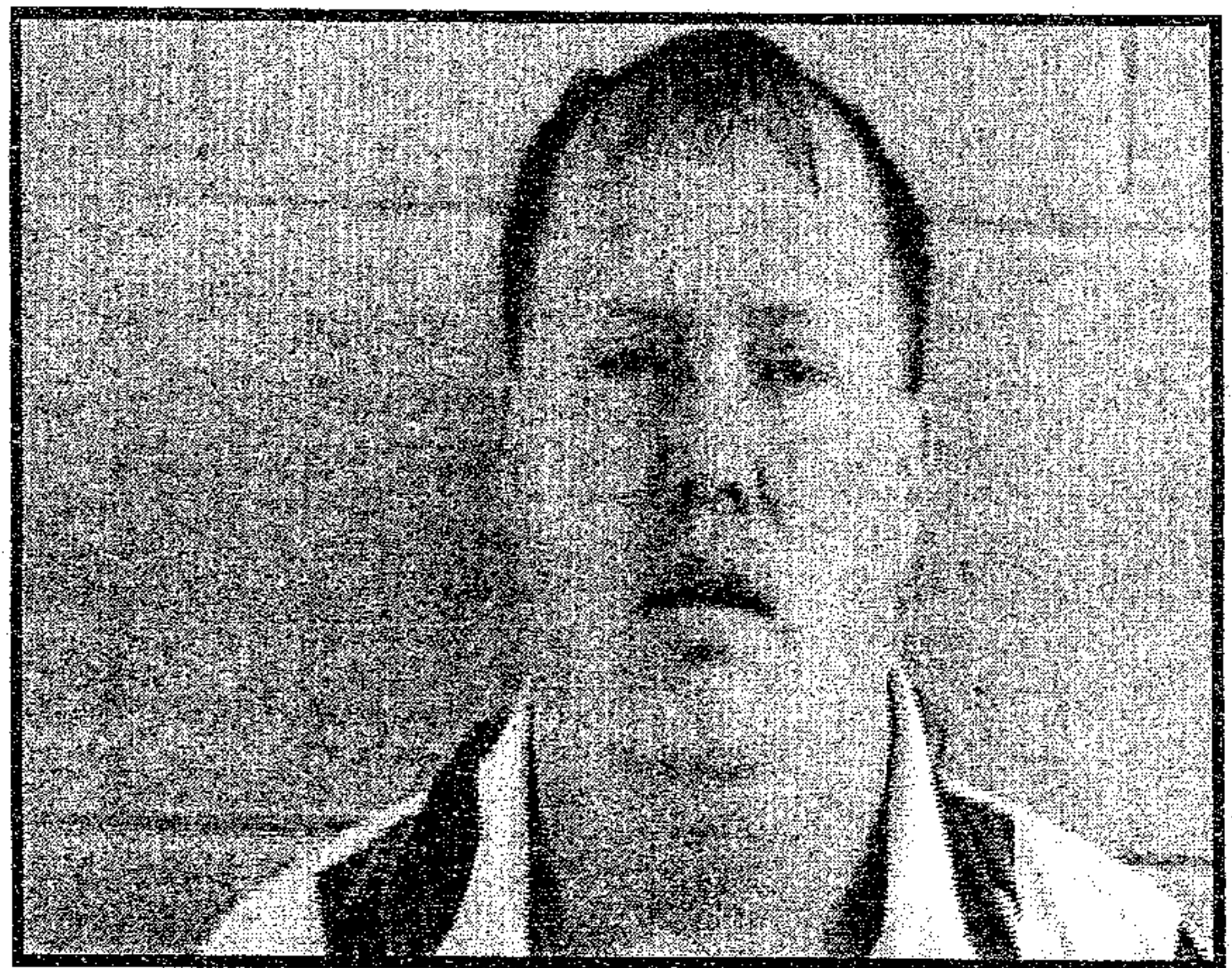
