09/19/2014, On Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, did observe the above vehicle make a right hand turn onto Muddy Creek rd from Hwy 11. The vehicle traveled down Muddy Creek rd and Deputy did observe the vehicle cross the center double yellow line at least three times, with one of those the vehicle crossed the center line to a such a degree that more than half the vehicle was in the wrong lane of travel. Deputy did initiate a traffic stop on the

vehicle in front of Lee Heights Baptist Church and the vehicle did turn into the furthest entrance of the church before stopping. Deputy approached the vehicle and identified the driver as Mrs. Sharon Weaver, Mrs. Weaver did have a strong odor of alcoholic beverage emitting from her person, she did also have blood shot, watery eyes, slurred speech and slow reaction times to the questions Deputy asked her. Mrs. Weaver stated that she had not consumed alcohol this evening and could not account for the odor of alcoholic beverage. It was discovered through an NCIC check as well as Mrs. Weaver's own admission that she did have a restricted/ re-

voked driver's license for a DUI that occurred in 2013.

Mrs. Weaver was asked to exit to the vehicle to perform standardized field sobriety tasks. Upon exiting and during the entirety of the tasks Mrs. Weaver did have very unsure balance and very slow reaction times to instructions and questions, as well as the odor of the alcoholic beverage emitting from her person becoming much stronger as we were in a closer proximity to each other. Mrs. Weaver did also perform poorly during these tasks and was then arrested and advised of the Tennessee Implied Consent Law in which she refused to provide

a breath sample. Mrs. Weaver was then transported to the Loudon County Jail. Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, made the arrest.





join Him in His work, During this time there have been three separate groups of people contact us asking for our help with issues within their lives and marriages. Did catch that? They called US!


response..... "Surely the presence of The Lord is in this place and I did not know it!" God doesn't need us to start programs, He spoke to us by simply saying, "Watch this".
