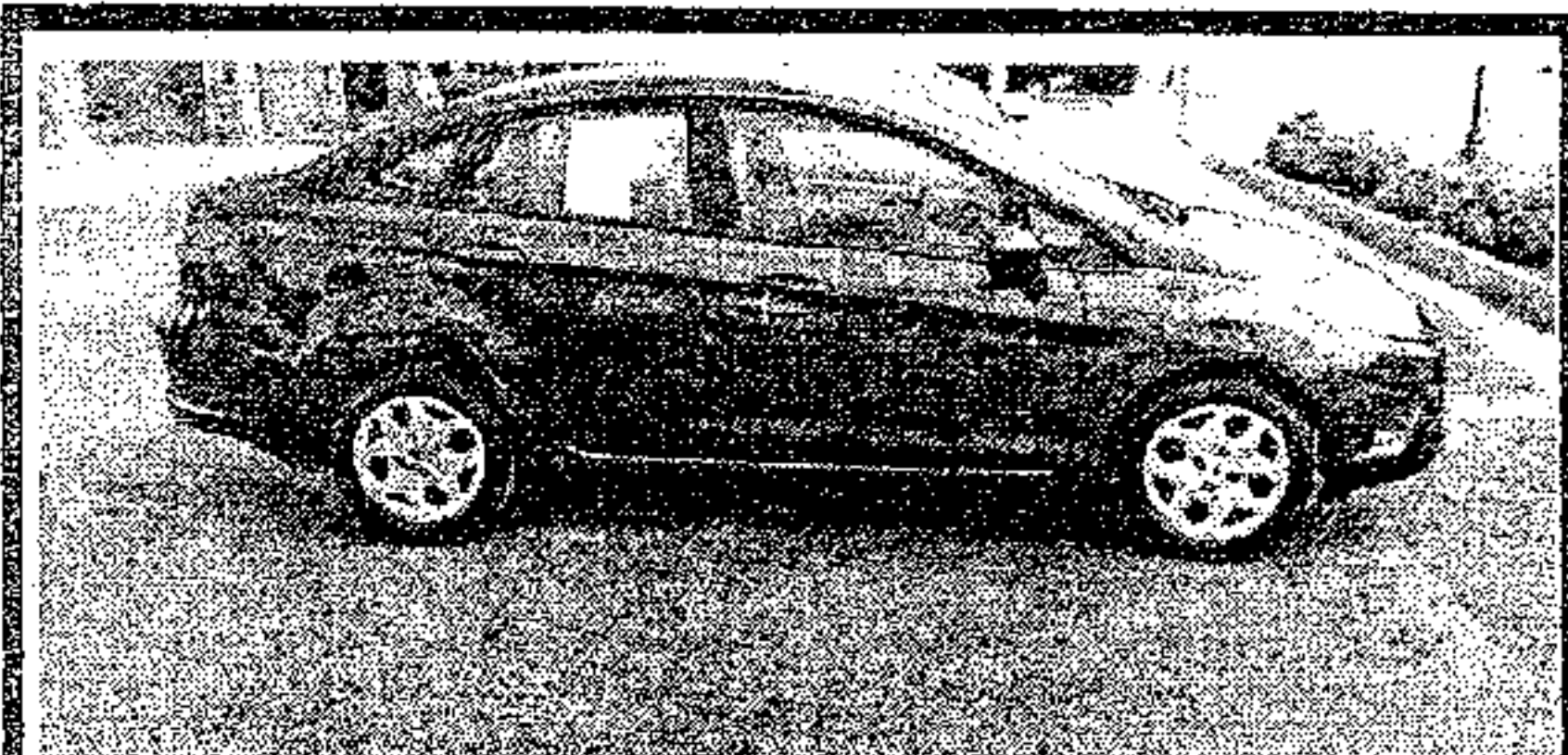

All of the juveniles were turned over to their parents. There were 4 other individuals that were of age at the residence. All of them were transported to the Loudon county

jail for contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

SGT Bowen did read Mr. Rollins his Miranda rights and he did waive counsel and did give consent to search the residence for drugs. There was several pieces of drug paraphernalia in plain view throughout the house. There was also a large amount of alcohol in all the rooms of the residence. Mr. Rollins did show SGT Bowen where his marijuana was and there was approx. 3 grams. Cpl. Brandon Dixon LCSO, made the arrest.
