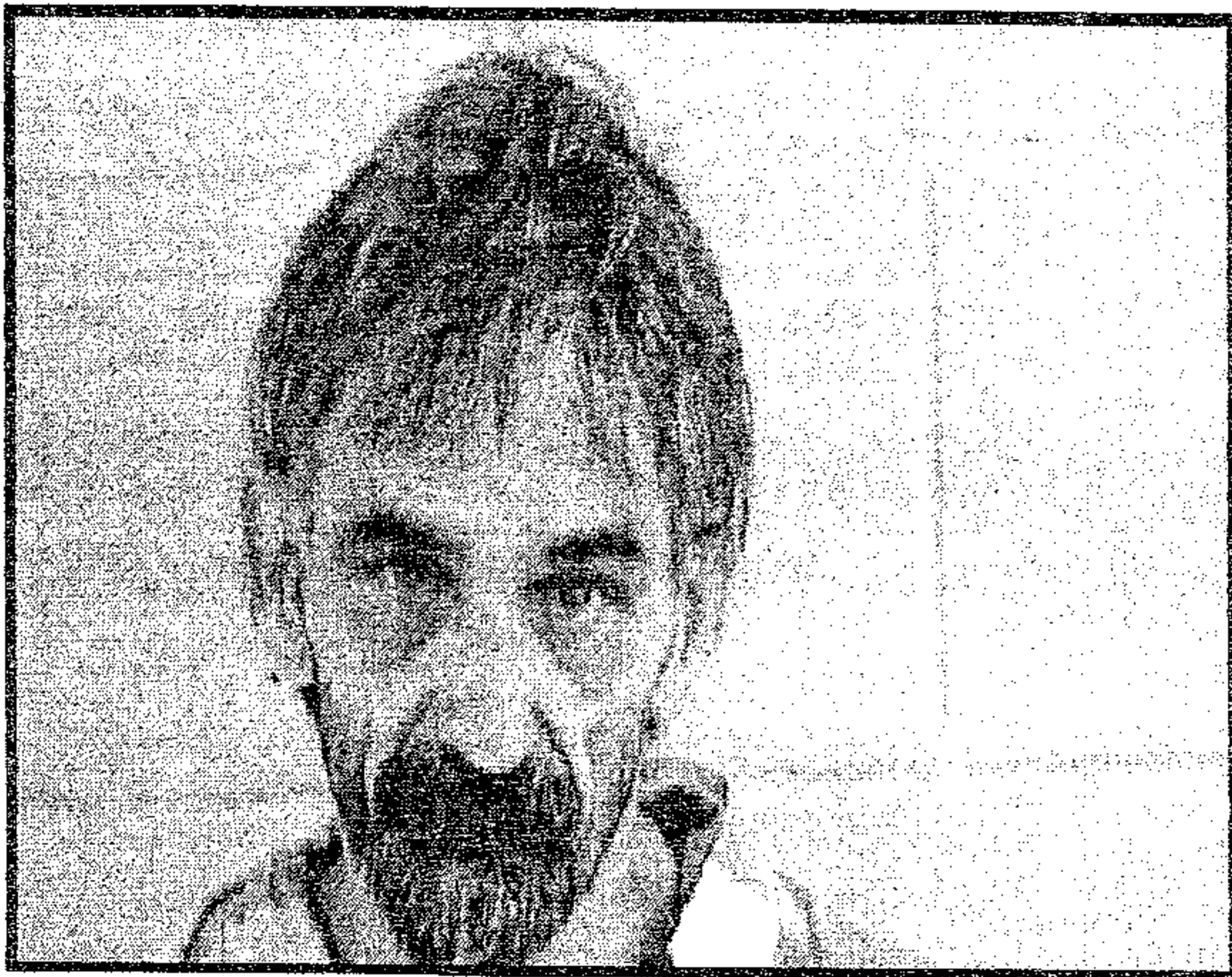



speeds of 100 mph and driving reckless, running cars off the road, and it was stated that the vehicle had wrecked out in the median but regained control still traveling south. Deputy Charles Huskin LCSO, made contact with the vehicle at the 81 exit south bound get on ramp. The subject was out of his vehicle scanning it for damage and stated that he thought he had a flat tire. The subject was found to be Mr. Rodney Hoskins. Mr. Hoskins was very unsteady on his feet had slurred speech, red watery eyes. Deputy ask Mr. Hoskins where he was going, and seemed unsure at that time as to what was going on. When


Mr. Hoskins stood at the front of officers patrol unit he was still unsteady on his feet. Deputy ask Mr. Hoskins to perform standardized field sobriety, and he did agree to the test in which he did perform poorly. Deputy Bobby Hamilton LCSO, arrived on scene at approx. 0836 and witnessed the field sobriety Mr. Hoskins was advised he was under arrest for Driving Under The Influence, and read implied consent advisement in which he did agree to. Before Deputy left the scene the complainant arrived on scene and stated that Mr. Hoskins almost killed him, ran him off the road, as well as 5 tractor trailers, and he witnessed him running off the road. There was a substantial amount of a blue pill in a small Ziploc baggie 48 whole pills, and 40 half pills along

with crushed powder, along with some shot gun shells. Mr. Hoskins was also charged with Possession of ammunition by a felon, reckless endangerment. Mr. Hoskins was transported to the Fort Loudon E.R for a B.A. test, and at the E.R. Mr. Hoskins was very lethargic and was asleep for a period of time approx. 20 minutes. When Deputy arrived at the Loudon County Jail Mr. Hoskins was passed out in his patrol unit, it took shaking him and yelling very loud for

him to arouse. Deputy Charlie Huskins LCSO, made the arrest.

today. I wondered how many times we could see God working out His divine plan through a circumstance in our lives if our focus was on Him and not ourselves.

In the story below, Joseph (Not Mary's husband but the son of Jacob) was envied and hated by his brothers for being the "favorite". His brothers discussed killing him but chose rather to sell him into slavery. He was purchased for twenty shekles of silver and shipped to Egypt where he served under an Egyptian Captain named Potiphar, and later imprisoned after a false accusation by Potiphar's wife.

Joseph was eventually released from prison

after he interpreted a dream for Pharaoh and placed second in command over all affairs concerning Egypt. He controlled all of the stored wheat that was collected prior to a great famine and was responsible for distributing it to the Egyptians who would have otherwise starved to death.

Eventually people from other countries heard that Egypt had a surplus of wheat and they would travel to Egypt to buy some. One such group of people were the sons of Jacob, the same brothers who had sold Joseph into

This would have been an awesome opportunity for Joseph to even the score with his brothers for what they did to him. Instead though, Joseph looked at the situation as God's divine plan to save the lives of many. Let's pick the story up as Joseph reveals his

identity to his brothers:

Genesis 45:4-8 (NKJV) And Joseph said to his brothers, "Please come near to me." So they came near. Then he said, "I am Joseph your brother, whom you sold into Egypt. But now, do not therefore be grieved or angry with yourselves because you sold me here; for God sent me before you to preserve life. For these two years the famine has been in the land, and there are still five years in which there will be neither plowing nor harvesting. And God sent me before you to preserve a posterity for you in the earth, and to save your lives by a great deliverance. So now it was not you who sent me here, but God; and He has made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all

his house, and a ruler throughout all the land of Egypt.

After Joseph's father Jacob dies, Joseph's brothers are afraid that Joseph will now deal with them for betraying him into slavery. Again Joseph reflects on the hindsight of the events in his life.

Genesis 50:15-21 When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "Perhaps Joseph will hate us, and may actually repay us for all the evil which we did to him." And they sent messengers to Joseph, saying, "Before your father died he commanded, saying, 'Thus you shall say to Joseph: I beg you, please forgive the trespass of your brothers and their sin; for they did evil to

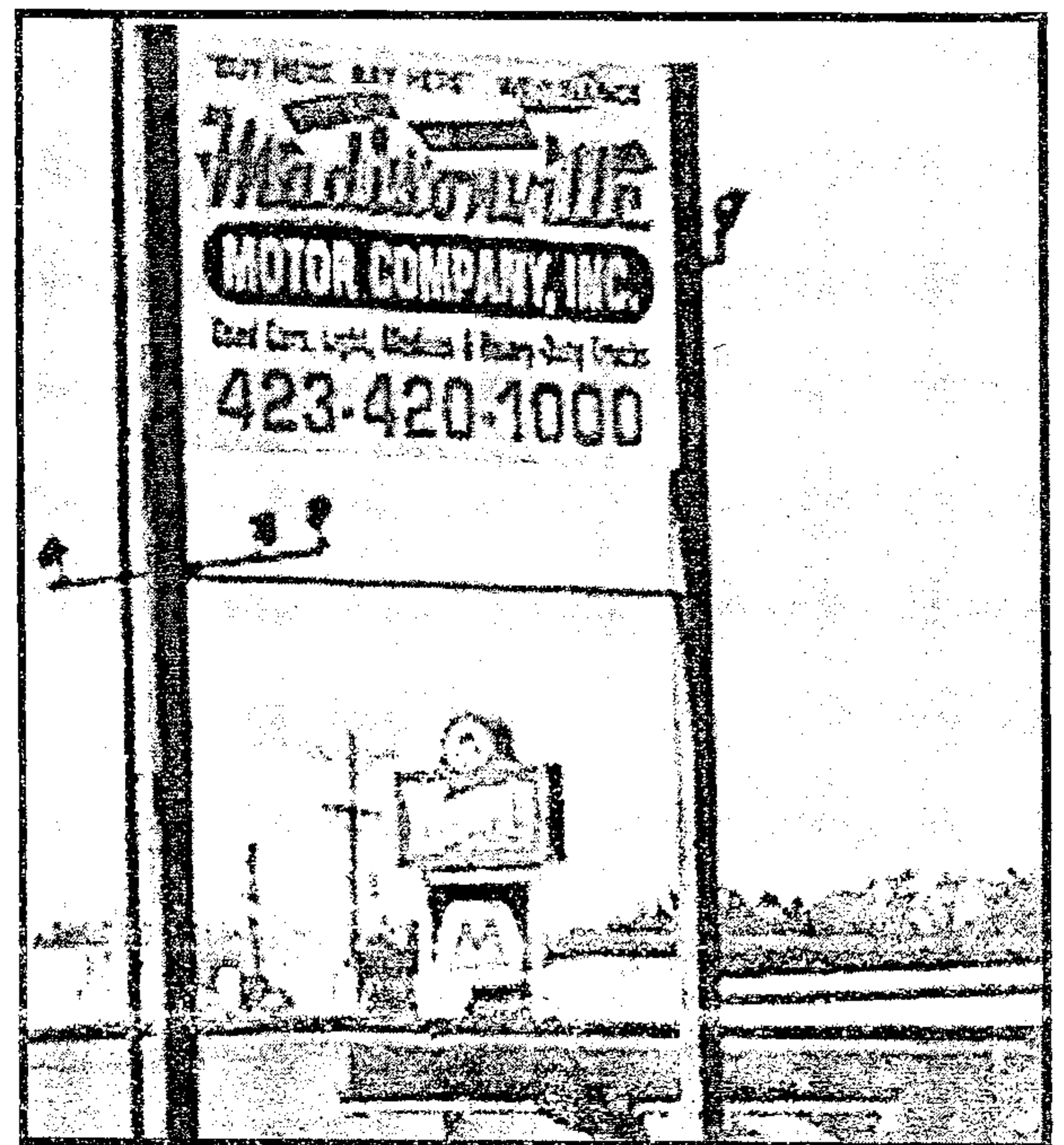


