## Woman charged with statutory rape of teen in LC





## Tennessee to Go in New Direction for Medicaid Eligibility Determination System

The state of Tennessee's Medicaid program, TennCare, announced plans to begin the process of selecting a new vendor for the continued development of the Tennessee Eligibility Determination System (TEDS).

After months of delays and missed benchmarks, the state hired an independent international consulting firm to perform an assessment of TEDS to review the project as it currently exists, identify project deficiencies, and identify potential risks to the TennCare program. ## AUSTIN MICHAEL STALLARD SENTENCED TO 121 MONTHS ON DRUG AND FIREARM CHARGES

On Jan. 13, 2015, Austin Michael Stallard, 19, of Kingsport, Tenn., was sentenced by the Honorable R. Leon Jordan, U.S. District Court Judge, to serve 121 months in federal prison for his role in an a-PVP (alpha-pyrrolidinopentiophenone) distribution conspiracy centered in and around the Sullivan County, Tenn., area and for possessing hydromorphone and a firearm in furtherance of his drug trafficking. A-PVP is a synthetic drug which is commonly referred to on the street as "gravel."



to provide the state with potential alternatives in order to successfully move forward with the development of the TEOS project.

The consulting firm, KPMG, LLC, released a full report to the state with detailed findings. As a result of these findings, and based on the options provided to the state by KPMG, LLC, the state and current vendor have mutually decided it to be in their respective best interests to terminate the current contract early. The state will be moving forward with the process to select a new vendor.

The state will continue to use the current process of accepting TennCare applications through the federal Marketplace – www.healthcare.gov – as well as offering assistance through all Department of Human Services offices and local Area Agencies of Aging and Disability (AAAD) offices.

## Right Brain vs. Left Brain vs. the Future

Join Amy Broyles as she discusses A Whole Mind: why right-brainers will rule the future on January 21.

(Knoxville, TN) The future belongs to a different kind of person with a different kind of mind: artists, inventors, storytellers, according to author Daniel H. Pink. In A Whole New Mind: Why right-brainers will rule the future, Pink makes a convincing argument for an ongoing shift to

the dominance of right-brainers in the modern world. Join Amy Broyles, county commissioner, 2nd district, for a discussion of this book on Wednesday, January 21, noon in the East Tennessee History Center auditorium, at this month's Books Sandwiched In, a program series of Knox County Public Library.

"This is a quick and entertaining read, but don't let that fool you - the concepts Daniel Pink outlines are complex, innovative, and sure to make you rethink your view of the future," Broyles says. "Working from his premise that the world has moved beyond the Information Age to the Conceptual Age, Pink shows us not only what abilities are necessary for a fulfilling life and successful career, but also how to cultivate them and put them to use."

And the shift to a "Conceptual Age" empowers those who are right-brain dominant, according to Pink. Creative and empathetic "right-brain" thinkers, those whose abilities mark the fault line between who gets ahead and who doesn't, will dominate. Lawyers, Accountants, and software engi-

neers used to be the careers coveted by parents for their children. No longer true, Pink says.

Drawing on research from around the advanced world, Daniel Pink outlines the six fundamentally human abilities that are essential for professional success and personal fulfillment - and reveals how to master them. Amy Broyles has served on the Knox County Commission since 2008, representing the North Knoxville area. Her background is in social services, and her interests range from religion, economics, and anthropology to physics, communication, and art. She grew up in Chattanooga, Tennessee, and has traveled extensively within the United States. During her time on commission, she has worked


