advisement, and Mr. Harris agreed to go to Fort Loudoun Medical Center to give blood. Deputy Ben Everett LCSO, made the arrest.

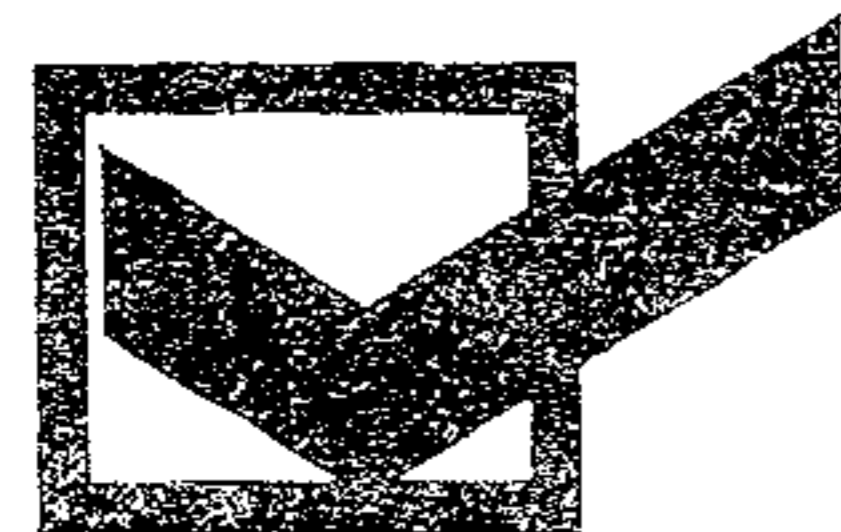
