Mtn City resident sentenced for role in meth mfg. conspiracy

On Jan. 20, 2015, the last of 42 individuals charged in related methamphetamine manufacturing cases was sentenced by the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer, U.S. District Judge. Tony Jerome Snyder, 37, of Mountain City, Tenn., was sentenced to serve 135 months in federal prison for conspiring to manufacture more than 50 grams

of methamphetamine. Upon his release from prison, he will be supervised for five years by U.S. Probation. There is no parole in the federal system.

Snyder and 19 others were indicted in May 2013 for conspiring to manufacture methamphetamine and possessing equipment, chemicals, materials, and products to be used in the manufacture of methamphetamine. Twenty-two others were also indicted in related methamphetamine manufacturing cases arising from the same investigation. All have now been sentenced.

The charges stemmed from a lengthy investigation spanning from 2006 to 2013 wherein these individuals conspired to obtain pseudoephedrine and other products needed to manufacture methamphetamine from various sources in the Eastern District of Tennessee, Western District of North Carolina, and Western District of Virginia. The pseudoephedrine and other products were then used to manufacture methamphetamine utilizing the

"shake and bake" method. The methamphetamine was used and distributed throughout the Eastern District of Tennessee.

U.S. Attorney Bill Killian praised the efforts of law enforcement involved in these cases stating, "These cases demonstrate the tremendous impact that collaborative investigations among law enforcement agencies can help to combat methamphetamine production and distribution. Our office has worked hard to help reduce the number of methamphetamine labs in east Tennessee and will continue to aggressively prosecute these cases."

This investigation was a result of the collaborative efforts of the Johnson County Sheriff's Office, First Judicial District Drug Task Force, Tennessee Methamphetamine Task Force, Watauga County (North Carolina) Sheriff's Office, and Drug Enforcement Administration. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Suzanne Kerney-Quillen and Caryn Hebets represent the United States.

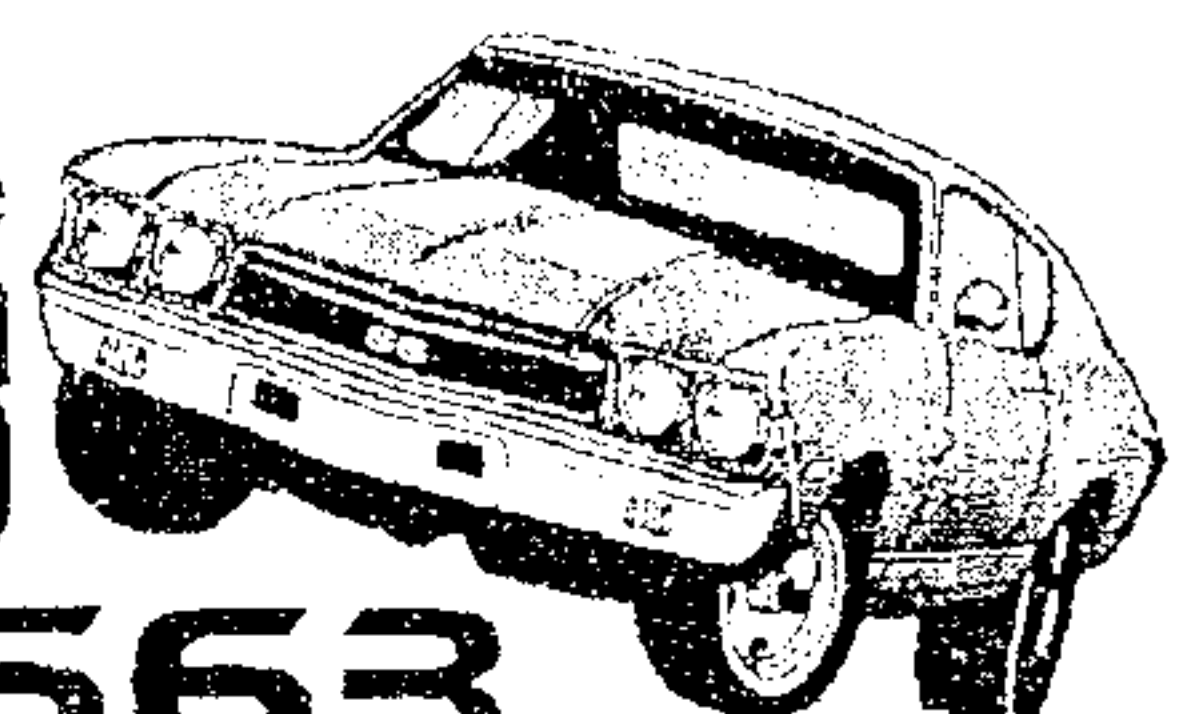

served Mr. Thomas Edward Davis who upon contact had a strong odor of alcoholic beverage coming from his person. Deputy Everett and Deputy Fagiana attempted to give Mr. Davis a series of field sobriety tasks. Mr. Davis's speech was very slurred, as well as having red, watery, blood-shot eyes. After several times of asking Mr. Davis if he would participate in field sobriety, Mr. Davis attempted to cooperate with the field sobriety tasks initially, although we were unable to successfully deliver the SFST instructions, seemingly due to his inability to focus as well as balance and/or stand without losing his balance.

Due to regard for his safety, we attempted an additional "divided attention task" that would allow us to see Mr. Davis' ability to follow simple instructions while performing a task, without placing him in any further danger due to his difficulty standing. In all attempts, Davis was

unable to perform the tasks either at all, or as instructed.

Mr. Davis was then placed under arrest for DUI. A check of NCIC/TCIC revealed that his TN OLN was a valid class D Only, and not valid for motorcycle operation.

It was also revealed that Davis had three (3) prior DUI convictions. The last conviction of DUI was out of Knox County on 05/06/2007. Prior to that, Davis had an additional DUI conviction out of Knox County on 03/19/2003. Prior to that, Davis had a previous DUI conviction out of Knox County on 11/15/1994. Davis was read the Tennessee Implied Consent Law and refused to submit to a chemical blood test.

Davis was charged with DUI (4th offense), Violation of Implied Consent Law, Driving without a Valid License for Vehicle Type, and Open Container. Davis was transported to the Loudon County Jail. Deputy Ben Everett LCSO, made the arrest

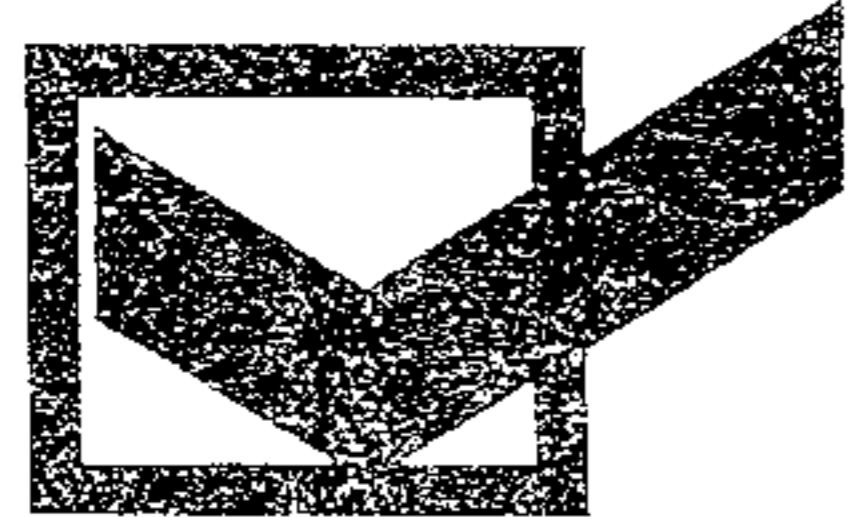
