omission and began making the proper deductions. Upon this correction, the mayor promptly cancelled all of his supplemental policies.

In October 2015, Mayor Lance Loveless was indicted by the Humphreys County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$1,000 and two counts of official misconduct.

In a similar fashion, a New Johnsonville police officer also received supplemental insurance for himself totaling \$1,126. After the newly appointed clerk noticed that payroll deductions were not occurring, the officer promptly cancelled his policy. The officer told investigators that although he signed the application, he did not want and never intended to receive the supplemental insurance coverage.

"Government works better when there are strong financial processes place," Comptroller Justin P. Wilson said. "Reconciling insurance payments with payroll deductions may have prevented these improper benefits."
