admitted to conspiring to distribute marijuana for many years in the Eastern District of Tennessee. In a recorded July 2013 meeting in Bristol, Va., Williams told an individual working with law enforcement that he had hauled marijuana for the last 17 years and that he was interested in purchasing up to 50 pounds of marijuana at a time. He discussed, with this same individual, the best times of the day to transport marijuana and the fact that Tennessee was making it hard on smugglers. Williams also admitted to dealing in marijuana with one particular co-conspirator for 10 years, to which he owed a drug debt. However, since that individual was now deceased, he considered the debt to be severance pay. He further admitted to knowing the location of 256 pounds of marijuana that has been missing since this co-conspirator passed away.
