With increased enrollment comes an increase in costs. Knox County Imagination Library's board of advisors is charged with raising money to cover the costs of books and mailing. An average monthly invoice for Knox County now runs about \$40,000, for an annual expenditure of close to \$500,000. Fortunately, the local board has to fund only half the book bill. The Governor's Books from Birth Foundation grants each county in Tennessee 50% of the total cost of books and mailing. Additionally, Imagination Library of Knox County has received a generous three-year grant from the United Way of Greater Knoxville for \$87,000 per year, leaving about \$150,000 for the board to raise annually. Administrative costs of the local program are borne by the Knox County Public Library.

"Many people are confused about the funding model Imagination Library," says Bonny Naugher, chair of Knox County Imagination Library. "We love Dolly Parton, and she put together the program in such a way that makes it more affordable for communities to buy in, but each community must pay for their own books and mailing."
