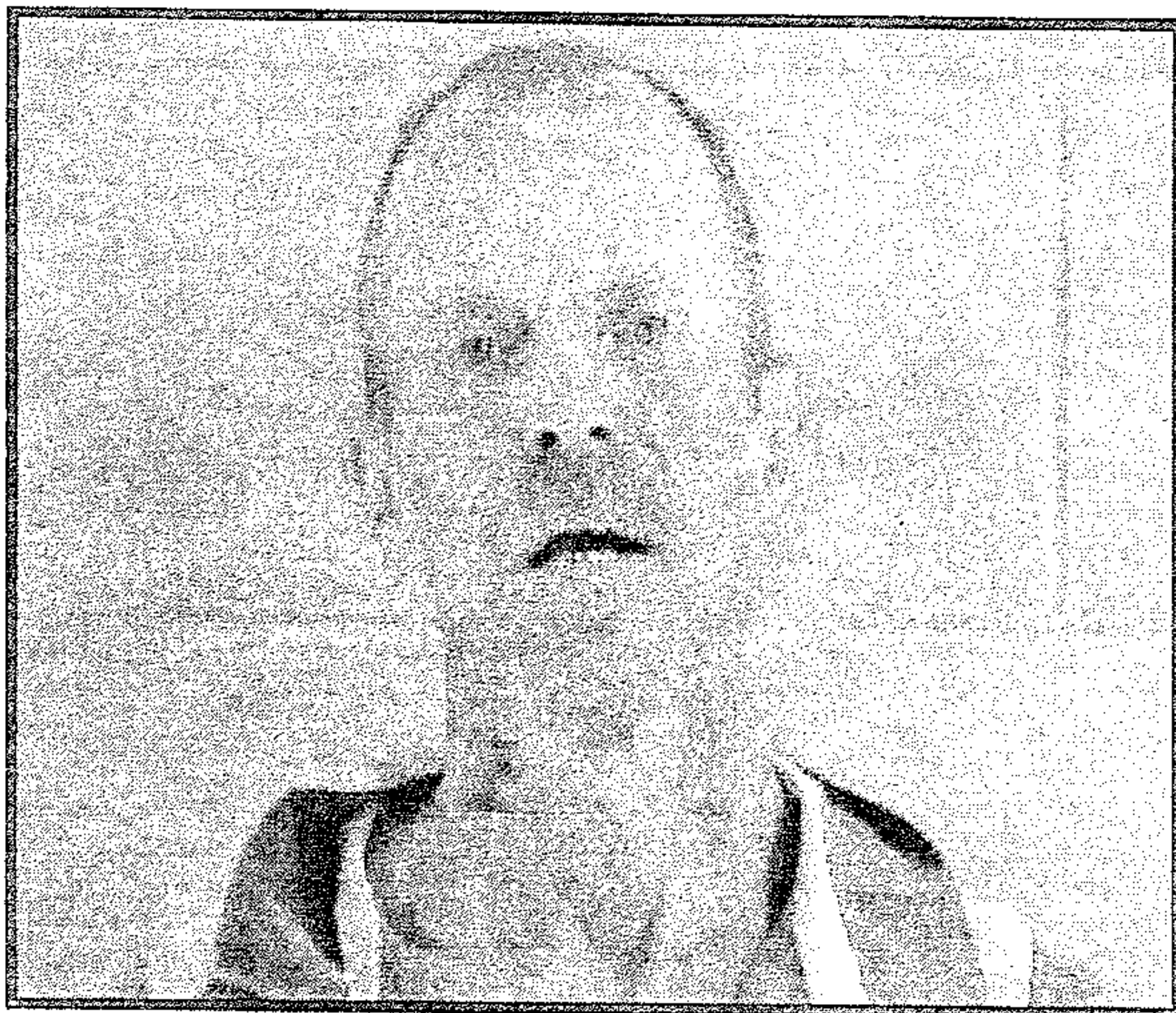

## Historic Bond Sale Saves Tennessee Millions

The State of Tennessee completed the sale of approximately \$384 million of general obligation (GO) bonds today at some of the lowest interest rates in Tennessee history.

Tennessee's excellent credit stimulated heavy interest from investors, amounting to almost \$2 billion in orders. This high demand allowed the state

to reprice most of the maturities on its GO bonds 5 to 10 basis points lower than the price that was initially offered, which saves the state millions of dollars over the 20-year life of the bonds.

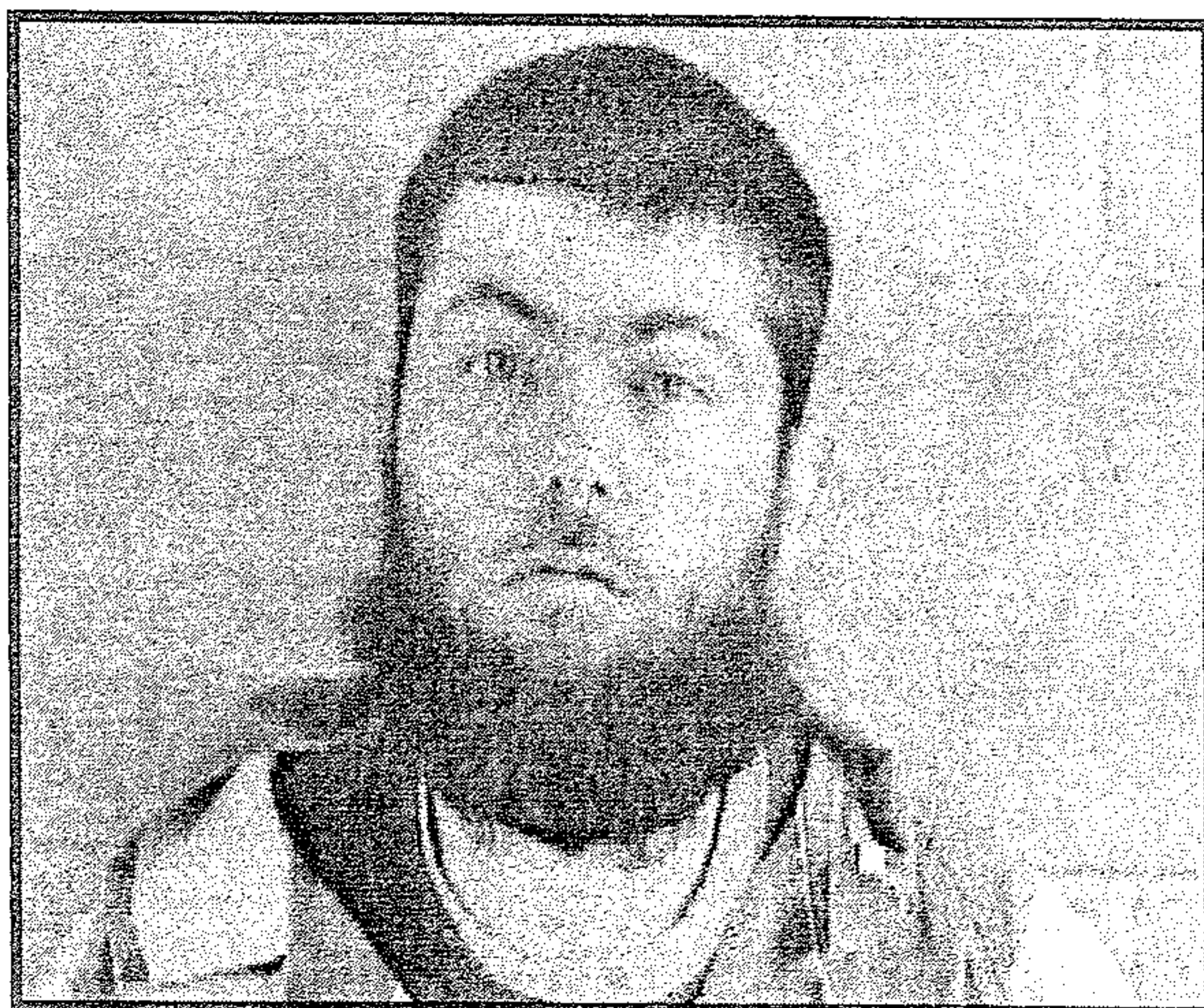
Tennessee has one of the lowest debt levels of any state, and investors recognize its strong history of balanced budgeting. In-

## Seymour resident pleads guilty to producing child pornography

On Nov. 12, 2015, Naomi Jean Justice, 23, of Seymour, Tenn., pleaded guilty in U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee, Knoxville, to using a pre-pubescent minor to produce child pornography. Sentencing has been set for 1:00 p.m., Mar. 31, 2016.

Justice faces a minimum of 15 years in prison and a maximum of up to 30 years prison,

as well as supervised release following incarceration, restitution, and fines. She will also be required to register as a sex offender in any state in which she resides, works, or attends school.

In the plea agreement on file with the U.S. District Court Clerk, Justice admitted that in July 2014 she used a pre-pubescent minor to engage in sexually

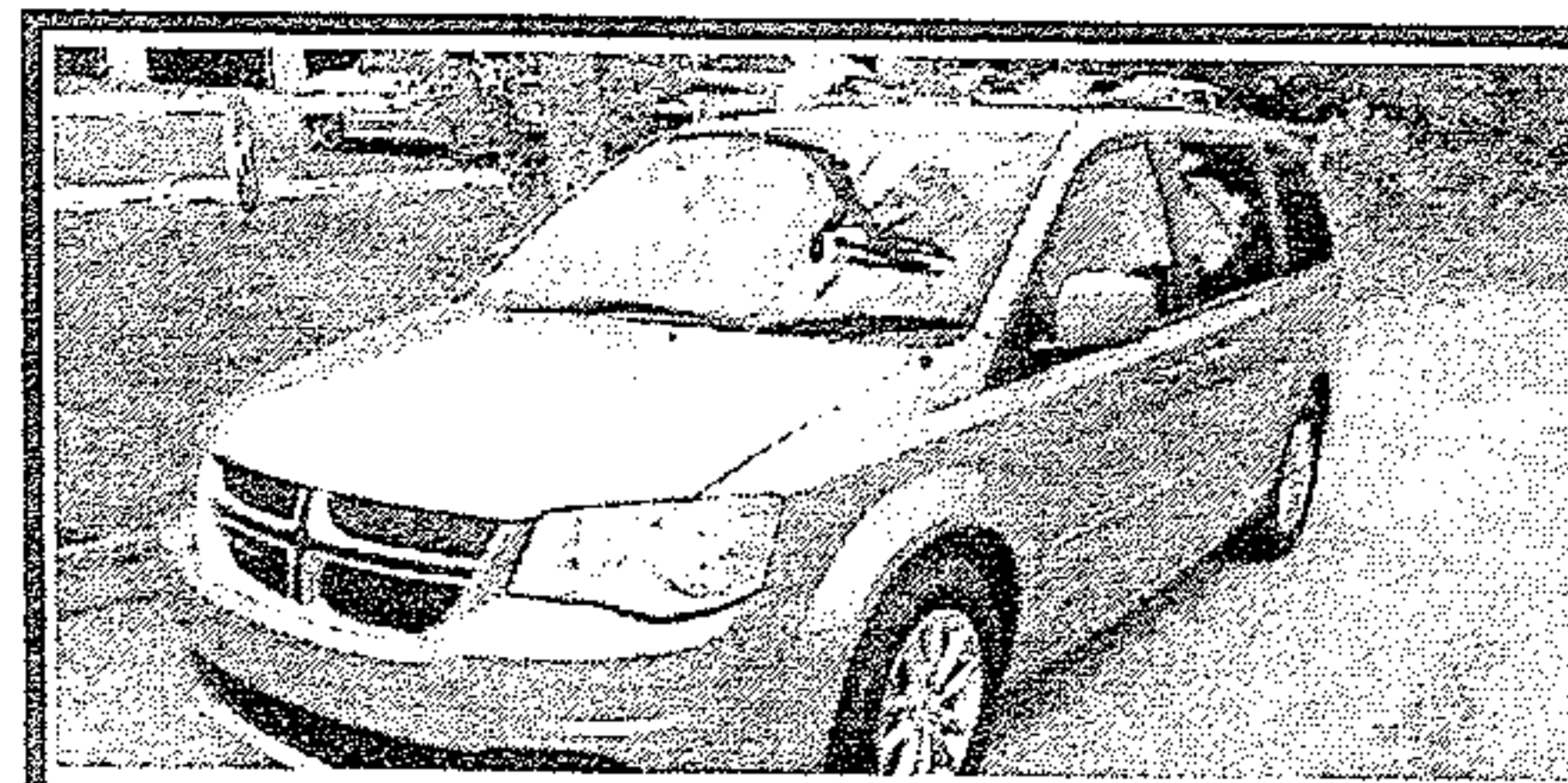

population (based on the 2010 US Census) and a 4% increase since 2013. This fall, the program mailed its 2 millionth book since its launch in 2005.

That means mail carriers are hauling 600-800 more books each month and more parents are cuddling up with their children on a regular basis for some llama drama, goodnight gorillas or little engines with big hearts. Most importantly, it means that more children are entering kindergarten better prepared to learn to read, according to a recent study conducted by Knox County Schools that shows a correlation between enrollment in Imagination Library and improved early literacy test scores.

Recent gains in enrollment may be partially attributed to the Welcome Baby package, a state-wide initiative sponsored by Tennessee First Lady Crissy Haslam's office that mails healthy baby tips, including information on the Imagination Library, to every baby born in Tennessee. Local registration efforts rely on partnerships with birthing hospitals, day cares, libraries, and special events. Addition-

ally, all children under age five who are in the Department of Human Services custody in foster care are automatically enrolled in the program.

The local program, administered by the Knox County Public Library and supported by an independent board of advisors, maintains its status as having the highest per capita registration for any urban community in the country.

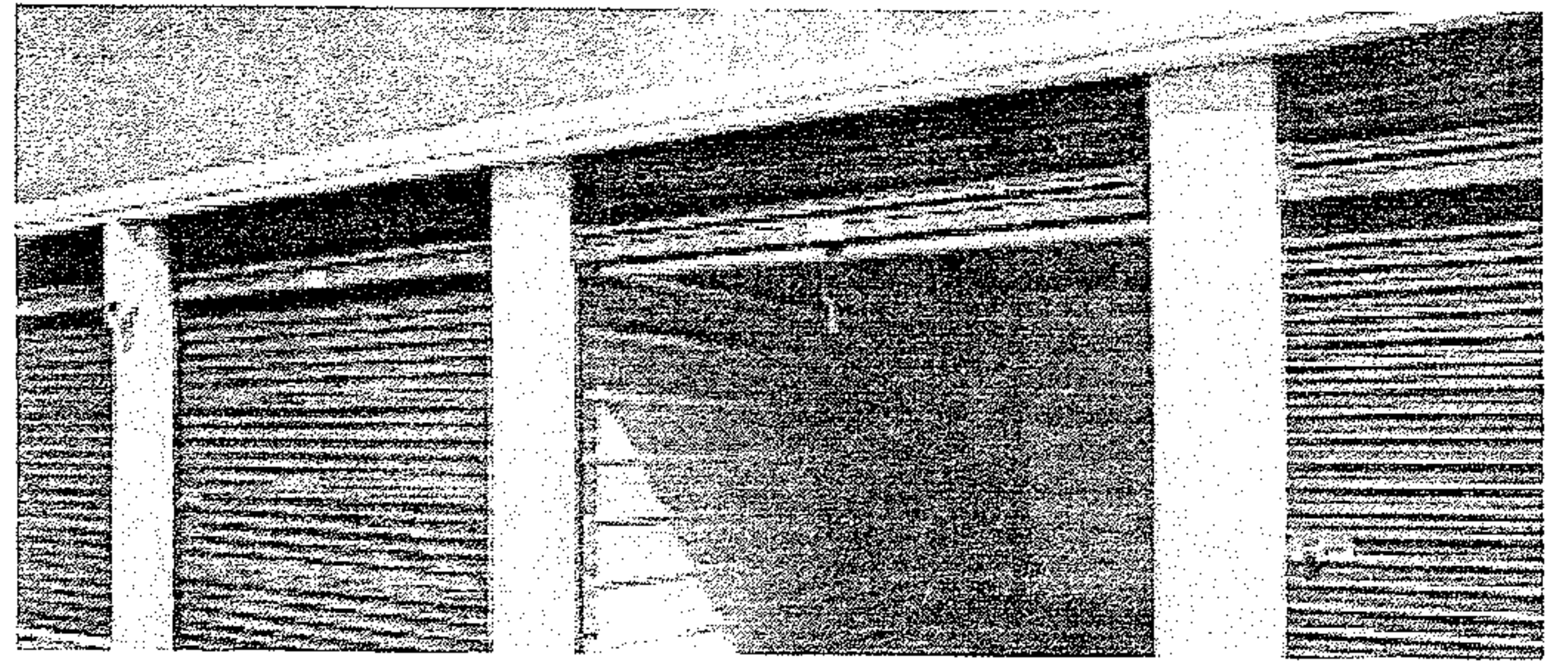

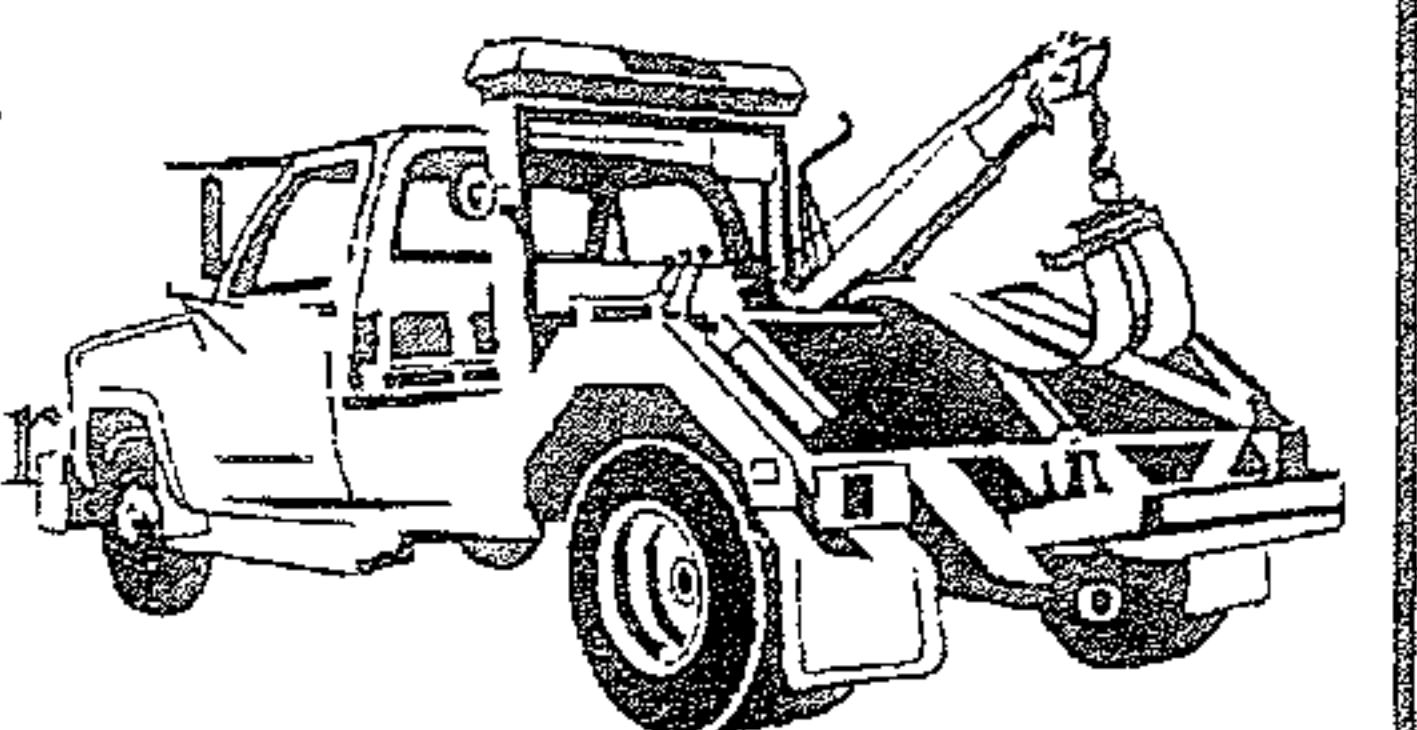

This investigation was conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Assistant U.S. Attorney Matthew Morris represented the United States.

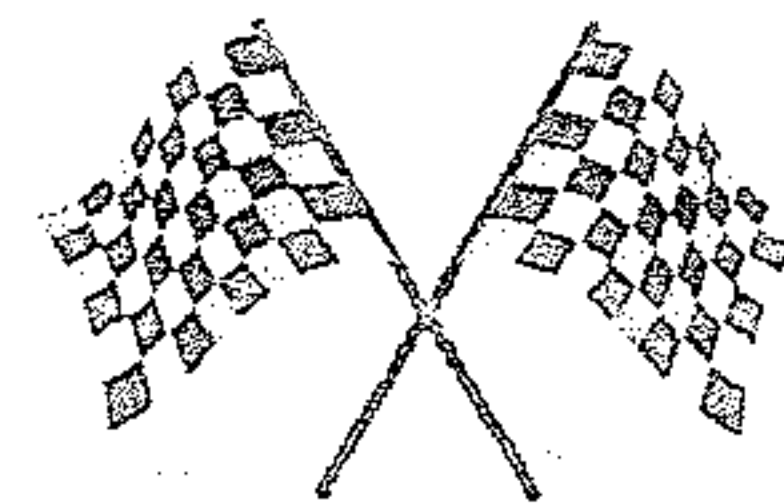

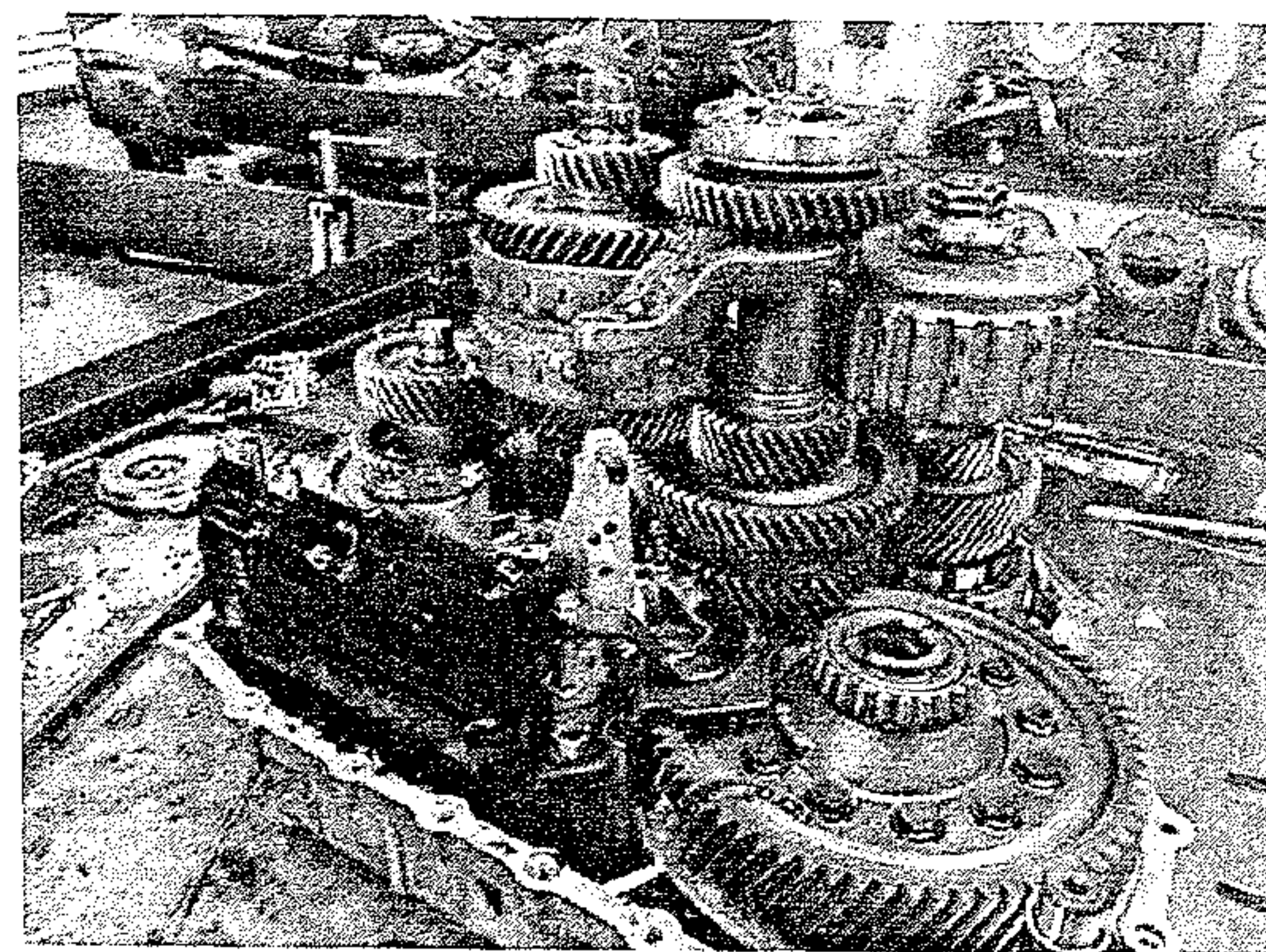

 investors were willing to pay a \$68.5 million up-front premium to acquire Tennessee's bonds.

The debt offering was sold in two series of bonds, consisting of Series A for \$286,275,000 in tax-exempt bonds and Series B for \$97,490,000 of tax-exempt refunding bonds. The com-

bined true interest cost of the bonds was 2.63%.

The proceeds of the bonds will be used to fund new capital projects and refinance currently outstanding bonds. The refinancing will save Tennessee taxpayers \$8.9 million, or 8.56%, over a 13-year period.

"This bond sale is extraordinary by any

measure," Comptroller Justin P. Wilson said. "The people of Tennessee should take pride in the conservative fiscal approach of the Governor and General Assembly. This historic sale proves that a well-managed state allows taxpayers to save money."

For this sale Tennessee received triple-A credit ratings from Fitch Ratings and

Moody's Investor Service, and a AA+ rating from Standard & Poor's.

With increased enrollment comes an increase in costs. Knox County Imagination Library's board of advisors is charged with raising money to cover

the costs of books and mailing. An average monthly invoice for Knox County now runs about \$40,000, for an annual expenditure of close to \$500,000. Fortunately, the local board has to fund only half the book bill. The Governor's Books from Birth Foundation grants each county in Tennessee 50% of the total cost of books and mailing. Additionally, Imagination Library of Knox County has received a generous three-year grant from the United Way of Greater Knoxville for \$87,000 per year, leaving about \$150,000 for the board to raise annually. Administrative costs of the local program are borne by the Knox County Public Library.

"Many people are confused about the funding model for Imagination Library," says Bonny Naugher, chair of Knox County Imagination Library. "We love Dolly Parton, and she put together the program in such a way that makes it more affordable for communities to buy in, but each community must pay for their own books and mailing."
