"In some cases, HOA boards had operating budgets larger than some small Nevada cities. There was lots of money at stake," he added.

The FBI, along with investigators from the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department and Internal Revenue Service - Criminal Investigations, used a variety of investigative techniques—including confidential sources, multiple undercover operatives, and forensic accountants—and conducted hundreds of interviews to piece together the extent of the crimes committed by Benzer and his coconspirators.

In January 2015, Benzer pled guilty to multiple counts of conspiracy to commit mail and wire fraud and tax evasion. In addition to his 188-month jail term, he was ordered to pay more than \$13 million in restitution.

"This was a very sophisticated scam that evolved over time and millions generated of dollars for Benzer," Elliott said, adding that when Benzer was riding high, the charismatic fraudster employed "an army of lawyers, had bodyguards, and had an entourage that included three armored SUVs.
