rensic examination of Weaver's computer revealed that he had collected 1106 still images and 78 videos of child pornography.

This investigation was conducted by U.S. Homeland Security Investigations and Knox-Against Children Task Force. Assistant U.S. Matthew Attorney Morris represented the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by U.S. Offices Attorneys' and the Criminal Division's Child Exploi-Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims.
