Loudon Grand Jury Returns Indictments – Judge Eblen's Last Day of Court as Judge today in Loudon

Murder, Rape, Child Abuse, Meth Mfg., Tax Fraud all receive true bills

According to District Attorney General Russell Johnson, the Loudon County Grand Jury met on Monday, December 14th to consider for indictment almost sixty cases personally presented by General Johnson. These cases involved eighteen DUI cases, a

number of drug cases as well as the theft and associated cases the result from drug addiction. Local law enforcement will be picking those newly indicted individuals up on *capias* for their arrest. Individuals who were previously charged through general sessions court and had their cases bound over to the grand jury

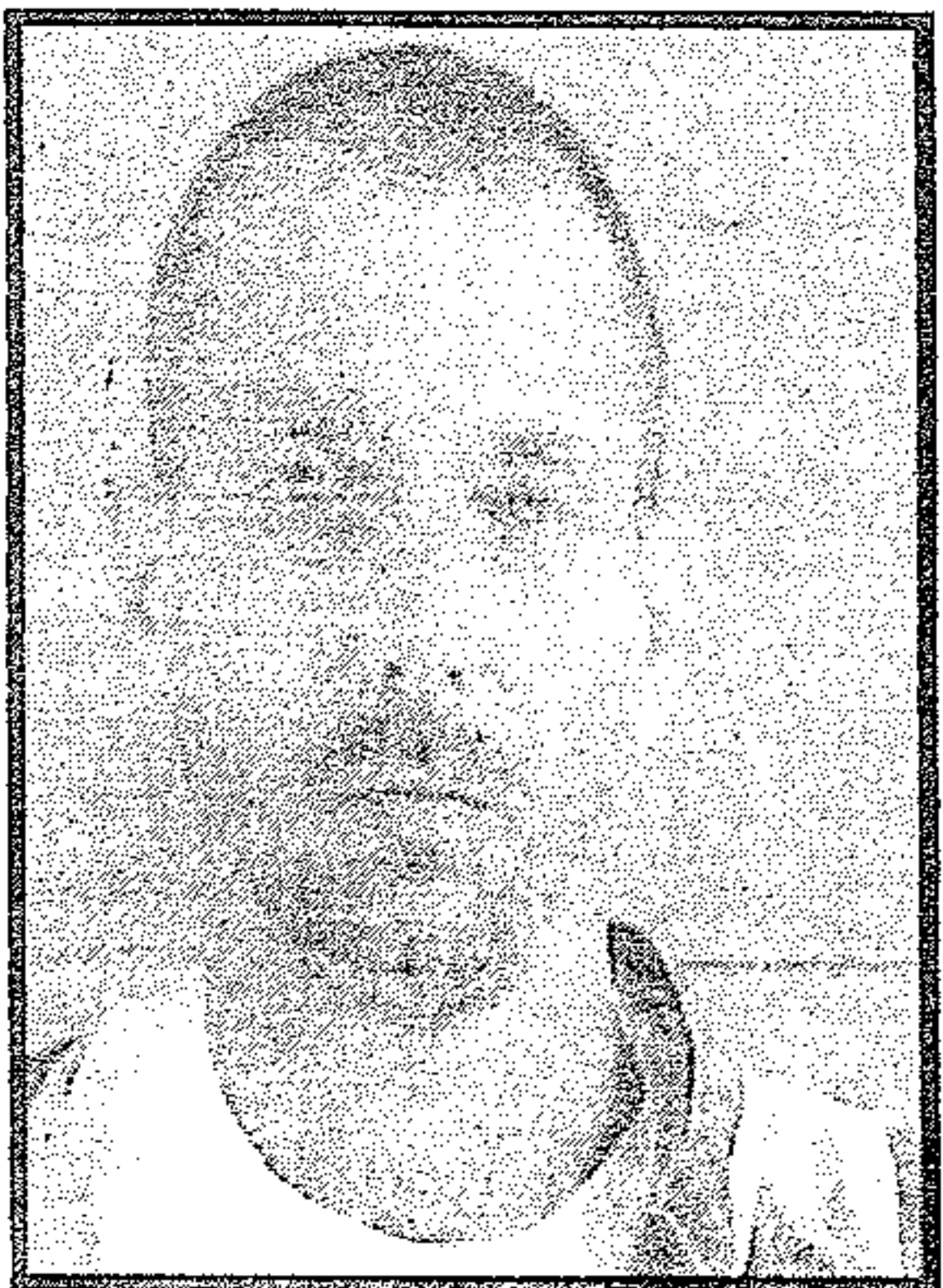
are either still in jail or are out on bond and it is up to the bonding companies to bring these individuals in for arraignment on Monday, December 21st.

District Attorney General Russell Johnson presented an indictment to the Loudon County Grand Jury on Monday, December 14th for sales tax fraud involving Chinyan Ye of Loudon who was operating the 72 Market & Deli located at 18555 Highway 72 South in Loudon. The

grand jury returned a true bill charging Ye with the felony involving non-payment of sales tax on the sale of beer and cigarettes at the convenient store for the period of February 2010 through December 2011 in the amount of \$21,636.99. This case was investi-

Illegal charged with counterfeit money and more

District Attorney General Russell Johnson presented an indictment to the Loudon County Grand Jury on Monday, December 14th against Sean Ashraf Youssef for driving without a valid driver's license and criminal simulation involving the possession of counterfeit \$20 bills. Youssef claims an address of Jacksonville, Florida. He was initially stopped by Lenoir

City Police Officer Tyrel Lorenz on Broadway Avenue in Lenoir City on June 19th for speeding. According to Officer Lorenz's narrative on the warrant he contacted NCIC and learned that Youssef had unspecified felony charges out of Illinois but that Illinois refused to extradite Yousseff. Lorenz noted that Youssef was deceptive about his license sta-

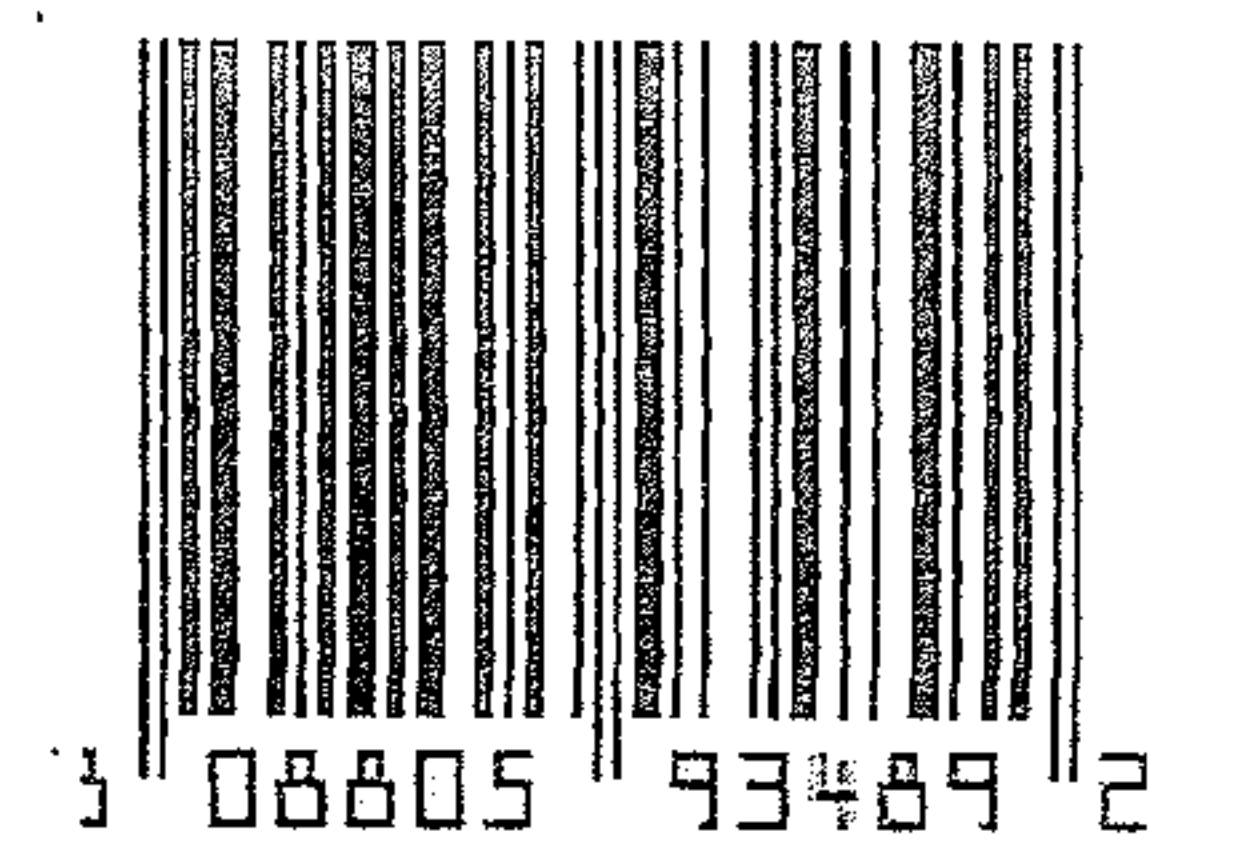

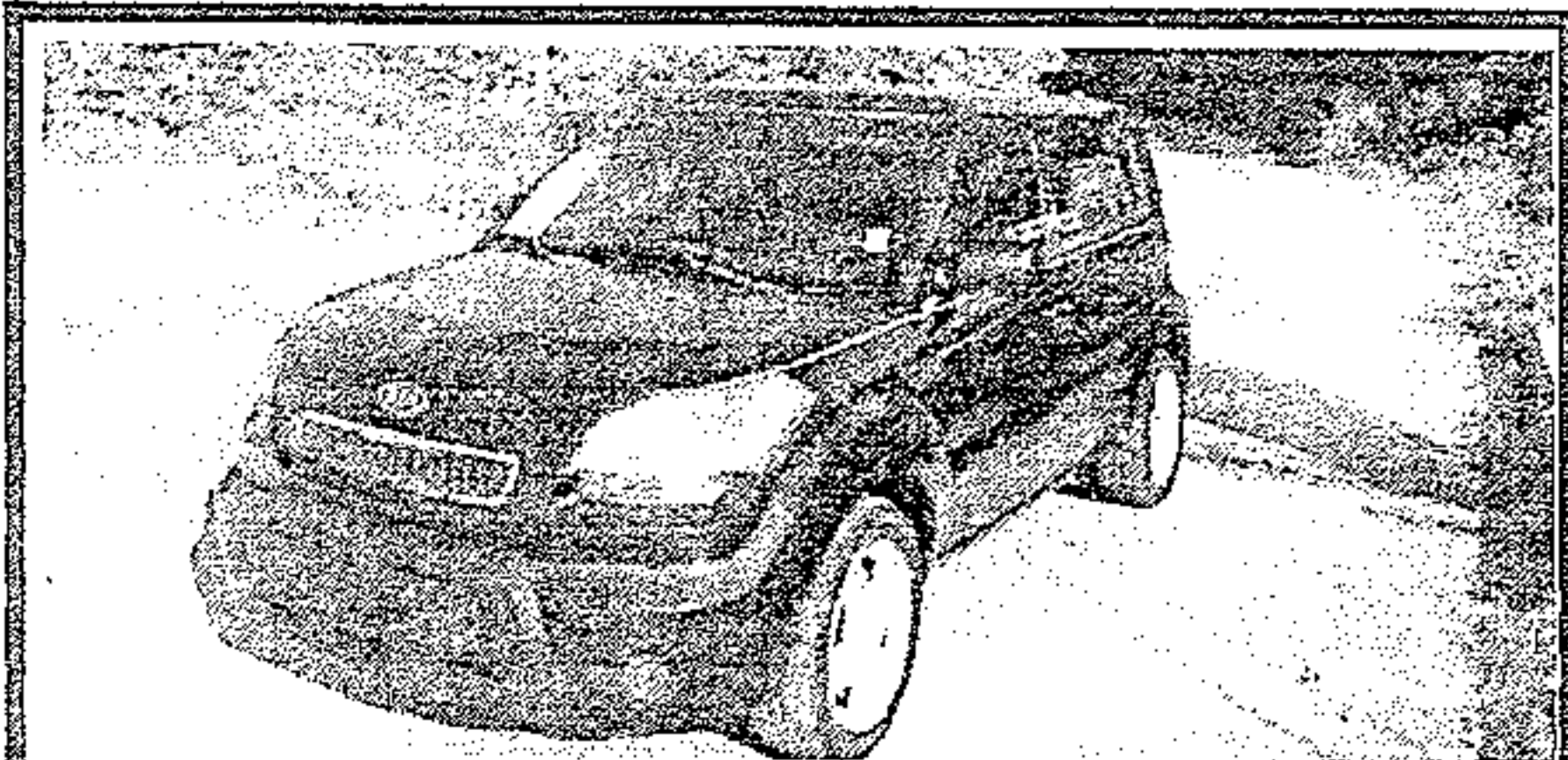

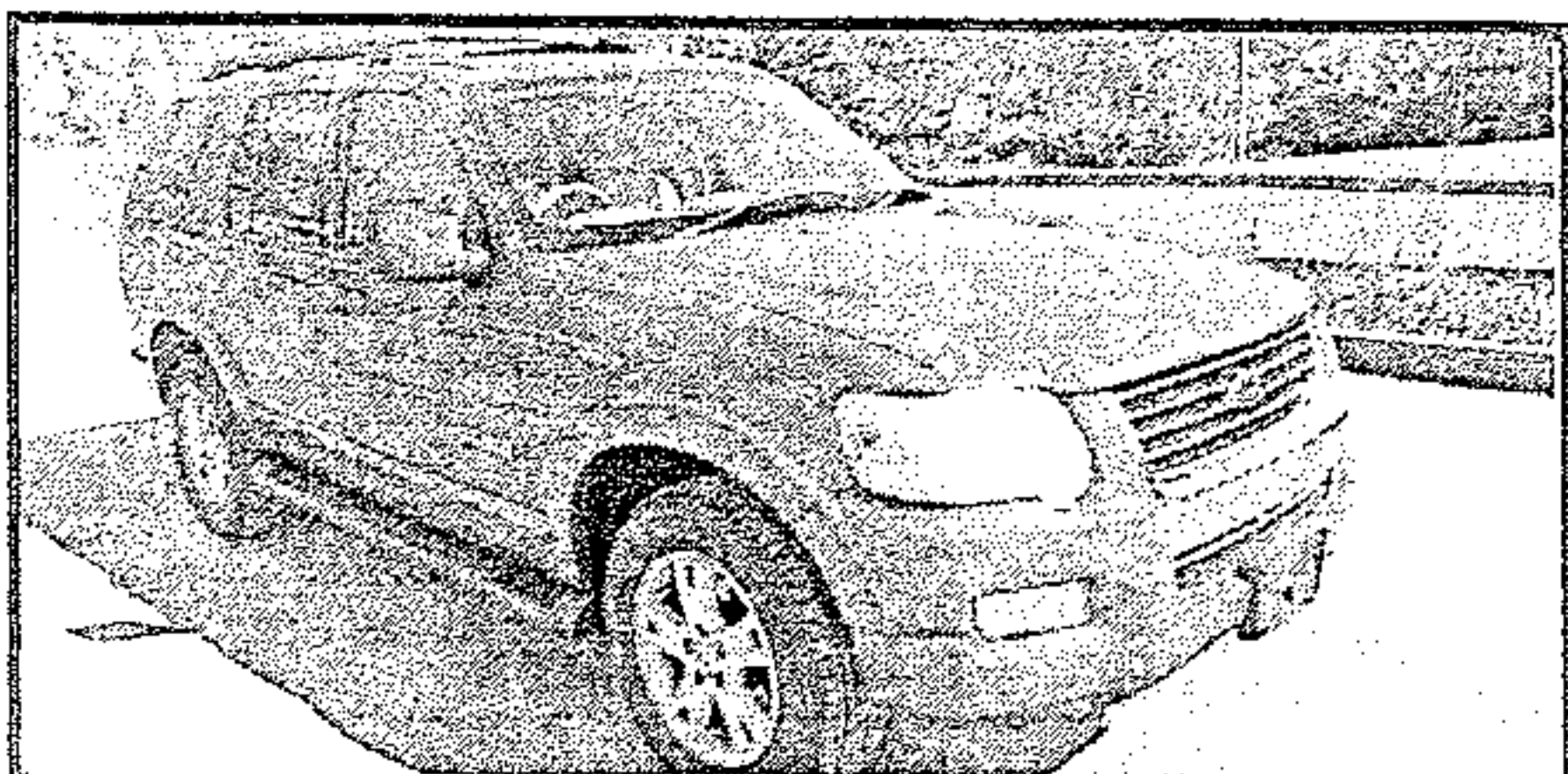

New Top Ten Fugitive

Help Us Find a Violent Criminal

Myloh Jaqory Mason—wanted for a series of violent crimes, including attempted murder—has been named to the Ten Most Wanted Fugitives list.

A reward of up to \$100,000 is being offered for information leading directly to the arrest of the 25-year-old fugitive, who is being sought on federal and state charges

for his alleged involvement in recent violent bank robberies and two separate shootings in Lakewood, Colorado.

“Myloh Mason is a very violent felon. It's important for the safety of the community that we apprehend him as soon as possible,” said Special Agent Russ Humphrey, fugitive coordinator for the FBI Denver Field Office's Rocky Mountain Safe Streets Task Force.

Along with two accomplices—who are in custody—Mason is believed to have robbed at least two Lakewood banks within the last four months, and his tactics have become more aggressive. The first robbery took place on September 30, 2015. Mason and two others wearing costumes allegedly shoved guns in the faces of bank employees and

said the tellers would be killed unless they opened the bank vault.

The crew struck again in November. Mason and two others allegedly wore green and white skeleton masks when they staged a takeover robbery, shoving guns in the faces of tellers to gain access to the vault. During that robbery, Mason—a convicted felon—was wearing a ballistic vest. Pursued by police after fleeing the bank, Mason and his partners shot two innocent citizens during a home invasion and a carjacking. “The robbers clearly seemed desperate,” Humphrey said. “It was lucky that the two injured civilians, one of whom was shot four times, weren't killed.” He added that the scenes played out near schools—
