Former Gibson County Sheriff Charles Arnold and former Chief Deputy Jeffrey Maitland are just two of the 12 people facing indictment after an investigation by the Tennessee's Comptroller's The Comptroller's Office in conjunction with the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation.

A study by the Center for Substance Abuse Research identified synthetic marijuana as the third most reported substance used by U.S. high school students after alcohol and marijuana.






