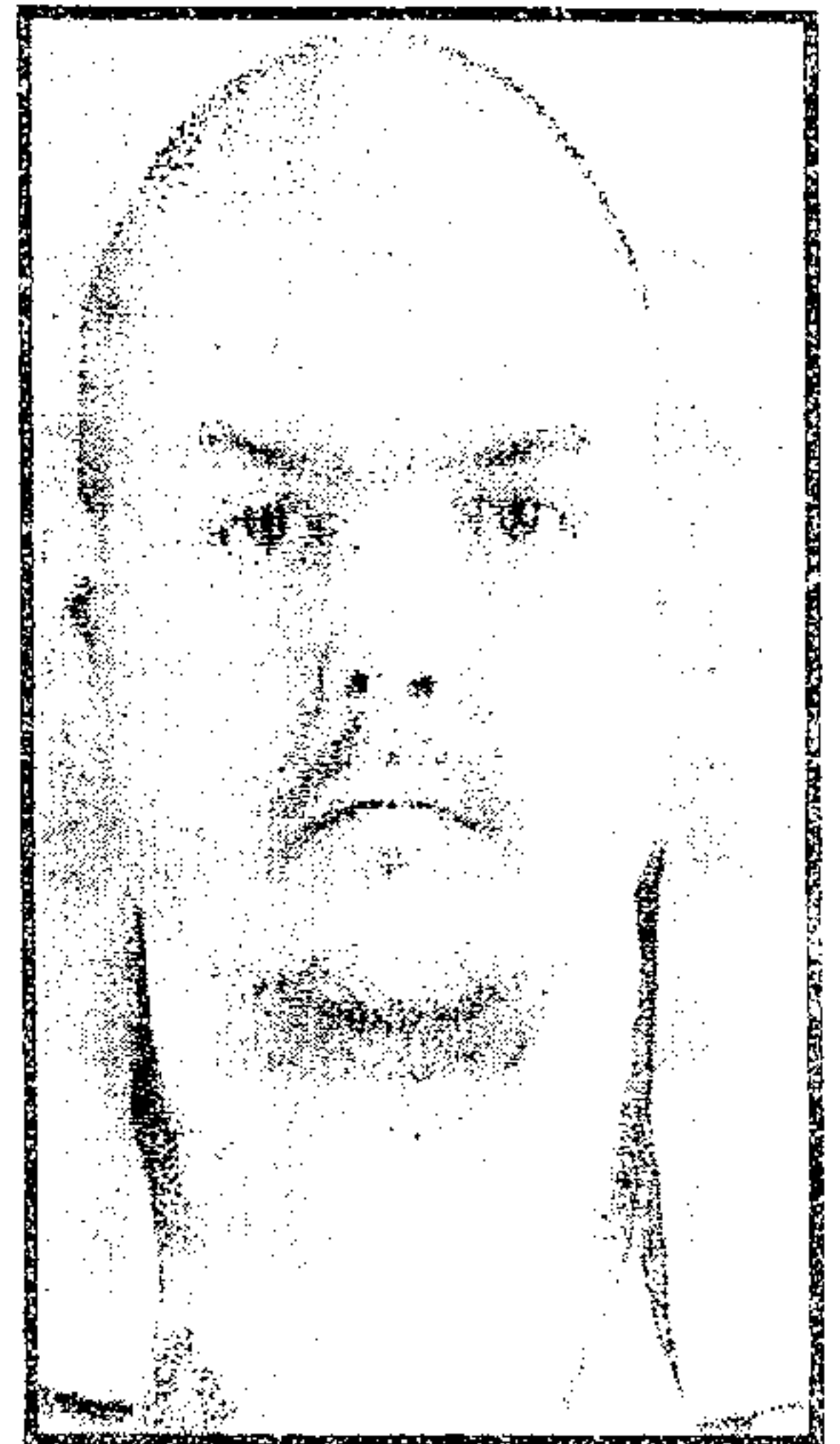

Ronald Randolph Radford sentenced to 15 yrs for distributing Child Pornography

Ronald Randolph Radford, 68, of Johnson City, Tennessee was sentenced on February 9, 2015, to fifteen years in prison followed by a ten-year term of supervised release with special conditions of release, by the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer, United States District Judge for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Greeneville. The sentence was the

result of a guilty plea by Radford on August 14, 2014, to a federal grand jury indictment charging him with distributing, receiving, and possessing child pornography. Radford has been in federal custody since his arrest on April 17, 2014. The indictment and subsequent conviction of Radford was the result of an investigation conducted

by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, and the Johnson City Police Department. At sentencing, District Judge Greer noted the seriousness of the offense Radford committed, the high image count of Radford's child porn collection, the need to promote respect for the

law, the need to adequately deter such offenses in the general public, the need to protect the public, and Radford's personal history and characteristics. This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the

Department of Justice. Led by United States Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section (CEOS), Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and

prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims.

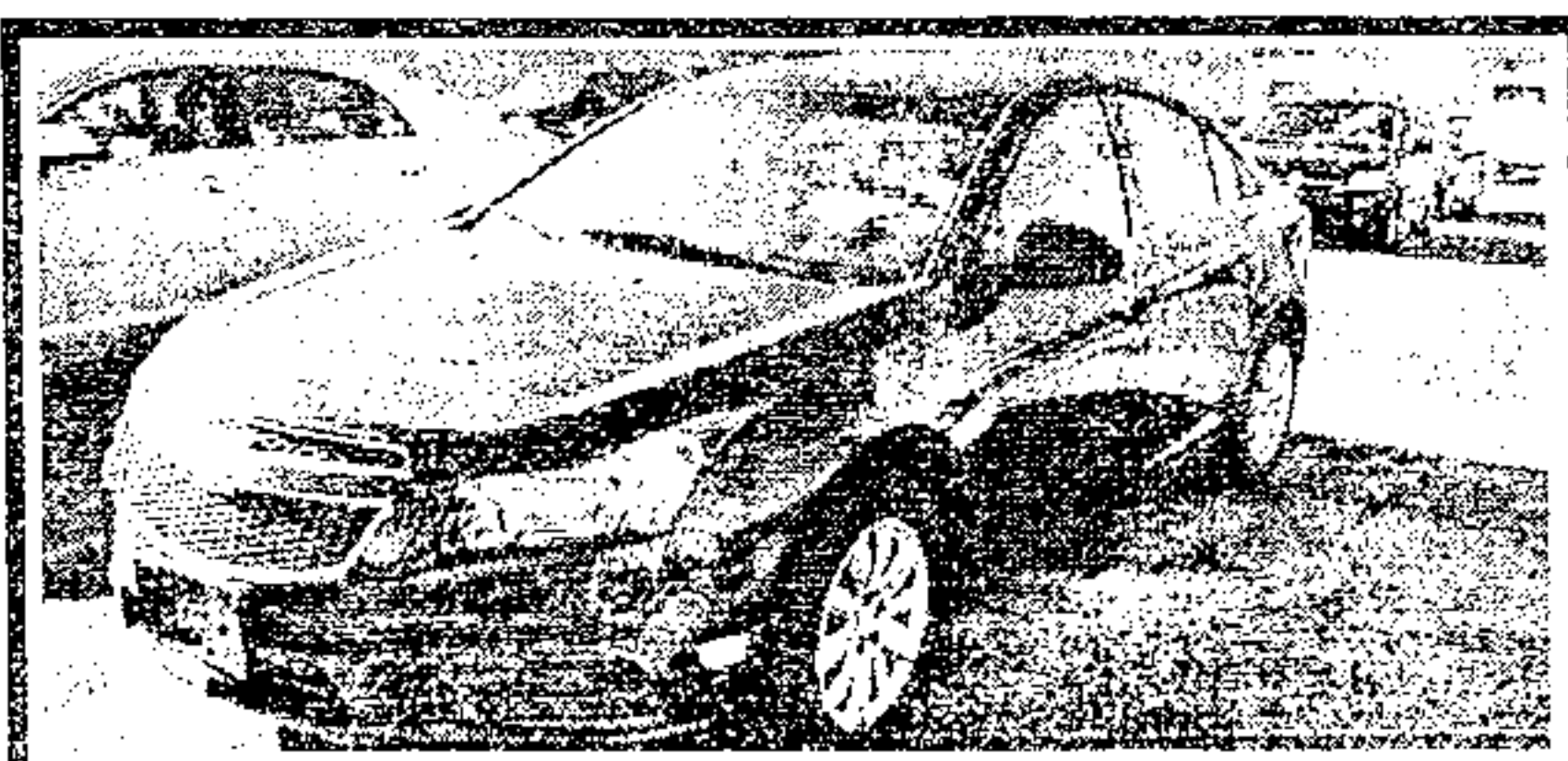

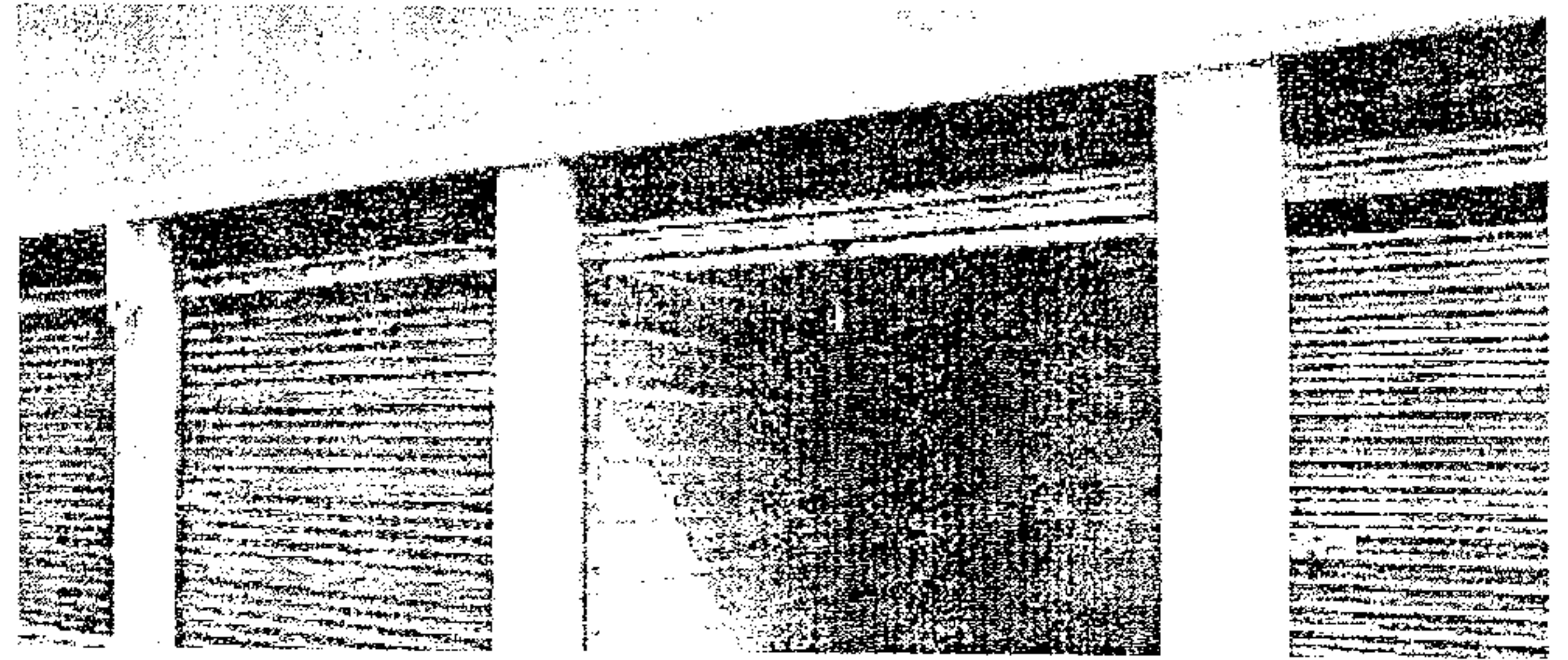
AREAMANSENTENCED FOR DRUG AND GUN OFFENSES

Anthony Douglas Williams, 28, of Greeneville, Tennessee, was sentenced on February 10, 2015, by the Honorable R. Leon Jordan, U.S. District Court Judge, to serve 286 months in federal prison for his conviction on charges of possession with intent to distribute crack cocaine, and knowingly using and carrying a firearm during and in relation to a drug trafficking crime. Federal sentences are not parolable. On February 20, 2014, members of the Johnson City Police Department came upon Williams after he had been involved in a traffic accident on Interstate 26. Upon questioning, and after attempts by Williams to provide false identifying information, officers confirmed Williams's identity and the existence of several outstanding warrants for his arrest. When law enforcement then proceeded to take Williams into custody, a struggle ensued in which Williams tried to gain control of one of the officer's guns. Williams was eventually subdued and placed under arrest. Thereafter, a search of Williams uncovered two firearms, accompanying ammunition, approximately 16.32 grams of crack cocaine, approximately 8.90 grams of powder cocaine, 92 dihydrocodeinone pills, and several hundred dollars. A subsequent

search of Williams's vehicle unrevealed a third firearm, approximately 14.175 grams of marijuana, and four digital scales. This case was the product of cooperation between the Johnson City, Tennessee Police Department, and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives. Assistant United States Attorney Nick Regalia represented the United States. This case was brought as part of Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN), a com-

prehensive national strategy that creates local partnerships with law enforcement agencies to effectively enforce existing gun laws. It provides more options to prosecutors, allowing them to utilize local, state, and federal laws to ensure that criminals who commit gun crime face tough sentences. PSN gives each federal district the flexibility it needs to focus on individual challenges that a specific community faces.

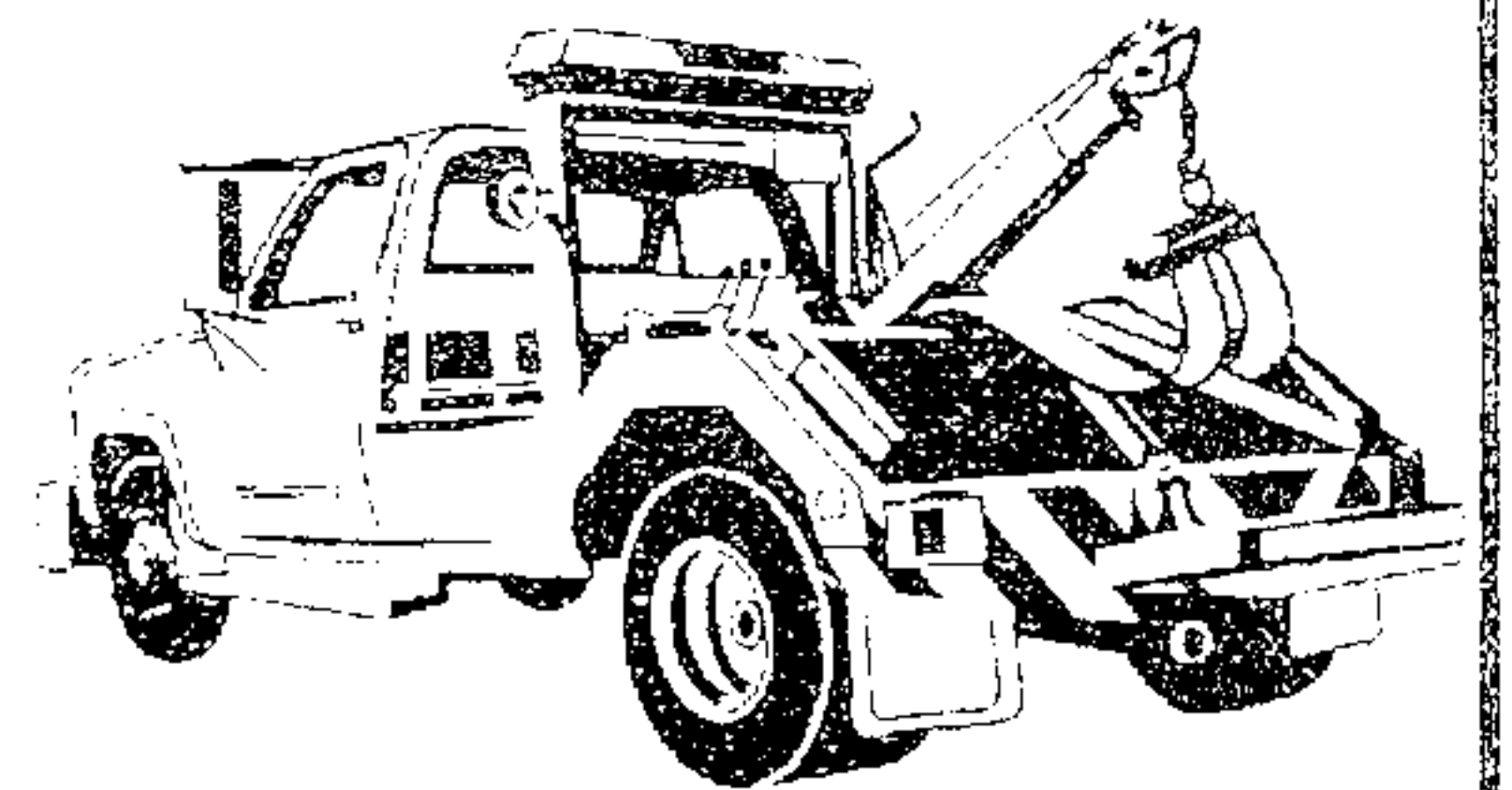

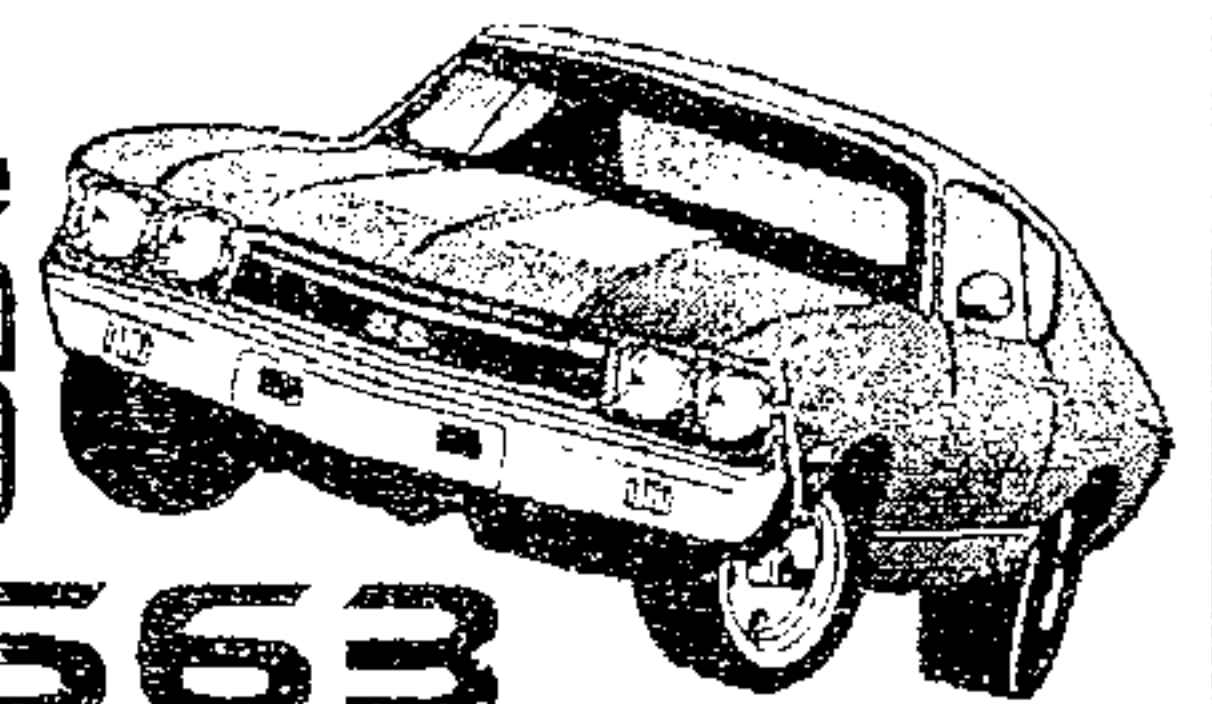

Jason Holland, 37, Peterson Road Greenback, was charged with manufacturing/sell/poss of controlled substance, Poss of Drug Para., Promotion of Methamphetamine Manufacture, and Simple Poss/Casual Exchange.

According to the report, Deputy Kenneth Palmer LCSO, observed a red Chevrolet S10 traveling North on Highway 321. Deputy observed the tag on the vehicle was covered with dirt making the tag unreadable. Deputy stopped the vehicle on Highway 321 at Yedear Road. Deputy made contact with the driver Mr. Jason Keith Holland. Mr. Holland was evasive and hesitated to answer Deputies questions.

Deputy asked Mr. Holland to exit the vehicle. Deputy asked Mr. Holland if he had anything illegal on him at which time he stated no. Sgt. M. Watkins arrived on scene at which time he deployed his K9. Sgt. Watkins advised

that his K9 alerted on the vehicle. Deputy observed Mr. Holland was wearing a necklace that appeared to be a pipe used for smoking marijuana. When Mr. Holland removed the necklace

Deputy observed it was a pipe with a green leafy substance inside believed to be marijuana. Deputy located in Mr. Holland's pocket a cap to a needle. Mr. Holland stated he had a couple needles in the bid of his overalls.

Deputy located four needles inside Mr. Holland's overalls. Sgt. Watkins located 10 more needles inside a computer case along with 3 cut straws, a

pipe used for smoking marijuana and approximately 2 grams of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana.

Sgt. Watkins also located, in a wallet, behind the drivers seat 4 needles 3 which were loaded with some type of liquid.

Sgt. Watkins also located inside the wallet 2 baggy's with a approx 1.1 grams of powder total. The powder field tested positive for meth. While searching a bag in the bed of the truck Deputy located a bottle with a active meth lab. Deputy observe a blue liquid with what appeared to be lithium strips and a paste in the

bottom.

Sgt. Watkins notified narcotics which responded to the scene and properly disposed of the meth lab.

Mr. Holland was arrested and transported

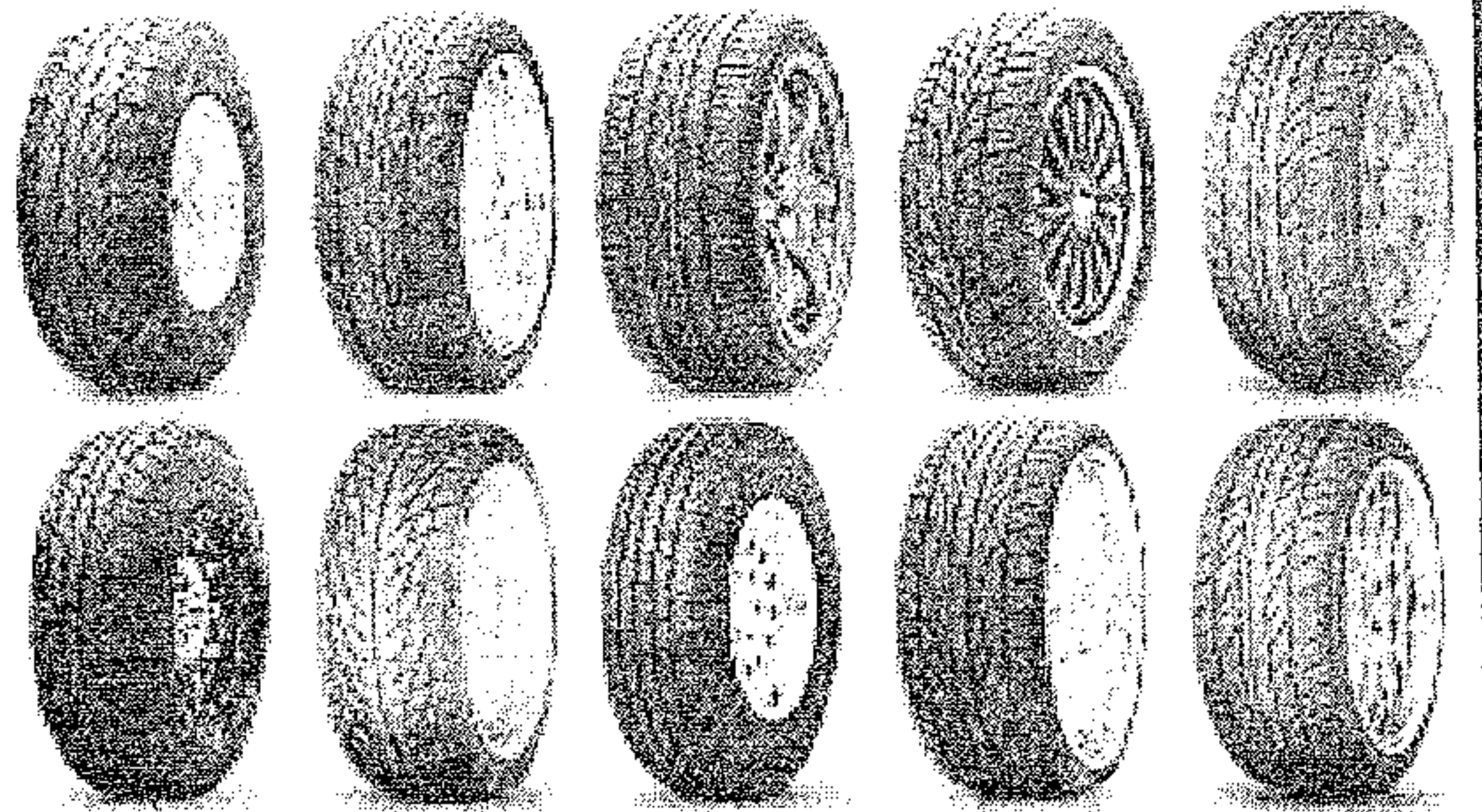
to the Loudon County jail.

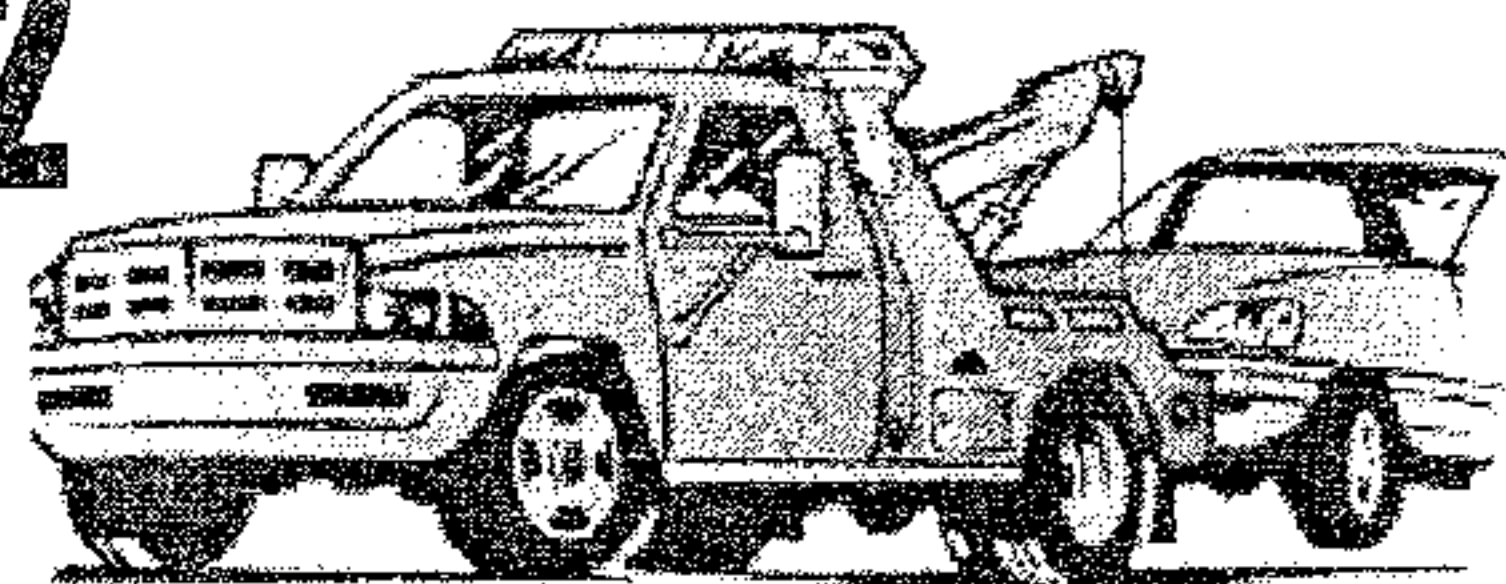


