



Ms. Scearce was able to facilitate her scheme by misclassifying some standard inspections as more costly "nonstandard" inspections and, in several instances, charging for inspections she did not perform. She also forged contractor signatures on some permits and inspection forms.

On February 9, 2015 the

Dyer Country Grand Jury indicted Susan Scearce on two counts of theft over \$1,000.

The Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance has corrected its processes that allowed these overcharges to occur and not be detected timely.

"Ms. Scearce not only defrauded contractors, she also submitted false forms to the

State of Tennessee," Comptroller Justin P. Wilson said. "Most of Tennessee's electrical inspectors are contract workers, and I'm pleased to see the TDCI take steps to prevent overcharges from occurring."
