Deputy C. Parker, observed a Silver PT Cruiser bearing Texas tag traveling on Martel Road near Shaw Ferry Road. The vehicle was observed to be traveling 47 mph in a 35

I'm gonna have to practice what I preach because I am guilty of neglecting my friend, Jesus. The past couple of months I've let other things get in the way of spending time with my best friend.

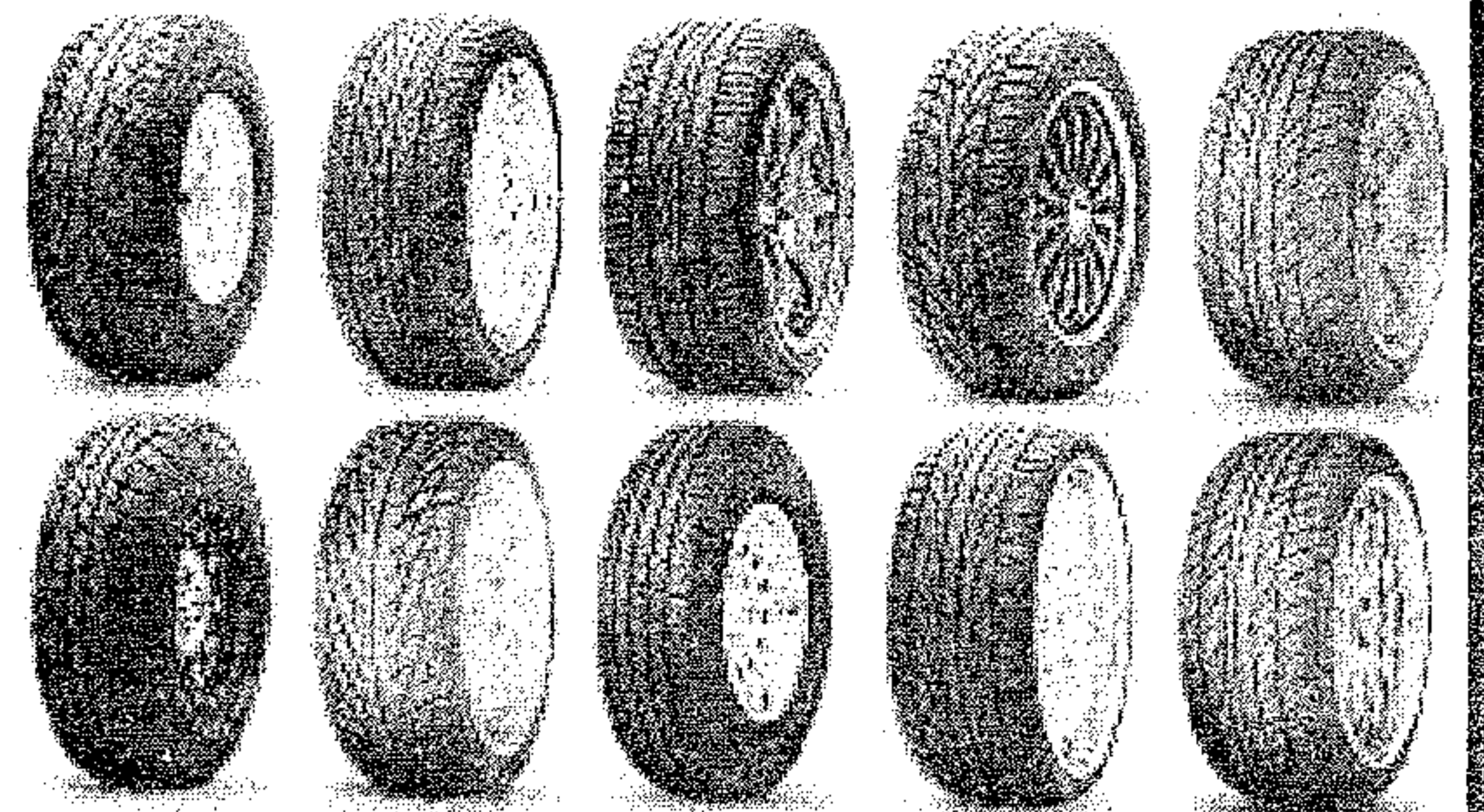
"Lord, I want to thank You for the blessings You have given us. We are surrounded with great friends all the way from Tennessee to Montana.
