
Obituaries

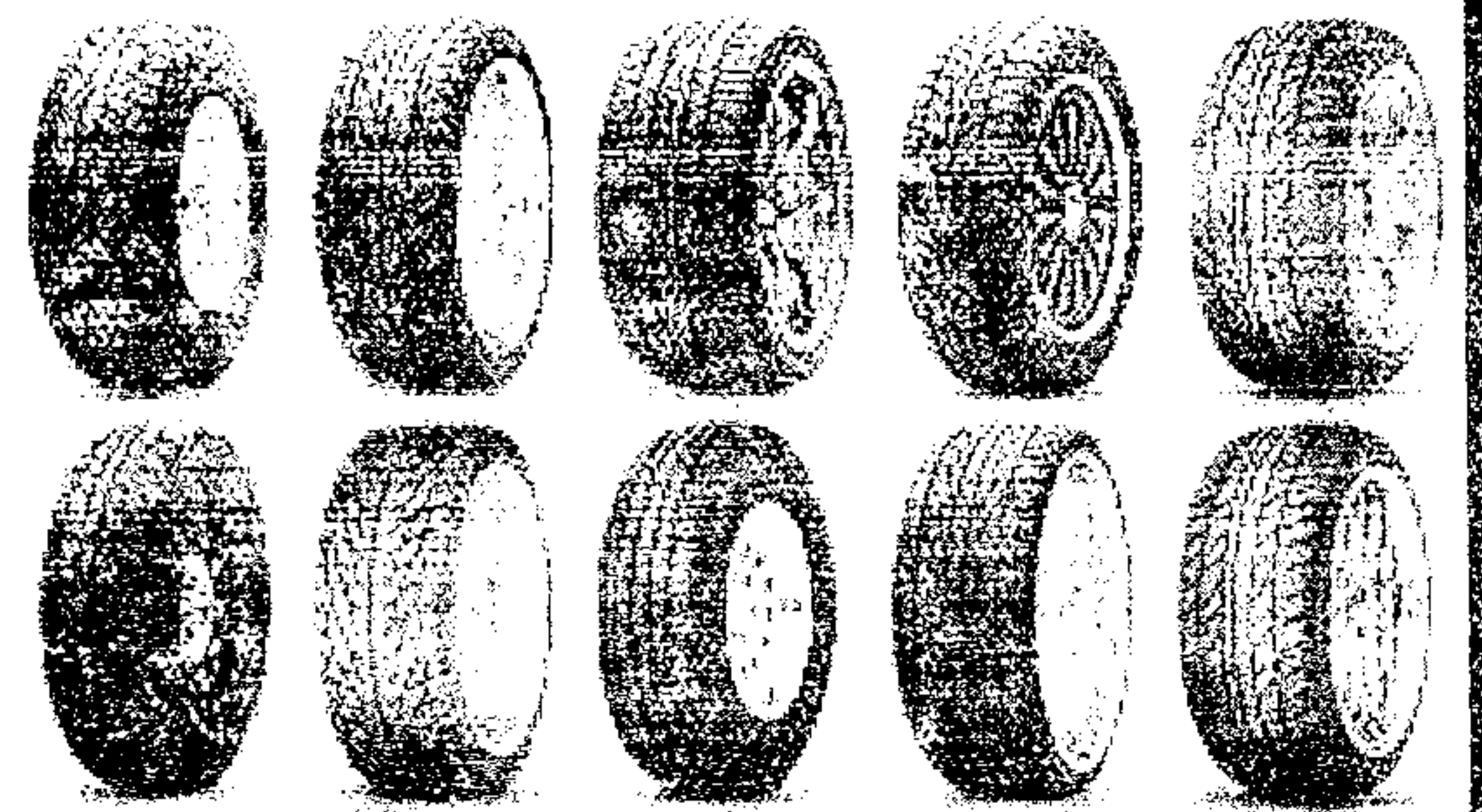
