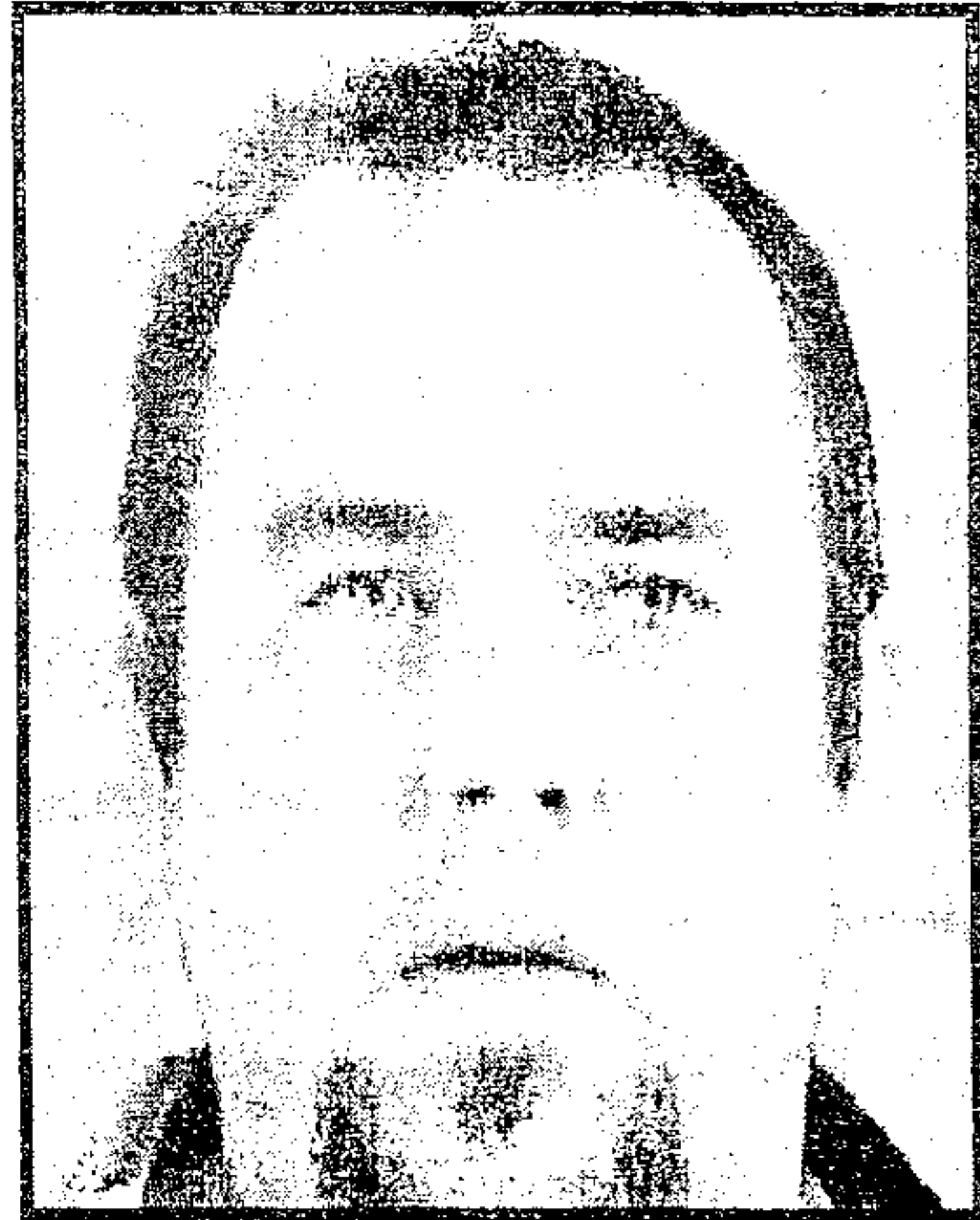

## Aaron John Cashatt sentenced for Credit Card Fraud Scheme

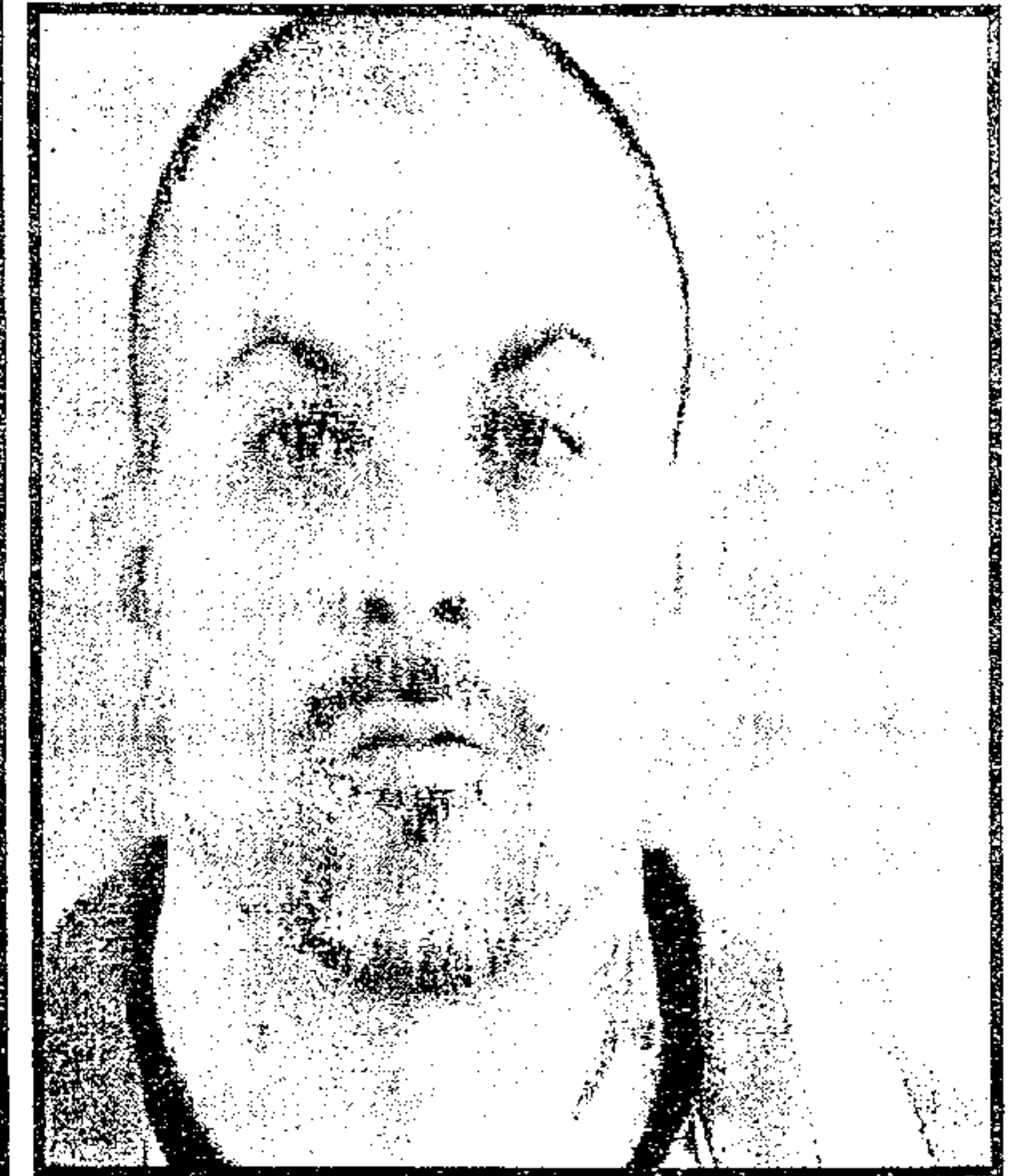
Aaron John Cashatt, 35, of Phoenix, Ariz. was sentenced by the Honorable Leon Jordan, Senior U.S. District Judge, to serve 50 months in prison for his role in a credit card fraud scheme. Upon his release from prison, Cashatt will be supervised by the U.S. Probation Office for a term of three years. Additionally, he was ordered to forfeit his interest in a

laundry list of items which he used to perpetrate the scheme and purchased through the scheme, including computer equipment, cellular telephones, laminating equipment for fake identification cards, credit card readers, and a credit card encoder.

Cashatt pleaded guilty in October 2014 to a federal grand jury indictment charging him with conspiracy, access device fraud, and ag-

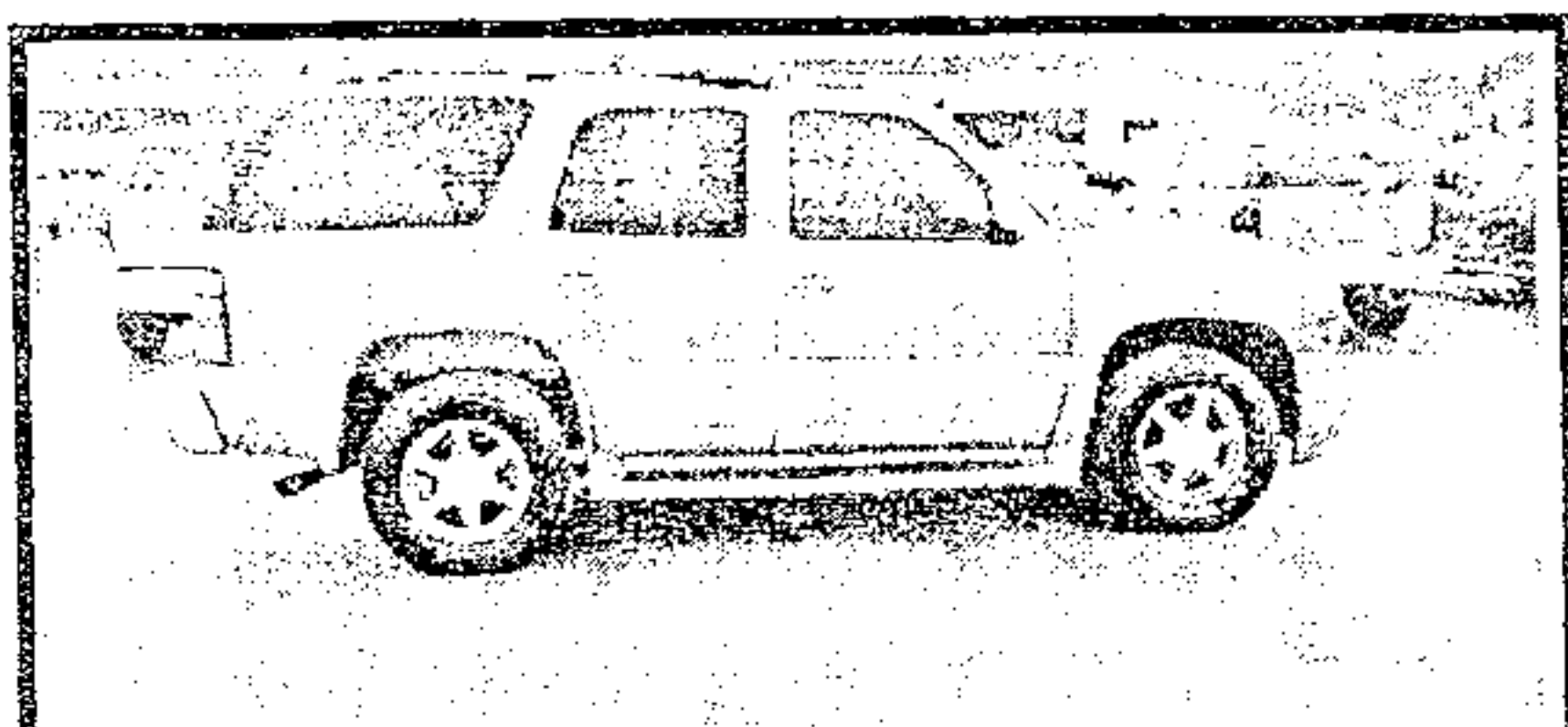

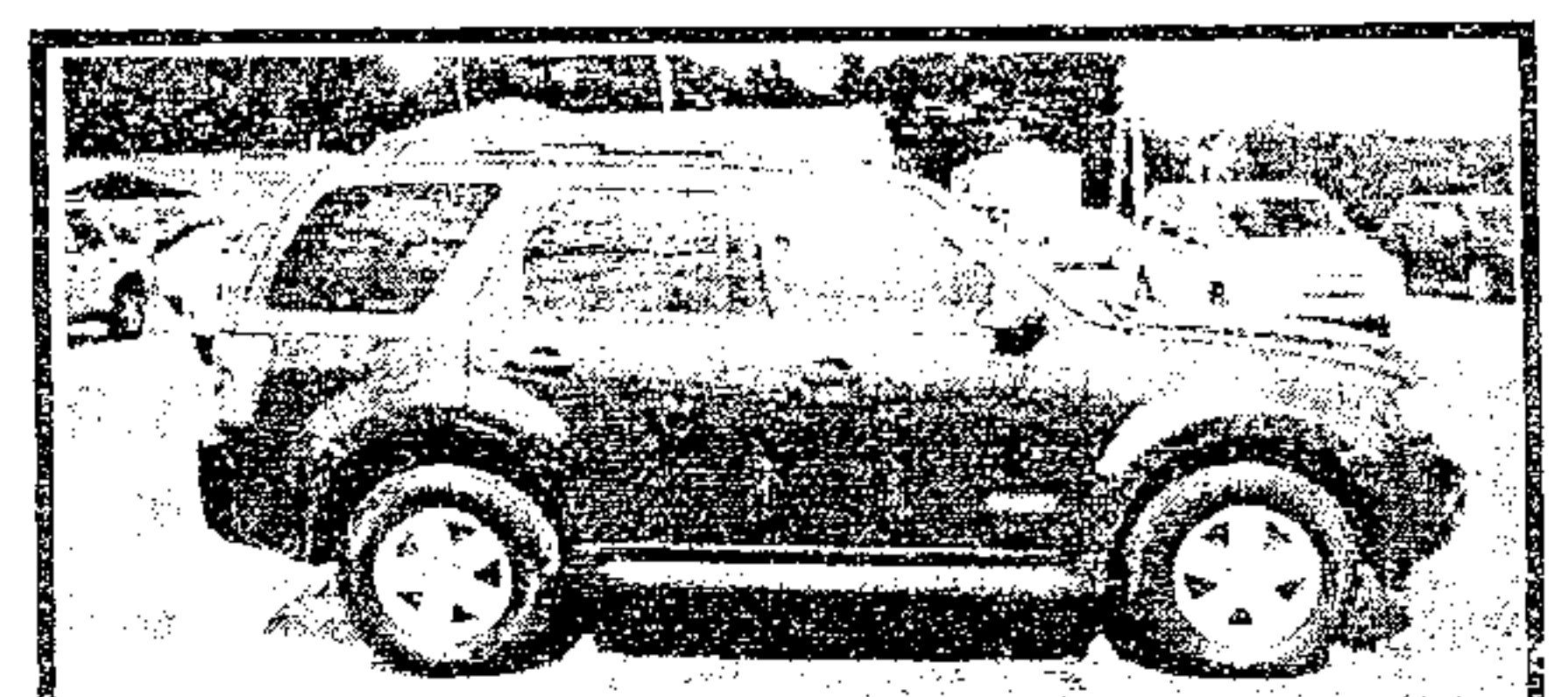

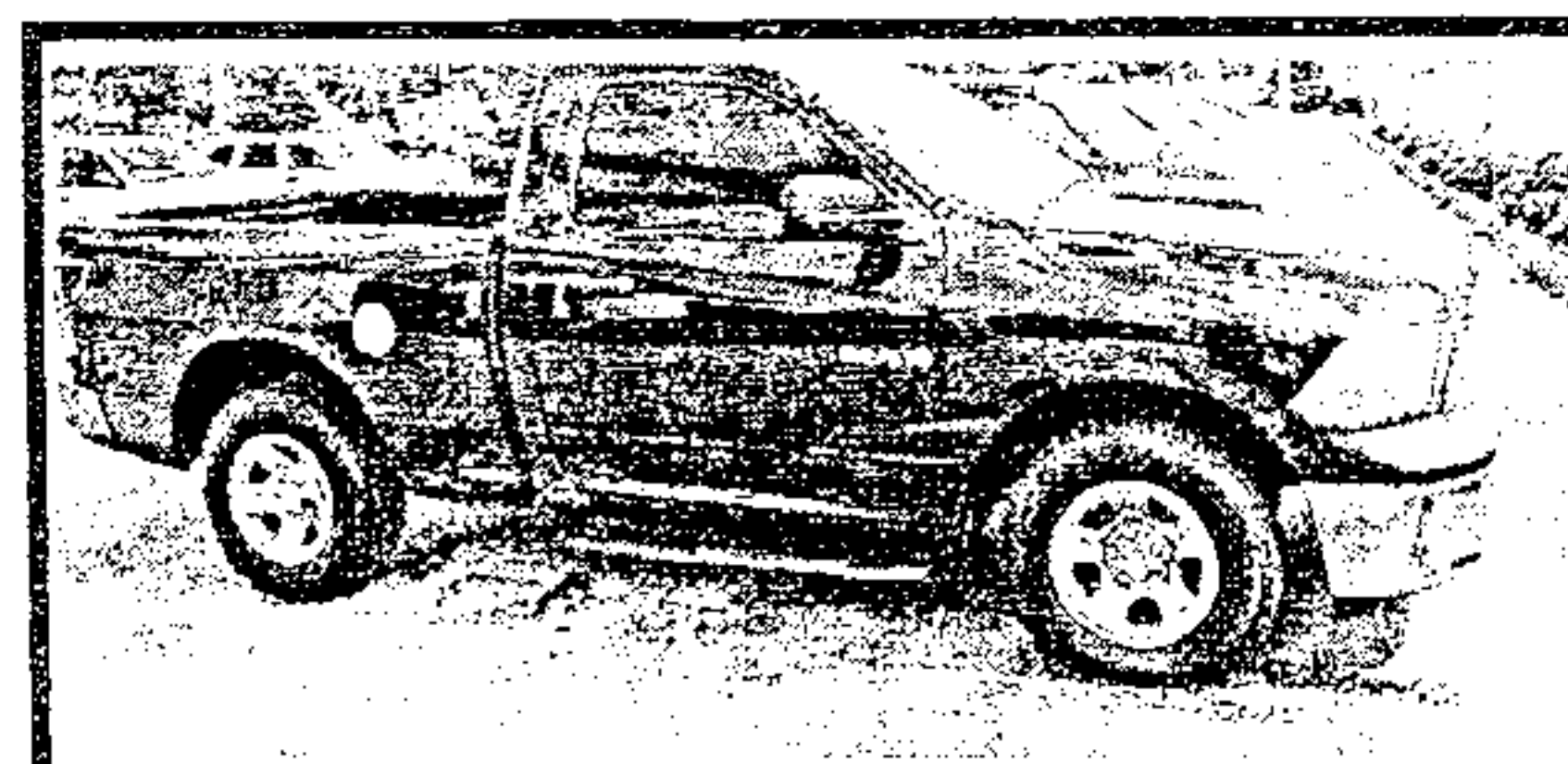

State Fire Marshal's Office highlights Burn Awareness Week

February 1-7 is National Burn Awareness Week, and the Tennessee State Fire Marshal's Office is joining the American Burn Association to encourage scald and burn prevention.

"Although anyone can sustain a scald burn, certain people are more likely to be scalded - infants, young children, older adults and people with disabilities.

These high-risk groups are also more likely to require hospitalization, suffer complications and experience a difficult recovery," said Tennessee Commerce and Insurance Commissioner Julie Mix McPeak. "Most burn injuries occur in the person's own home, and the vast majority of these injuries can be prevented."

Scald injuries are painful and require prolonged treatment. Depending on their severity, they can result in lifelong scarring or even death. Preventing scalds can be accomplished through simple changes in behavior and the home environment.

Follow these tips to decrease the risk of scalds and burns to yourself and those you love:

Prevent tap-water scalds and burns

Adequate and constant supervision is the single most important factor in preventing tap water scalds. Provide constant adult supervision of young children, anyone who might experience difficulty removing themselves from hot water on their own, or people who might not recognize the danger associated with turning on the hot water.

Set water heater thermostats to deliver water at a temperature no higher than 120° F.

Mix bath water thoroughly and check the temperature by moving your elbow, wrist or hand with spread fingers through the water before allowing someone to get in.

Turn the faucet to the "COLD" position when not in use if the tub has a single faucet handle.

When bathing young children,

position them away from faucets to prevent them from being able to reach faucet knobs. Again, keep faucets set to the "COLD" position.

Prevent cooking-related scalds and burns

To prevent spills due to the overturning of appliances containing hot food or liquids, use the back burner when possible, and or turn pot handles away from the stove's front edge (or any edge where someone could bump into the pot handles). All appliance

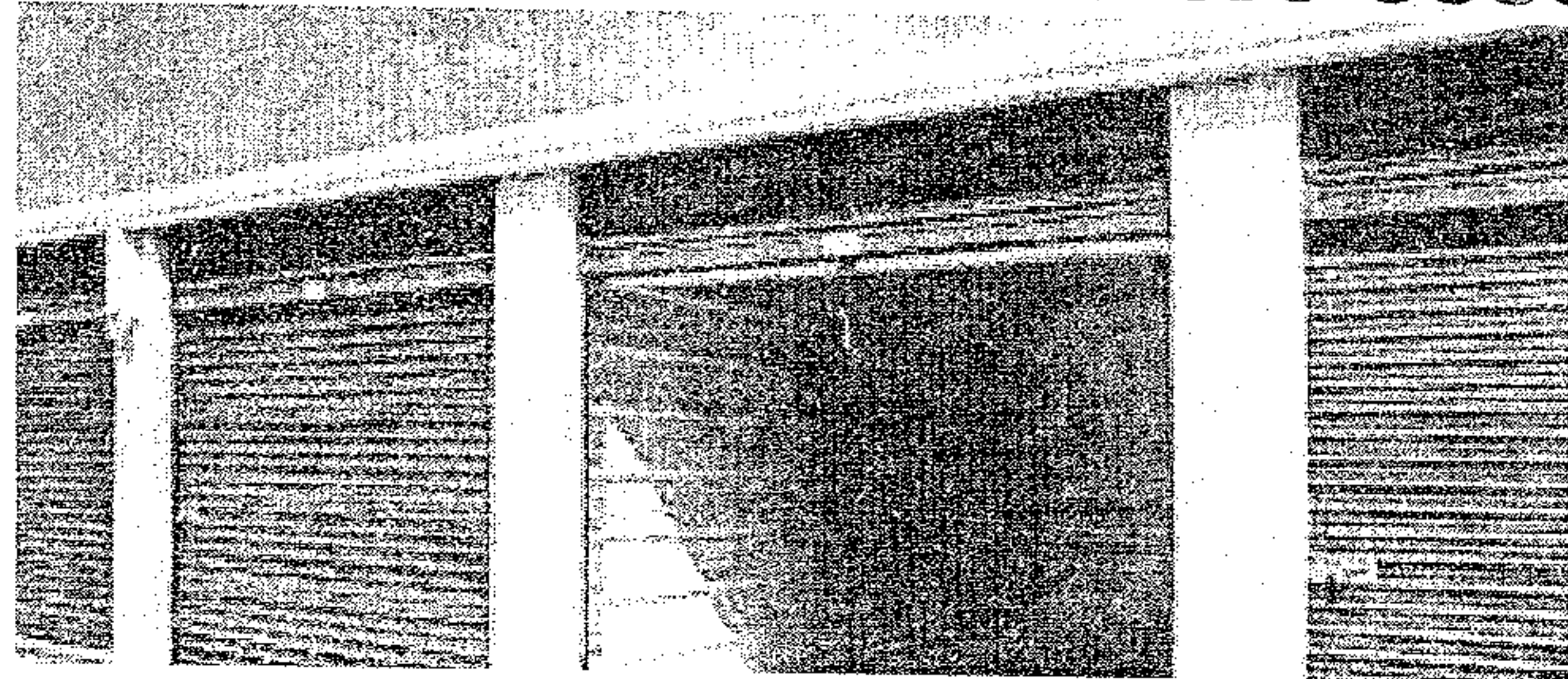
cords need to be kept coiled and away from counter edges.

Use oven mitts or potholders when moving hot food from ovens, microwave ovens or stovetops. Never use wet oven mitts or potholders, because they can cause scald burns. Replace old or worn-out oven mitts.

Open heated food containers slowly, away from the face, to avoid steam burns. Steam escaping from the container or from food can cause burns.

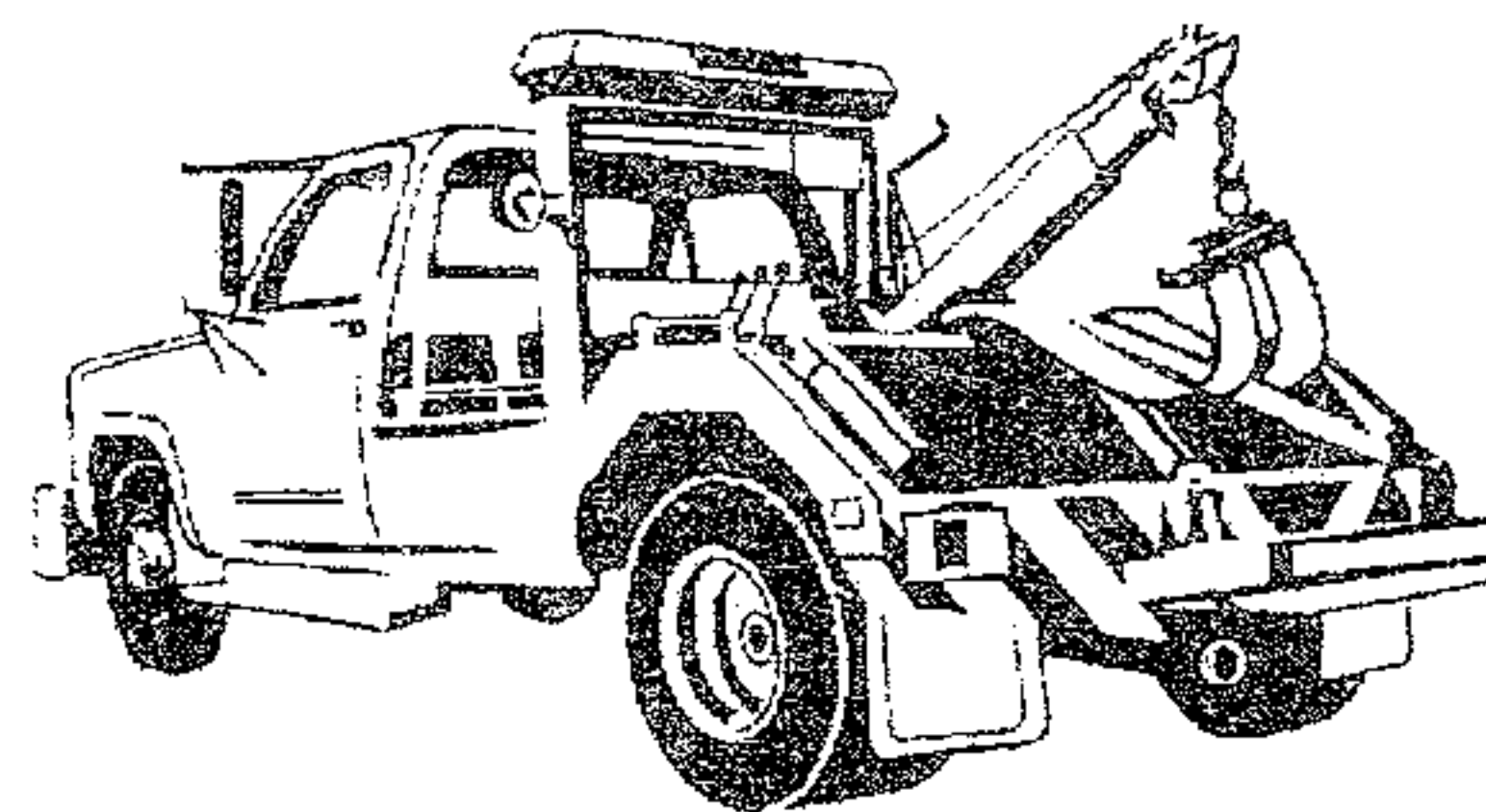

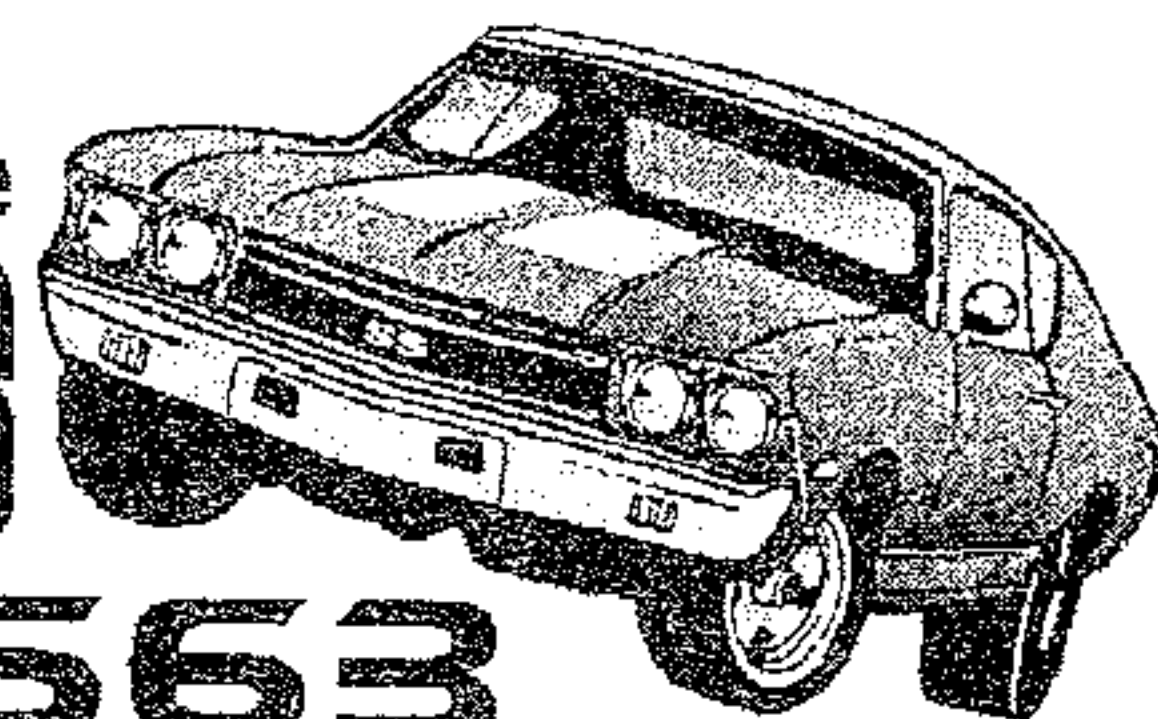

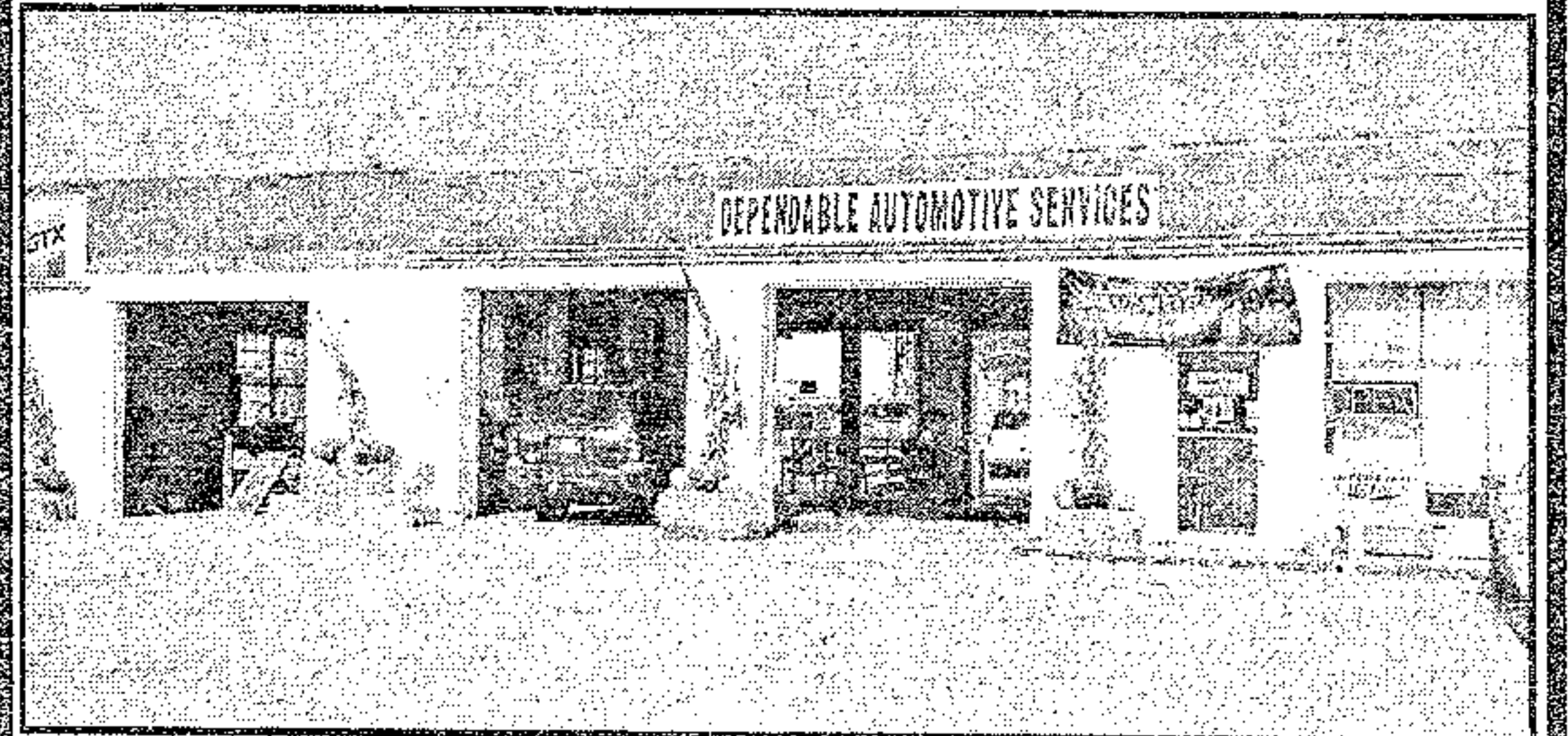

FBI gravated identity theft. The indictment and plea agreement on file with the U.S. District Court detailed the scheme in which Cashatt would use stolen credit card information with a credit card encoder to re-encode credit cards with the stolen information. He and his co-conspirators would then use a credit card

reader and smart phone to "dump" funds from the stolen accounts into a bank account controlled by Cashatt. He purchased some of the stolen credit card account information and obtained some of the credit card account information by breaking into hotel rooms in the Phoenix area.

U.S. Attorney Bill Killian said, "The local

and federal law enforcement agencies are to be congratulated for their detection, investigation and successful prosecution of this individual.

The devastating economic consequences from identity theft affect many people. Our office, working with law enforcement, will

continue our aggressive efforts to uncover these crimes and prosecute the individuals responsible."

The indictment and subsequent conviction of Cashatt was the result of an investigation conducted by the U.S. Secret Service, with assistance from the Knoxville Police Department and U.S. Marshals Service. Assistant U.S. Attorney Matthew T. Morris represented the United States.
