

vantaged neighborhoods the skills and discipline they need to steer clear of gangs, drugs, and crime.

Located just outside the District of Columbia, Bucknell was one of the first schools to embrace the FBI's Adopt-A-School outreach program 20 years ago. Now, the Washington Field Office administers the program to six schools in and around the nation's capital, dispatching agents and other Bureau employees throughout the school year to be tutors and mentors to more than 300 young people annually.

"During the past two decades we have reached thousands of kids," said Special Agent William Woodson. "Our goal is to provide opportunities for these young people who might not have had them otherwise."

The Junior Special Agent Program at Bucknell consists of core blocks of instruction that integrate with classroom curriculum. For example, when the students learn about the Civil War and the Emancipation Proclamation, they take field trips to battlefield sites and the U.S. Capitol to reinforce what they learn. Funds for the trips are provided by the local Citizens Academy Alumni Association, a non-profit organization that supports the Adopt-A-School Program and uses no taxpayer money. The students also meet a variety of FBI agents who talk to them about gangs and drugs, as well as core values such as integrity, respect, and honesty. And the program requires students to exercise on a regular basis.

"We are helping to make sure that the kids don't do drugs and stay in school,"

Woodson said. "Our agents have a positive influence on them."

"The FBI is teaching our students to do the right thing and believe in themselves," said Paul Adams, who participated with the Junior Special

Agent Program for nine years as a Bucknell teacher and now serves as a liaison between the school and the Washington Field Office. "This program shows our young people that no matter where you come







of one of Hofstetter's clinics branched out on their own and opened another Knoxville clinic.

A series of indictments remains under seal. Those indictments are believed to involve people accused of sponsoring trips from out of state and from outside Knox County to Hofstetter's clinic in return for a cut from the pills received.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Tracy Stone told U.S. Magistrate Bruce Guyton there are 32 related indictments expected to be filed by the end of the week.

The roundup apparently began Tuesday morning as federal agents and local law enforcement officers raided two West Knoxville pain clinics and the West Knox County home of a clinic operator, seiz-

ing records and saying little.

The raids began about 8 a.m. with officers from the Knoxville Police Department and the Knox County Sheriff's Office joining agents with the FBI and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security as they swarmed into East Knoxville Healthcare Services LLC, 509 Lovell Road.

That pain clinic is in the former Prince Deli and Sports Bar just off the Lovell Road interchange for Interstate 40/75. On one side of the targeted pain clinic is an adult video store. On the other side, a Waffle House.

A man who said he was a regular customer of East Knoxville Healthcare Services said he had been obtaining pain pills from the clinic housed in the building. He arrived about 9 a.m. at the business for his appointment

and was questioned by federal agents. He was allowed to leave, but without his antici-

pated dose of pain pills.



The administrator and director of nursing at a Lenoir City health care facility have been charged with tampering with records.

Anita Wilmoth, 55, who has since left the administrator's job at Baptist Health Care Center, and Freda Jo Morton, 52, turned themselves in on the charges Tuesday, according to the TBL.

They were released from jail on their own recognizance.

According to the TBI, agents with the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit in April 2014 investigated a report of abuse at Baptist Health Care Center, 700 Williams Ferry Road in Lenoir City. The state Department of Human Services' Adult Protective Services unit had asked the TBI to step in.

"During the course of the investigation, agents developed information that on March 11, 2014, (Wilmoth) and (Morton) instructed the staff at the facility to mislead the state investigators looking into the allegations of abuse."

The formal charges against them are tampering with govern-

ment records and failure to make a report.

investigation stemmed from a complaint that a certified nursing assistant had "inserted the fingers of a partially inflated latex glove into the mouth of the resident while making sexually suggestive comments about the resident in the presence of four other staff members," according to records posted at http://medicare.gov/.

The resident was "severely cognitively impaired" and needed extensive assistance for daily activities.

Investigators found the center had not reported the alleged occurrence to the resident's family or to the state.

According to records, the administrator in an interview April 21, 2014, indicated they thought the incident was "horseplay" and so did not report it to the state.
