Detective Greg Scalf was interviewing Alex Gambrill on Sunday.

The sheriff said he's confident evidence will show Alex Gambrill was the shooter.

Alex Gambrill surrendered to authorities about 7 p.m. Saturday outside the residence at 142 Bridges Lane, east of Harriman, according to Stockton.

Authorities were called to the scene about 2:30 p.m. on the report of a woman who had been shot.

The sheriff said that accord-

ing to Alex Gambrill's father, Alex Gambrill rendered first aid to his ex-wife before rescue personnel arrived on the scene.

The suspect's father also reported his son told him someone fired on him before he fired. The sheriff said on Sunday he wasn't aware of evidence that someone else fired a weapon.

Stockton said Saturday's standoff was difficult because Alex Gambrill is a former police officer and understood the tactics deputies were using in dealing with him.







The sheriff said Scalf communicated with Alex Gambrill by cell phone for two hours Saturday before a couple of other officers came to the scene who knew him and he asked for one to come up to the house and they started talking.

The sheriff said the Gambrills were vorced and there was an issue about a text message between Alex Gambrill and his exwife's boyfriend.

The sheriff said that after the shooting, the boyfriend, who was unarmed, ran down

the road and waited for deputies.

Stockton said authorities have been called to the address in the past.

Lenoir City Police Chief Don White said he didn't have documentation with him Sunday as far as dates of employment, but he hired Alex Gambrill as a patrol officer after he was laid off from the Tennessee Valley Authority police department.

"He was a good employee for us and resigned due to personal reasons," the chief said. "He had no disciplinary problems with us."
