



the actions of a former payroll clerk who issued herself extra checks, and failed to withhold the proper amount of money from her income as ordered by the U.S. Bankruptcy Court. The Board of Education has already recovered some of this amount. This finding has been reviewed with the district attorney general.

Other findings in the audit report include expenditures exceeding appropriations, accounting deficiencies, multiple employees operating from the same cash drawer in the

County Clerk and Clerk and Master's Offices, and a failure to separate money handling responsibilities in several offices.

"More than half of the findings in this report were also highlighted in 2013," Comptroller Justin P. Wilson said. "I call on Houston County government leaders and its Audit Committee to address the financial practices, internal control and other noncompliance issues reported in this annual audit."







Silvestre Valasquez,20, Corinth Road Loudon, was charged with Underage Consumption.


