



ISIL Defacements Exploiting WordPress Vulnerabilities

Summary

Continuous Web site defacements are being perpetrated by individuals sympathetic to the Islamic State in the Levant (ISIL) a.k.a. Islamic State of Iraq and al-Shams (ISIS). The defacements have affected Web site operations and the communication platforms of news organizations, commercial entities, religious institu-

governments, foreign governments, and a variety of other domestic and international Web sites. Although the defacements demonstrate low-level hacking sophistication, they are disruptive and often costly in terms of lost business revenue and expenditures on technical services to repair infected computer systems.

Researchers continue to identify WordPress Content Management System (CMS) plug-in vulnerabilities, which could allow malicious actors to take control of an affected system. Some of these vulnerabilities were exploited in the recent Web site defacements noted above. Software patches are available for identified vulnerabilities.

Successful exploitation of zation. These individuals are the vulnerabilities could result in an attacker gaining un-

authorized access, bypassing security restrictions, injecting scripts, and stealing cookies from computer systems or network servers. An attacker could install malicious software; manipulate data; or create new accounts with full user privileges for future Web site exploitation.



conquer their fears for money. A person selling-out themselves has proven to be amusing and profitable for network television. It's one thing to ask someone how much it would cost for them to wear a silly outfit in public or parachute out of an airplane or eat something gross. These things are morally neutral. But there are some things that shouldn't ever have a price – things like integrity, honesty, morality, our commitment to God and to our family. These things are not a game. Every person should periodically ask, "Do I have a price? What would it take for me to compromise?"

It would be nice to think that followers of Christ do not have a price, and that with their initial one-time commitment to Jesus, comes a lifelong, resolute loyalty. However, that is not always the case. It is not uncommon to find people who claim to be Christians cheating on their taxes, padding their expense accounts, stealing from their workplace, and doing whatever it takes by hook or crook to get their desires. It is a bad trade-off. A righteous person's commitment to God should be such that he or she will obey Him no matter what he or she is offered to compromise.

King Saul, the leader who

had everything a nation would want, lacked such commitment. When the pressure was on, Saul disobeyed specific instructions from God and spared a king and the best of his livestock (1 Samuel 15). That was Saul's price – a defeated king to gloat over and a herd of animals. Saul thought he could rationalize away God's clear instructions. But notice how the Lord responds: "Then the word of the Lord came to Samuel: 'I am grieved that I have made Saul king, because he has turned away from me and has not carried out my instructions."

Saul had a character flaw; he was more concerned about gaining honor and prestige in the eyes of men than in pleasing God. It was his insecurity that caused him to rationalize his rebellion. When the Prophet Samuel questioned him, Saul said, "I have carried out the Lord's instructions." But Samuel said, "What then is this bleating of the sheep in my ears?" Saul answered, "The soldiers brought the best of the sheep and cattle to sacrifice to the Lord your God." Saul was layering lie upon lie upon lie. He said he had carried out the Lord's instructions, but he hadn't. Saul said it was the soldiers who had done the wrong thing, but they were following his

instructions. It was his fault, not their sin. And then he had the gall to say, "We're saving these animals to sacrifice to God."

It's always fascinating to hear people rationalize their disobedience. Perhaps worst example is Moses' brother Aaron (Exodus 32). Moses went up the mountain to get the law, and the people grew impatient. They became





hackers using relatively unsophisticated methods to exploit technical vulnerabilities and are . utilizing the ISIL name to gain more notoriety than the underlying attack would have otherwise garnered. Methods being utilized by hackers for the defacements indicate that individual Web sites are not being directly targeted by name or business type. All victims of the defacements share common WordPress plug-in vulnerabilities easily exploited by commonly available hacking tools.

Defense
