Loudon man charged with statutory rape of runaway teen

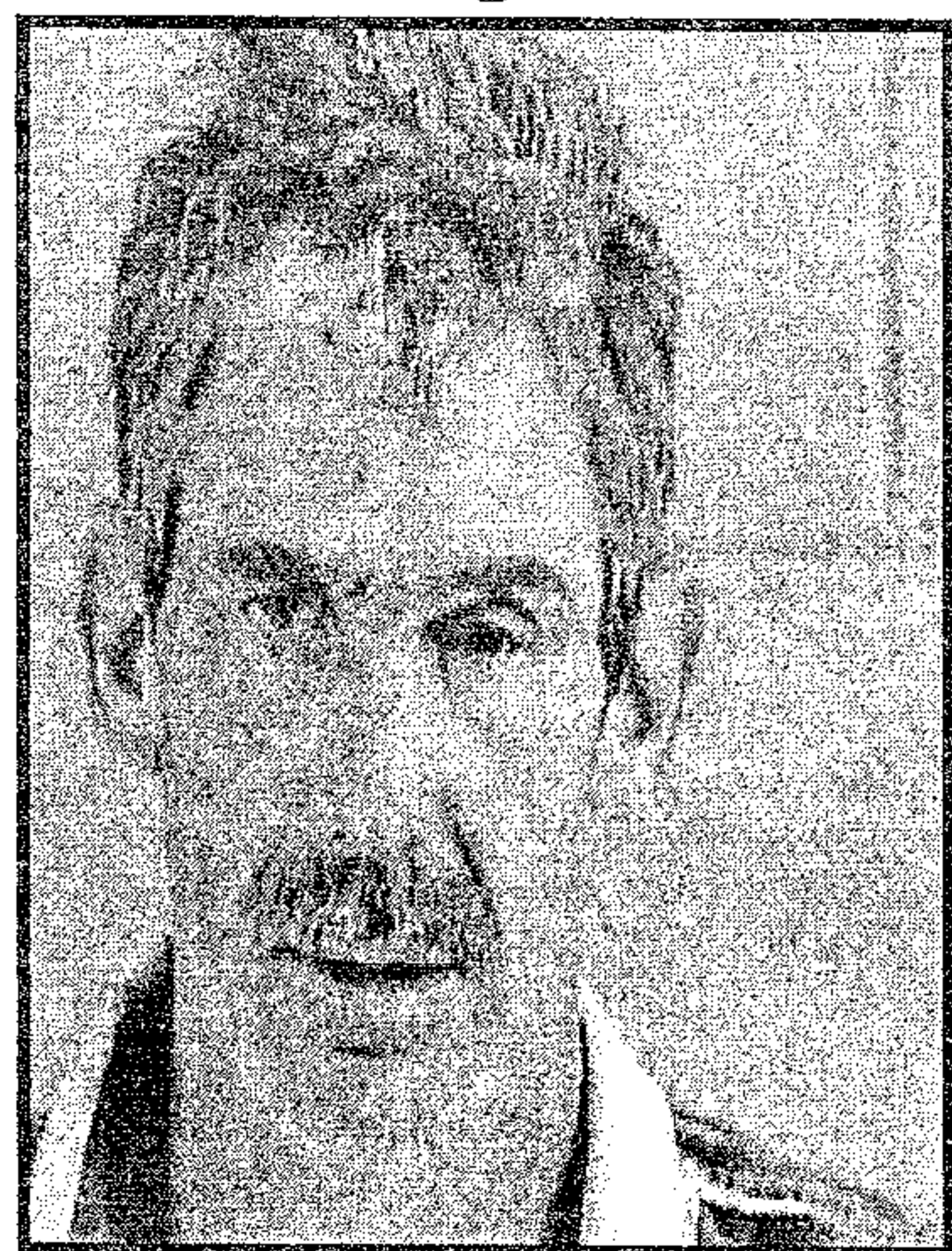

ing blue lights always within my peripheral vision. While searching at least one, and sometimes multiple vehicles each day, I often observed the Daily Edition laying somewhere in the back seat or floor board of the vehicles we were searching. Many TGN readers have commented about enjoying the article even as my partner and I were handcuffing and arresting them. Occasionally a coworker (or two) would laugh and make jokes when a suspect would thank me for writing the article while on their way to the poky! I didn't laugh because I knew that God was making Himself known to people who need Jesus, even while they were in the midst of a difficult situation. I received nothing but respect from many of you who I met in a "professional capacity" and thank God for the conversations we often had on the roadside that did not pertain to controlled substances.

Today's message is for those people. The people who once had a successful job, had a family who trusted them and could stand tall and look in the mirror without regret. I can still see your faces, I remember the talks we had on the side of the road or at the jail. I still remember.

This past week I finished reading a book that was recommended to me by a Christian coworker. The name of the book is "Fearless" and it was written by a guy named Eric Blehm. He was a normal kid in a working class family that began to make some mistakes after high school. He found himself hanging out with the wrong crowd, doing the things he once despised and losing the trust and support of his own family due to poor choices, bad decisions and a crack pipe.

As I read the book, I could not help but think of some of the folks I met while working dope. People who I knew were once different but were now struggling with the demons of addiction. Some hooked on pain meds after a surgery and couldn't get off, some snared by the mighty power of crystal meth and some who just drank too much every day and were now alone, broke, hurting, ashamed and feeling hopeless.

I know police officers, firefighters, elected officials and many other regular folks like me and you who also struggle with similar issues. Bad decisions, addictions, infidelity, poor choices; none of us are immune to the consequences of sin. I was one of you myself. I once was lost, but now

I am found, I was blind, but now I see!

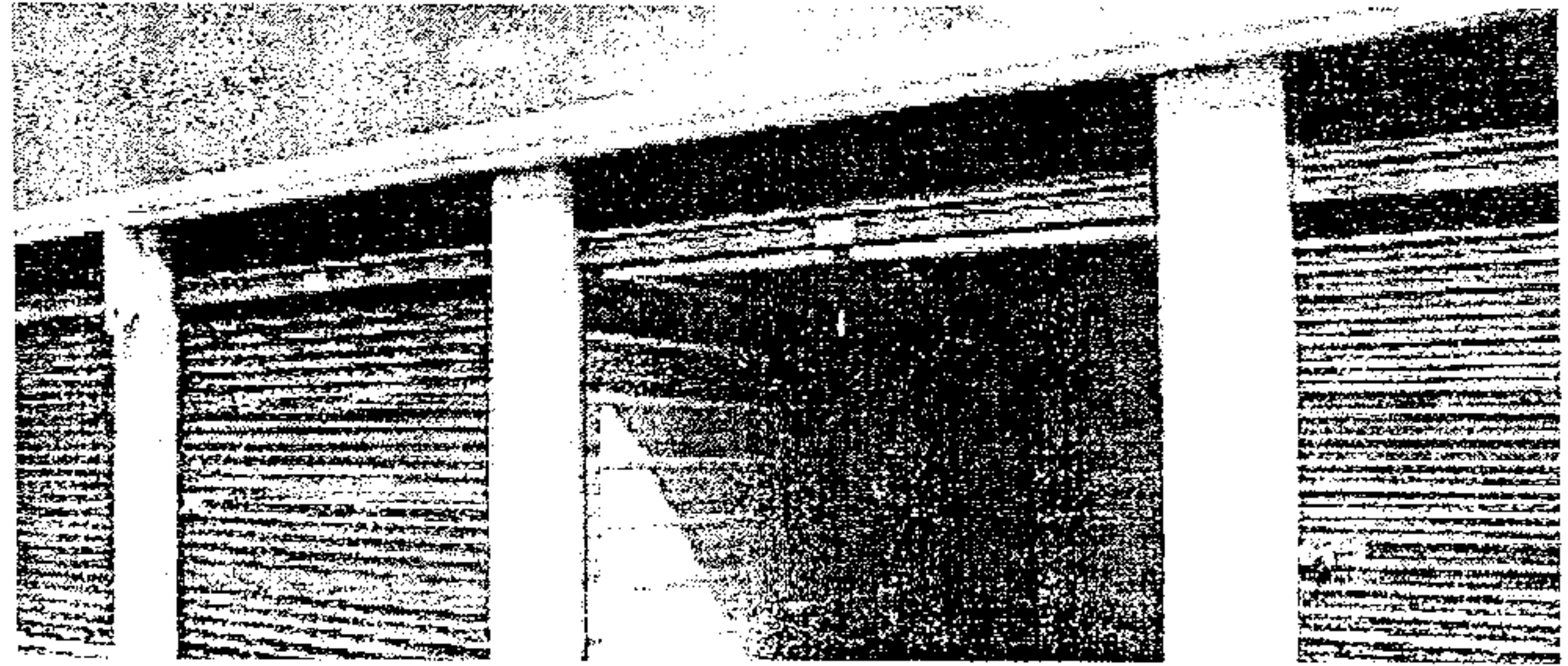

More Than \$16.1 Million in Water and Wastewater Construction Loans Awarded

Tennessee Governor Bill Haslam and Department of Environment and Conservation Commissioner Bob Martineau today announced that five communities and one utility district have been approved to receive more than \$16.1 million in low-interest loans for water and wastewater infrastructure improvements.

The State Revolving Fund (SRF) Loan Program provides low-interest loans that help communities, utility districts, and water and wastewater authorities finance projects that protect

Tennessee's ground and surface waters and public health. Loans are used to finance the planning, design and construction of water and wastewater facilities.

"The State Revolving Fund Loan Program helps communities address current infrastructure needs and prepare for future needs, improving the health of our communities and their ability to grow," Haslam said.

"Through the SRF Program, communities, utility districts, and water and wastewater authorities can obtain loans with lower interest rates than most can obtain through private financing. Interest rates for loans can vary from zero percent to market rate based on each community's economic index. Loans utilizing EPA grant funds can include a principal forgiveness component.

"Community investments in our drinking water and wastewater systems are vital to maintaining environmental and public health," Martineau said. "These loans will help keep our communities moving forward, and the principal forgiveness provisions help local communities accomplish this work in

difficult economic times."

The Department of Environment and Conservation administers the SRF Loan Program for the state of Tennessee in conjunction with the Tennessee Local Development Authority. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency provides grants to fund the program, and the state provides a 20 percent match. Loan repayments are returned to the program and are used to fund future SRF loans.

The funding order of projects is determined by the SRF Loan Program's Priority Ranking Lists that rank potential projects according to the severity of their pollution and/or compliance problems or for the protection of public health.

City of Lenoir City (Loudon County) -- The City of Lenoir City will receive \$1,833,160 for an Infiltration & Inflow Correction project (Phase I-SS&S and Phase II Collection System Rehabilitation). This loan will be funded for a 20-year term with an interest rate of 1.33%.

Since its inception in 1987, Tennessee's Clean Water State Revolving Fund Loan Program has awarded more than \$1.6 billion in low-interest loans. Since its inception in 1996, Tennessee's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan Pro-

gram has awarded more than \$258 million in low-interest loans. Both programs combined award more than \$90 million annually to Tennessee's local governments for water and wastewater infrastructure projects.

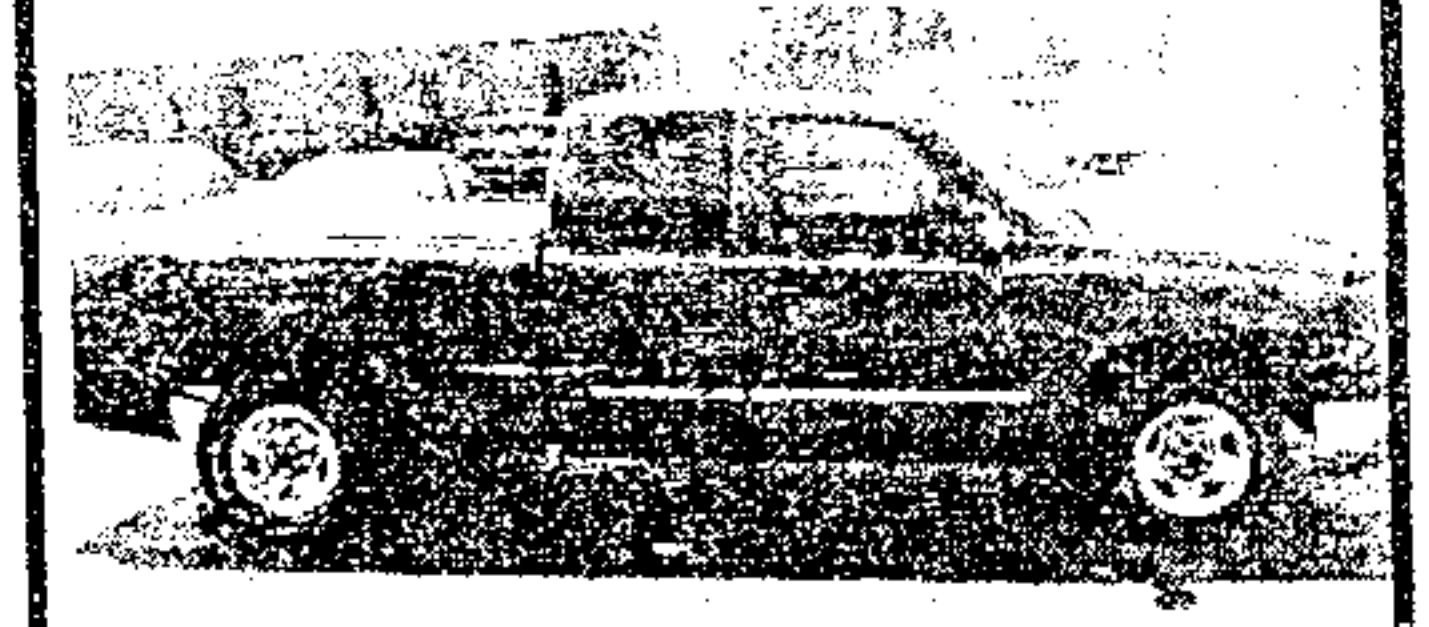

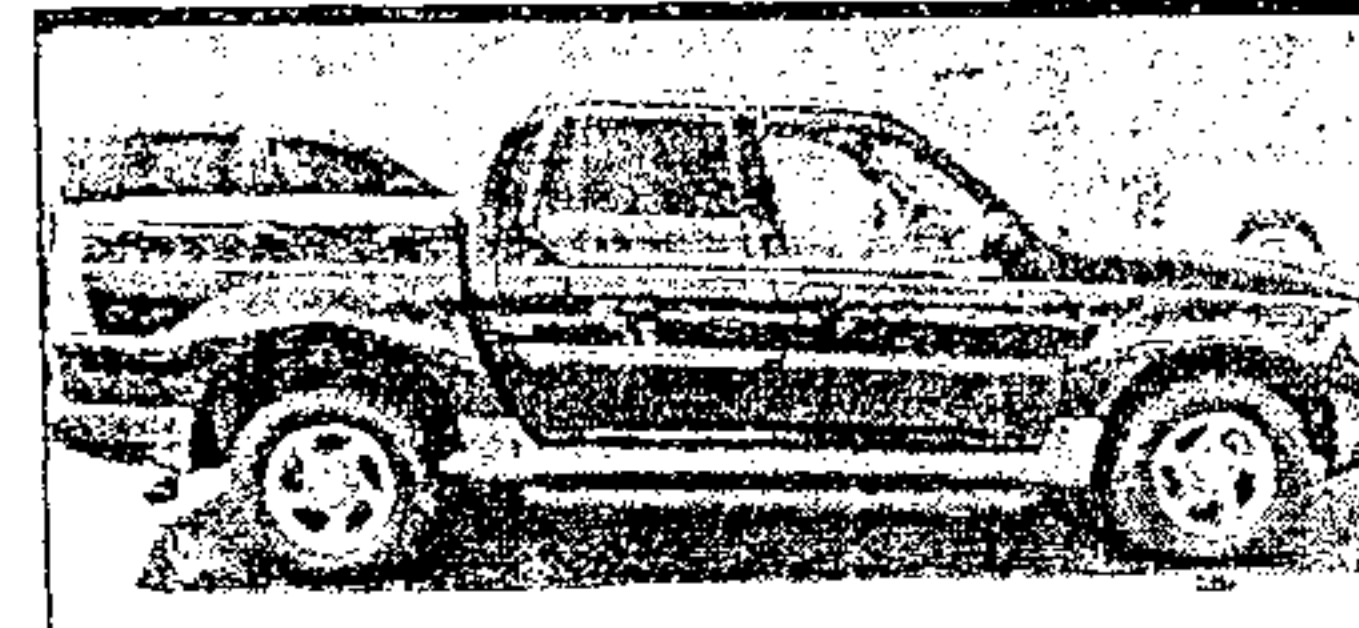

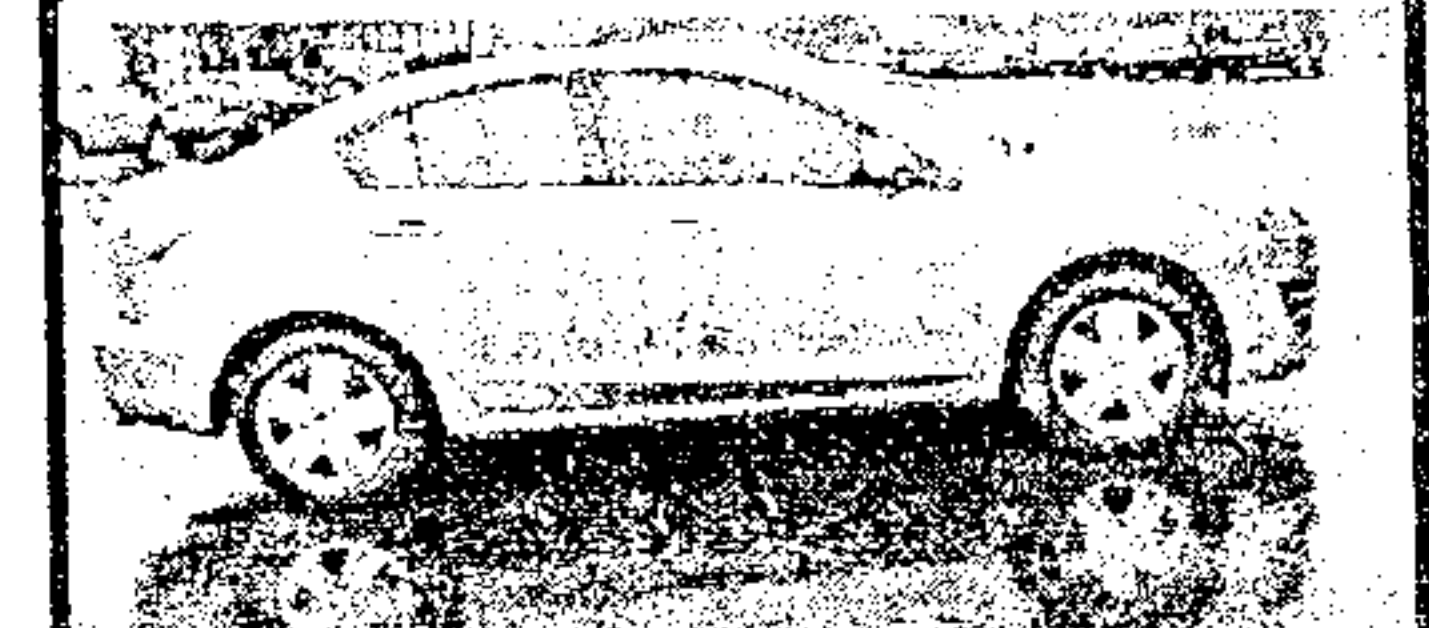
