live their lives. The first was a description of the kind of person who does not know Christ and is at great risk of spending eternity separated from Jesus. The second description is that of someone who has truly



James McWilliams, 56, Huntsville Hollow Road Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession and Driving on Revoked License.


According to the report, Deputy Fritts observed a Black Ford F-150 traveling on Johnson Drive. The driver of the vehicle was not wearing his seat belt.
