

detectable amount of cocaine, also a Schedule II controlled substance. Lastly, Washington is charged with possession with the intent to distribute oxycodone.

Washington faces a mandatory minimum of 15 years in prison if convicted of either trafficking charge. Both narcotics charges carry a statutory maximum of 20 years in prison.

This case was investigated by the FBI. The Knox County Sheriff's Office and Knox

County Attorney General's Office provided significant support in this investigation. The case is being prosecuted by Trial Attorney Nicholas Durham of the Civil Rights Division's Criminal Section and Assistant U.S. Attorney Brooklyn Sawyers of the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Tennessee.

Members of the public are reminded that these are only charges and that every person is presumed innocent until their guilt has been proven beyond a reasonable doubt.
