

Deputy Brandon Burley, did respond to Old Stage Road at Dixon Road where Deputy Fagiana had a 1994 Buick sedan, stopped for failure to maintain lane.

Deputy Fagiana did observe the vehicle leave its lane of travel on multiple occasion after being stopped in the roadway in a residential area late at night. Randall Richesin, 32, Murrys Chapel Road Sweetwater, was charged with Poss. of a Handgun while Under the Influence, Public Intoxication, Poss. of Drug Para., False report/statement, and Reckless Endangerment.

Deputy Burley, received a dispatched call of a possible aggravated burglary in progress at Ten Mile Road in Sweetwater, Tennessee (Loudon County). When Deputy arrived on scene, he observed a male white on Ten Mile Road about 500 yards from the house with a flashlight and a gun in the middle of the road running. Deputy detained the subject with a gun and identified him as Randall Lynn Richesin II. The firearm used is a "O.F. Mossberg & Sons" 22 long rifle which had (1) round in the chamber and (10) in the rifle. This rifle does not have a serial number because it was produced prior to the National Firearms Act. Richesin II while running with this firearm, under the influence, which did not have a safety and a round in the chamber was jepordizing the lives and safety of all persons in his vacinity. This reckless behavior was not protect property which he had already left from, to continue a fictional

burgarlar, but was a paranoid dillusion that placed others in imminent danger of death or serious bodily injury. This did occur in Loudon County, Tn.

Richesin II stated he had just drove to Blue Bird Lane Sweetwater, Tennessee (Monroe County) and shot that rifle at an occupied dwelling that contained his girlfriend, additionally another male were present at the residence. Richesin II had then returned to his residence of Murrays Chapel Road when he believed that, one male, was attempting to break into Ten Mile Road (an unoccupied dwelling). Richesin II still having possession of the firearm from the previous felony on Blue Bird Lane, again left his residence in attempt to locate the male. Richesin II

Jill Johnson, 52, Golf Club Lane Lenoir City, was charged with DUI.



stances Lopez-Perez was arrest for driving under the influence 1st offense. It was during this time that Loudon County E911 also advised that Lopez-Perez does not have a drivers license, which he (Lopez-Perez) confirmed. After being taken to the Loudon County Jail, Lopez-Perez was read both English and Spanish Tennessee Implied Consent and refused to provide a sample and signed the form as such. Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, made the arrest.

amphetamine becomes extremely paranoid. Richesin II left his property with the intent to have an assaultive and possibly fatal encounter with the male at Ten Mile Road and Richesin II brought the afore mentioned firearm with him to do so. This encounter was a result of a paranoid retaliation from Richesin II against then male. Richesin II contacted Loudon County law enforcement for a burglary in progress which was not occuring. Richesin II, had no knowledge of any possible burglary in addition Richesin II stated that while under the influence of methamphetamine he becomes paranoid. extremely

The residence that Richesin II believed was being burglarized was not his residence nor does anyone live at that residence. There was no evidence that the residence in question had anybody attempt to make entry into the home, except law enforcement.

Richesin II knew the report of a possible burglary to be false, as Richesin II admit after being mirandized while at the Loudon County Jail by causing the Loudon County Sheriffs Office to take action and deal with a false emergency. Richesin II also placed the neighbors, including the great aunt of Richesin II, a Aileen Cody, to be in immediate fear for her life and safety in addition to placing

all responding law enforcement officers in fear for their lives and safety. Richesin II was a danger to other persons and property as he while under the influence; left his residence with a firearm with the intent to go armed and locate the male and have an assaultive confrontation with the male. Richesin II was a danger not only to the male, but to all other persons in the immediate vicinity. Richesin II was subsequently arrested for possession of a firearm during an armed dangerous felony, false reports and public intoxication. A search incident to arrest revealed two cellophane containers and one pack of rolling papers. Richesin II stated

he keeps his xanax and methamphetine in the two cellophane containers and Richesin II uses the rolling papers to smoke marijuana.

Each of the two cellophane containers had a powered residue which Richesin II stated would be residue from his narcotics. Richesin II was previously convicted of simple possession.

Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, made the arrest.
