and water, stormwater control and aesthetic values to our communities."

U&CF funds support all other urban forestry related projects. Projects that address ordinances, inventory and management planning, advisory organization and staffing of an urban or community forestry program will be given priority. Other projects for education, training, printed materials, and travel to state and national urban forestry conferences are also accepted. Local governments, private non-profit organizations and educational institutions

are eligible to apply.

The Division of Forestry will also accept proposals to fund urban forestry staff positions. If accepted, the agreement will be for three years on a sliding scale and dependent on available funds from the USDA Forest Service.

An information packet is available on request. The packet includes additional details on the grant programs, the types of projects accepted, application forms and proposal instructions.

Proposals must be received in the Nashville office of the Division of Forestry by 4:30

p.m. on Friday, June 19, 2015.



## WATER SYSTEM FLUSHING PROGRAM

The Lenoir City Utilities Board and Lenoir City Fire Department will be conducting our semi-annual water distribution system wide flushing program per Tennessee Department of Environment & Conservation Water Quality Control Requirements. The Flushing Program will occur for LCUB customers on Monday, June 1, 2015, at 2:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. thru Thursday, June 4, 2015, at 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. The program goals are to identify problems in the water system and ultimately have them corrected. When fire hydrants are flowed, iron deposits in the water lines are agitated. This may cause a brown discoloration to the water in the area which is being flushed. This condition is only temporary and will normally correct itself in a number of hours. During this period of flushing, we recommend that you flow your cold water prior to use to determine if there is any discoloration. While the water is still safe to consume, we recommend not washing any white clothes without first testing the water for discoloration. If your water is discolored, it will clear up on its own under normal usage over a period of time. It is also best to limit the use of your hot water until it's clear, as this will keep the iron deposits from going into your water heater. You may also notice a drop in water pressure during these times; however, the water pressure should return to normal within a short period of time. If you continue to experience difficulty with your water pressure or discoloration on Monday, June 8, 2015, please contact LCUB at (865) 986-6591 to report the problem.

As for Etan Patz the little boy whose name and face have become synonymous with this issue—he has never been found. But as a result of law enforcement efforts and the public's assistance, other youngsters have been safely recovered and returned to their families, or at the very least, their families have been given some degree of closure.

And we will continue to look for these children-seeking justice for them and for their families—no matter how long it takes. Despite the fact that the court proceedings of a suspect believed responsible for Etan Patz's disappearance nearly 36 years ago ended in a mistrial earlier this month, prosecutors have announced they will retry the case.

William Allen, 18, W Farrell Street Niota, was charged with DUI.

Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, did observe a 1999 Ford Taurus, traveling on Martel Road at a high rate of speed. Deputy also observe the afore listed vehicle leave its appropriate travel lane on multiple occasions for extended periods of time.

Allen was asked to and agreed to perform standardized field sobriety tasks: all of which he did poorly on. Allen when asked if he felt as though he was impaired stated that he felt "slightly impaired".

Located in Allen's vehicle was a small

amount (less than 10 grams) of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana, from which Allen had just been smoking.

Given that Allen is over the age of 16 and under the age of 21 and was driving and in physical control of an automobile while under the influence of marijuana and this caused such a degree of impairment that it directly affected Allen's driving ability,

Allen was placed under arrest for Underage Driving While Impaired and read the "Tennessee Implied Consent Advisement" form to which he (Allen) agreed to and signed as such. Allen was transported to the Ft. Loudon E.R.

for a blood draw; immediately following the blood draw Allen was transported to the Loudon County jail. Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, made the arrest.







