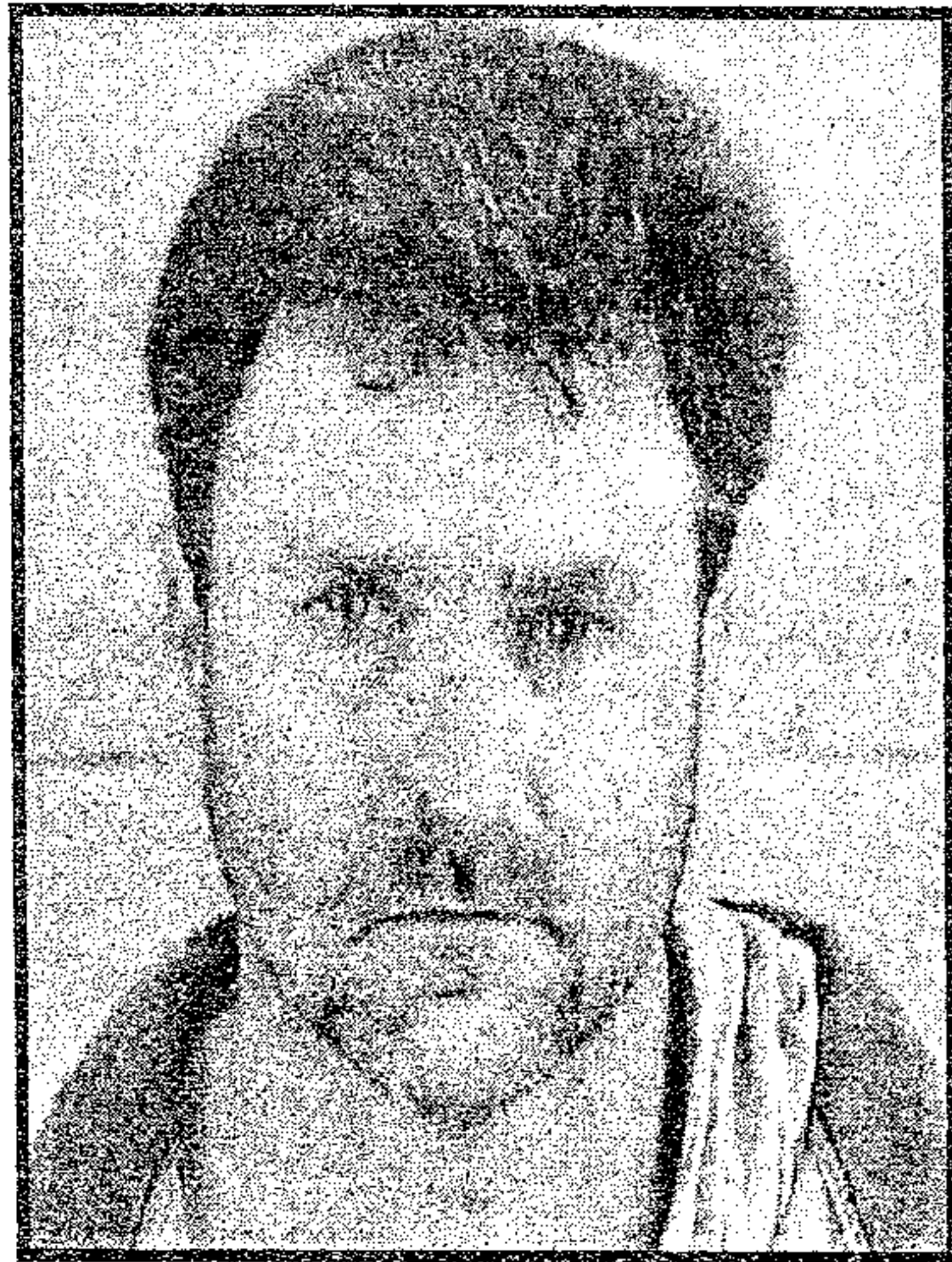

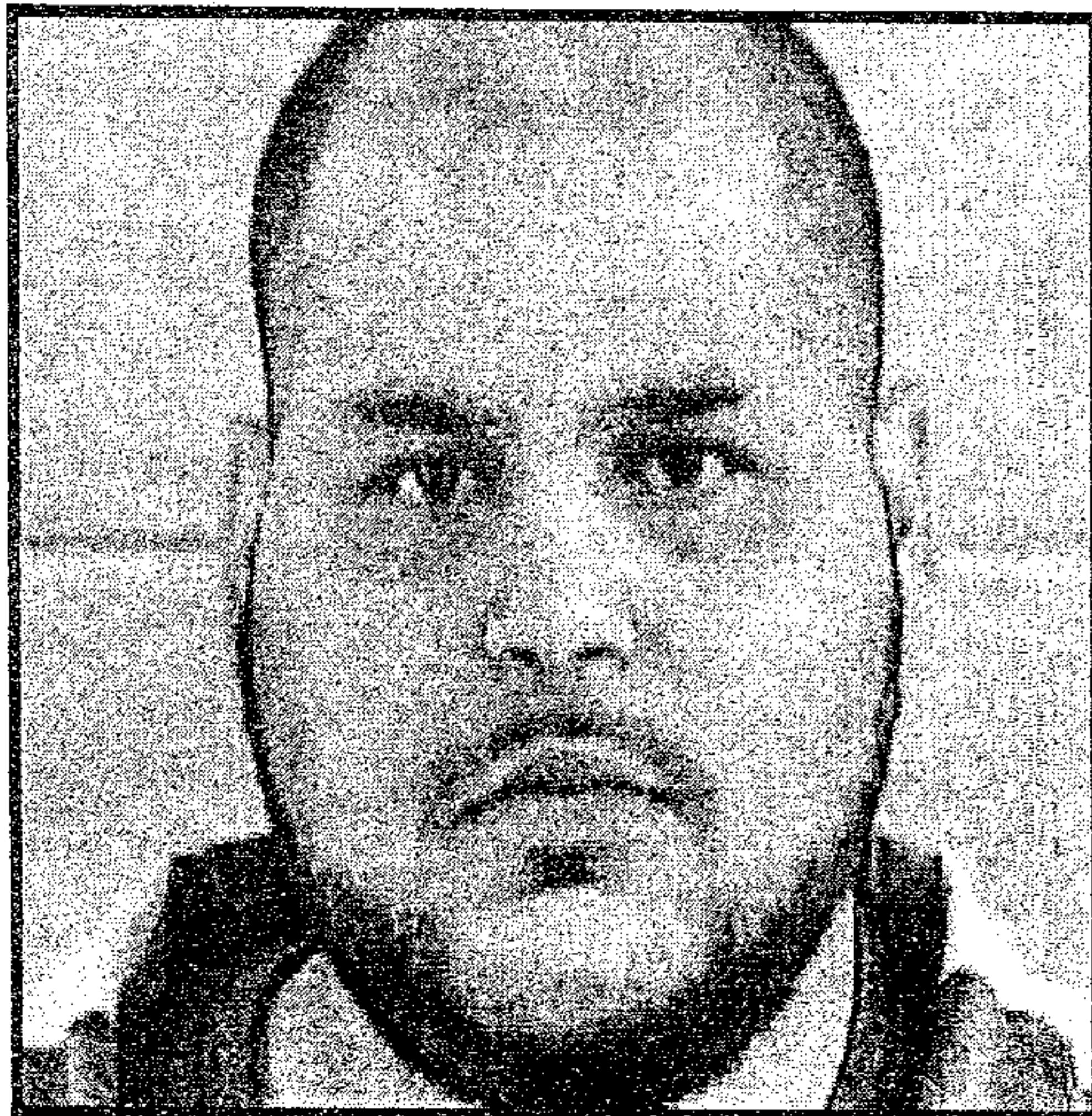

Richard Queen, 43, Tinnell Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Public Intoxication, Simple possession, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Sgt. Jerramie Bowen was dispatched to the Red Top Market located at 2112 Highway 11 East. To the report of a white male attempting to sale pills to a customer and possibly intoxicated. They described the individual as a white male with a black shirt with the words "Snake Bite" on the front of the shirt. Upon my arrival Deputy came in contact with the above named defendant identified as a Mr. Richard Queen. He was about to fall out of the seat and trying to put money in his sock.

Deputy addressed the defendant and upon making eye contact the defendant had very glassy eyes, slurred speech, and very incoherent. Deputy then spoke with a clerk and she stated that he had offered to sale the complainant multiple drugs. He then stated that he would trade them for weed.

Deputy then asked the defendant to step outside the business and asked him if he had any items that would poke or stick me. As the clerk had pointed out a needle that the defendant dropped under his

person while seated in the store. Deputy then searched the subject where he found a pill bottle with 51 Clonazepam 2 mg pills in it. These pills were filled on 04/29/2015 prescribed to be taken 1 pill three times a day. He was filled 90 pills on this 04/29/2015.

Also a small metal tin was found in his right front pocket. In this tin was 4 small white pills with TEVA 834 inscribed on them in a small plastic bag. In his left front pocket was a pipe used to smoke marijuana along with a small black plastic container containing a small amount of a leafy green substance believed to be marijuana.

Due to the individual being to his level of intoxication he would be a danger to himself and the public if left. He was

then advised he was being placed under arrest for public intoxication, drug paraphernalia, and simple possession. He was then transported to the Loudon County Correction Facility.

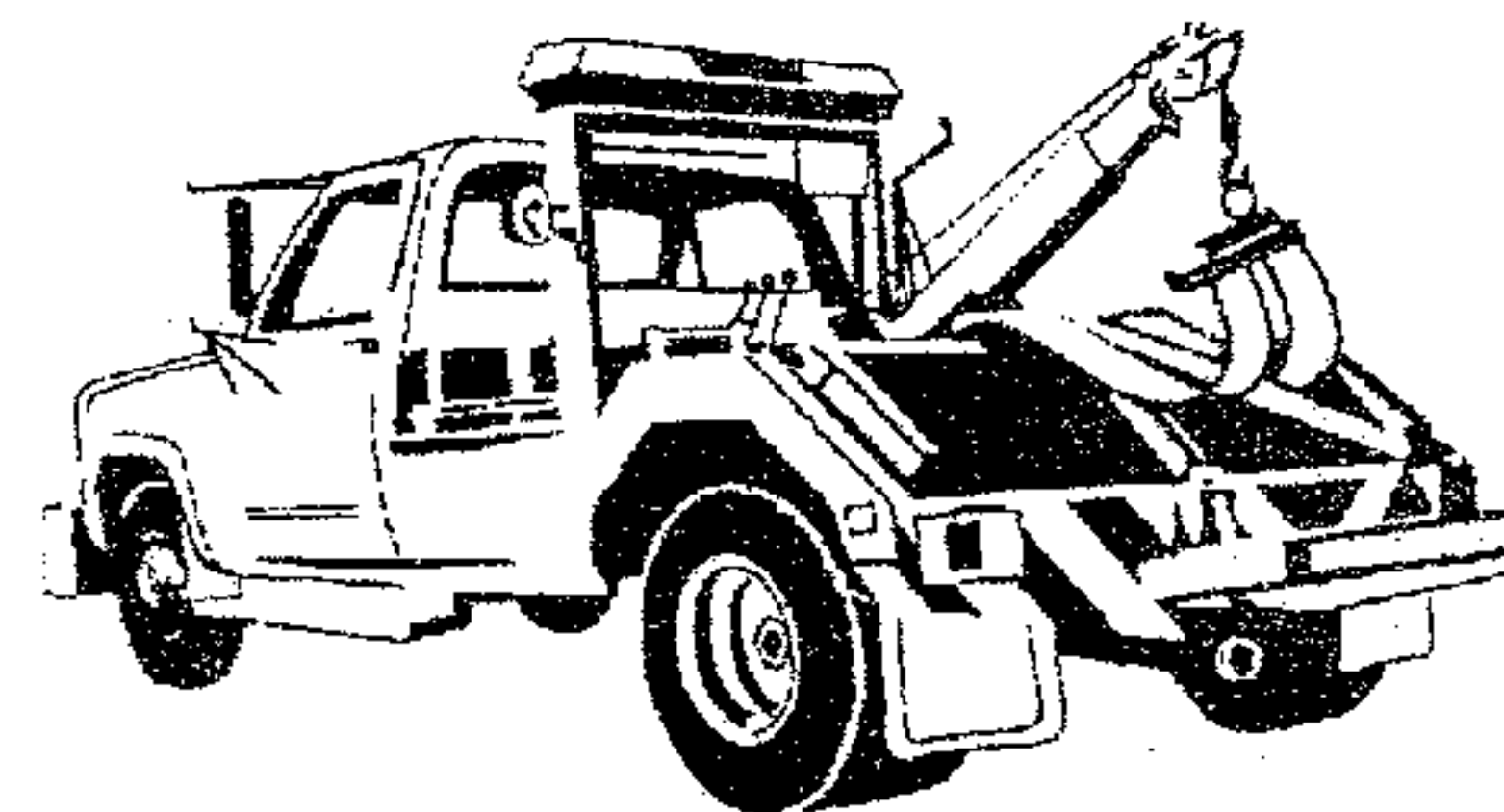

with a taser to comply. He then had to be assisted into the car.

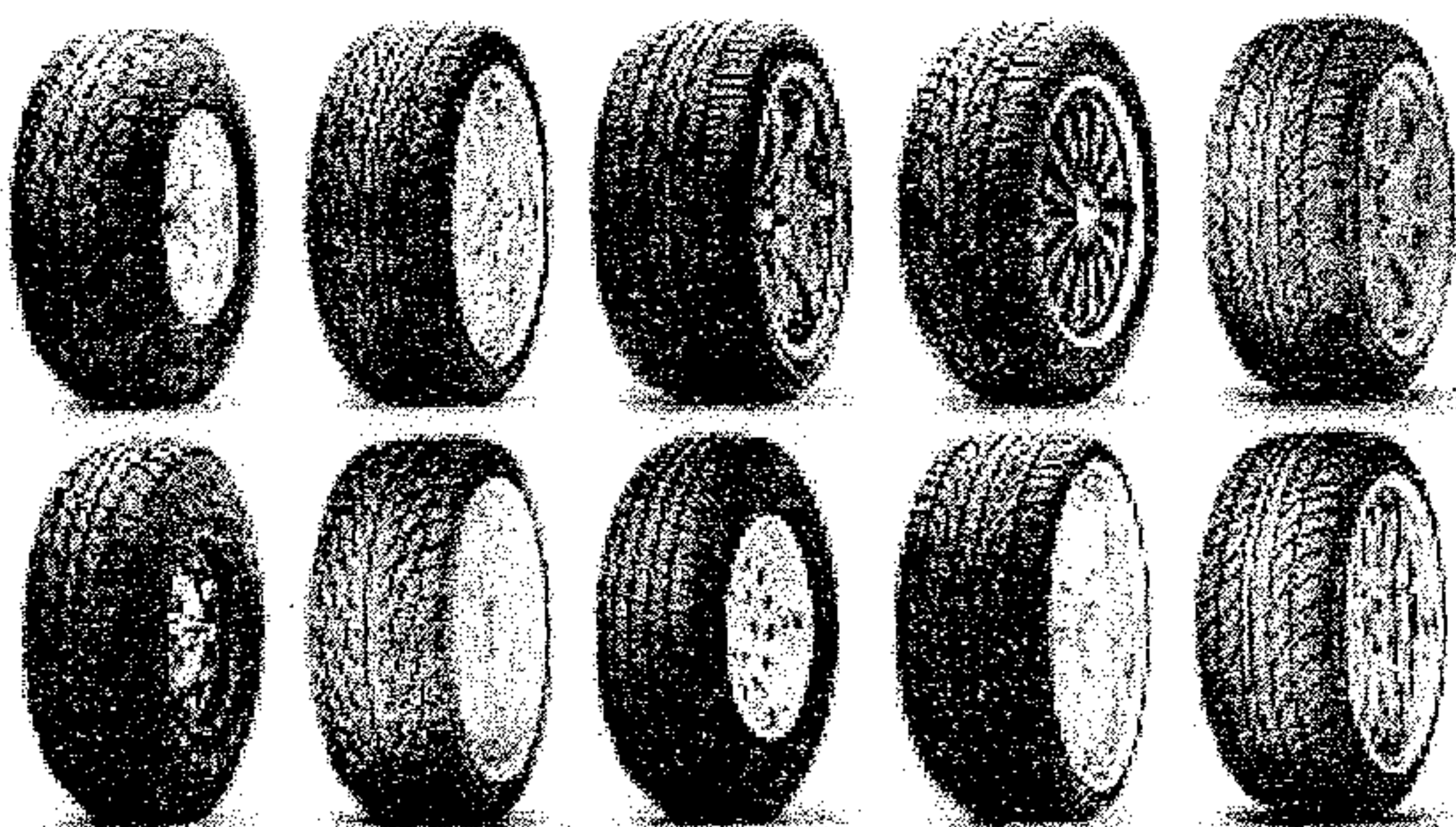
