GEORGIAN DELEGATION VISITS EASTERN DISTRICT OF TENN.

During June 10-20, 2015, a group of official delegates from the Republic of Georgia will visit the United States to learn about the U.S. criminal justice system and enhance their efforts to modernize their justice sector/system. The visit will begin in Washington, DC, where the delegates will meet with various representatives from the State Department, Pretrial Services for the District of Columbia, Bureau of Prisons, and Department of Justice (DOJ). After their

short stay in Washington the group will travel to Chattanooga, Tenn., where they will be hosted by the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Tennessee.

During their visit, the delegates will study how the probation/pretrial services system operates in federal court. The week will include meetings in both Chattanooga and Knoxville with the U.S. Attorney; Assistant U.S. Attorneys; U.S. Probation Officers; U.S. District and Magistrate Judges; local

FBI Safe Online Surfing Internet Challenge Cyber Safety for Young Americans

In April, the Pew Research Center published a study saying that 92 percent of teens report going online daily—including 24 percent who say they go online "almost constantly." According to the study, nearly three-fourths of teens have or use a smartphone.

Considering the many dangers that lurk on the Internet—from child predators to cyber bullies, from malicious software to a multitude of scams—it's imperative that our young people learn the ins and outs of online safety from

an early age.

That is precisely why the Bureau launched the FBI Safe Online Surfing (SOS) Internet Challenge in October 2012 with a dedicated new website. FBI-SOS is a free, fun, and informative program that promotes cyber citizenship by educating students in third to eighth grades on the essentials of online security. For teachers, the site provides a ready-made curriculum that meets state and federal Internet safety mandates complete with online testing

defense attorneys; and federal, state and local law enforcement representatives. They will also attend court hearings to observe typical proceedings in federal court. Additionally, to ensure they experience the local culture, several leisure activities are also planned throughout the week for the delegates including a baseball game, cookout, and concerts at the annual Chattanooga Riverbend Festival.

The Georgian delegates participating in this U.S. visit include: Tamar Alania, Judge, Tbilisi Court of Appeals; Shalva Tadamadze, Parliamentary Secretary, GoG Administration; Archil Taklavadze, Deputy Minister of Internal Affairs; Kakha Kakhashvili, Deputy Minister of Corrections and Legal Assistance; Giorgi Arsoshvili, Head of Probation Service, MCLA; Giorgi Gabitashvili, Deputy Chief Prosecutor; Misha Shakulashvili,

Tbilisi Chief Prosecutor; Nino Aglemashvili, Prosecutor, PGO; Irina Tsakadze, Head of Legal Drafting Department, MOJ; Archil Kbilashvili, Chairman, NGO European Choice of Georgia; Kakha Tsereteli, Defense Attorney, BLC Law Office; and Natia Oniani, Translator. The delegation will be accompanied by Tracey Newell, the Director of the State Department's Bureau of International Narcotics and Law Enforcement at the U.S. Embassy in Tbilisi, Georgia, and by Tatiana Pataria and Nata Tsnorishvili, Georgian Staff Attorneys at the U.S. Embassy who work with DOJ's Office of Overseas Prosecutorial Development, Assistance and Training (OPDAT) Resident Legal Advisor (RLA) program in Georgia.

For the last two years, Assistant U.S. Attorney (AUSA) Steve Neff, a federal prosecu-


tor with the Chattanooga office, was detailed as OPDAT's RLA in Tbilisi, Georgia. While on detail in Tbilisi, AUSA Neff worked closely with Georgian government officials as well as the Georgian legal and law enforcement community, including Justice Ministry officials, prosecutors, judges, investigators, and members of parliament, to develop and implement justice sector assistance programming aimed at modernizing Georgia's

criminal justice system. The current visit of these delegates to the United States is a continuation of those efforts.





Jeremiah Bivens, 18, Valley Drive Loudon, was charged with Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor, Simple Poss., and Poss. of Drug Para.

Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, did observe a vehicle traveling on Watkins road approaching Hwy 72, the vehicle did not stop at the stop sign and continued on Hwy 72 towards Loudon City. Deputy

did initiate a traffic stop on the vehicle on Hwy 72 near Steekee School road, and did identify the driver and sole occupant as Jeremias Bivens. Bivens did appear very nervous and fidgety, and his statements on his whereabouts were erratic. Deputy did notice in the vehicle that there was empty cigar wrappers, as well as a bottle full of the tobacco from a cigar. Bivens also had bloodshot watery eyes

and along with the fidgetiness, Deputy did ask if he had smoked marijuana to which he stated he had. Deputy asked if there was anything illegal in his vehicle to which he became very distraught and stated that he believed there was. Deputy asked Bivens to step out of the vehicle and upon exit he was seen trying to conceal a small baggie with marijuana shake in it between his

seat and the center console. Deputy did deploy my K9 partner Dante to sniff the vehicle and he did alert. Inside the vehicle was found marijuana, two bongos, two marijuana bowls, and a grinder. Upon further speaking with Bivens it was learned that his girlfriend, a 15 yo female lives on Simpson road, and that he was coming from her residence where he had taken the marijuana for

her and him to smoke. A follow up at the residence confirmed that Bivens had in fact met the female with parental knowledge and that also he provided marijuana to the juvenile. Bivens was arrested and transported to the Loudon County Jail. Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, made the arrest.

and a national competition to encourage learning and participation. A secure online system enables teachers to register their schools, manage their classes, automatically grade their students' exams, and request the test scores.

FBI-SOS just finished its third school year, with record results. A total of 275,656 students completed the exams—more than triple the previous year. The competition included 5,053 schools in 49 states, D.C., Puerto Rico, and the Northern Mariana Islands.

The popularity of our SOS online cyber program has grown over the past several school years. The number of students who have completed the training went from 24,475 in 2012-2013, to 75,377 in 2013-2014, to 275,656 in 2014-2015. That's a grand total of 375,508 students.

"We couldn't be more pleased with how teachers and students are responding to the program and how participation is growing in such leaps and bounds," said Scott McMillion of the FBI Criminal Investigative Division's Violent Crimes Against Children Section, which runs the program in concert with our Office of Public Affairs and field offices nationwide. "FBI-SOS is helping to turn our nation's young people into a more cyber savvy generation and to protect them from online crime now and in the future."

The FBI-SOS website features six islands—one for each grade level—with age appropriate games, videos, and other interactive materials in various portions.

tals. The site covers such topics as cell phone safety, the protection of personal information, password strength, instant messaging, social networking, and online gaming safety. The videos include real-life stories of kids who have faced cyber bullies and online predators.

After navigating through the appropriate island, students take a timed quiz. The test scores for each school are aggregated by the FBI and appear on a national leaderboard on the website each month from September through May. Schools compete in one of three categories, determined by the number of students participating: Starfish (5-50 participants); Stingray (51-100); and Shark (100+). The top-scoring school in each category at the end of the month receives a national FBI-SOS

award. When possible, the winning schools are visited by representatives of their local FBI field office.

Anyone—young or old, in the U.S. or worldwide—can complete the activities on the FBI-SOS website. The testing and competition, however, are only open to students in grades 3-8 at public, private, or home schools in the U.S. or its territories.

We'd like to congratulate the 26 schools that won the competition this past year and thank the many teachers and students who participated. We hope you will join us again in September.
