DISTRICT ATTORNEYS IMPROVE FINANCIAL OPERATIONS

Comptroller's Review of Tennessee's Judicial Districts Detailed in Funds Report

The Tennessee District Attorneys General Conference achieved one of its best financial operations for fiscal year 2014 as noted in the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury's recently released annual Review of Funds report. The greatest improvement was in administrative practices of Judicial District Drug Task Forces.

"This is one of the best annual reports we have issued on Tennessee's Judicial Districts," Com-

troller Justin P. Wilsor said. "I would like to compliment the District Attorneys General Conference for its efforts to improve financial operations by offering training and education on these important issues."

Auditors listed only three findings and recommendations on the report compared to 20 findings in FY 2012. Judicial District Drug Task Forces operate in 26 of the 31 judicial districts. The operations of the offices of the

raw marijuana. Deputy did ask the driver to exit the vehicle and asked if there was anything in the vehicle and he stated that he did not have anything on him.

Deputy then asked Mr. Baker if he had anything on his person and he did state that he had two more bags in his pants. both bags were retrieved and total weight is approx. 3 oz of a green leafy substance.

Also inside the gray bag were scales along with bags and a grinder. Deputy did take Mr. Baker into custody for Possession of Marijuana for resale.

Deputy then transported him to the Loudon County Jail. The driver did check ok and was released. This did occur in Loudon County.

Sgt. Jerramie Bowen LCSO, made the arrest.

9th DTF

District Attorneys General and the Judicial District Drug Task Forces are audited annually by the Comptroller's Office.

"As prosecutors we are the keepers of public trust," said District Attorney General Russell Johnson of the 9th Judicial District, which covers Roane, Loudon, Morgan and Meigs Counties. "A key indicator of how we respect that trust is how we use public funds. This report shows our efforts and ongoing training events are paying off."

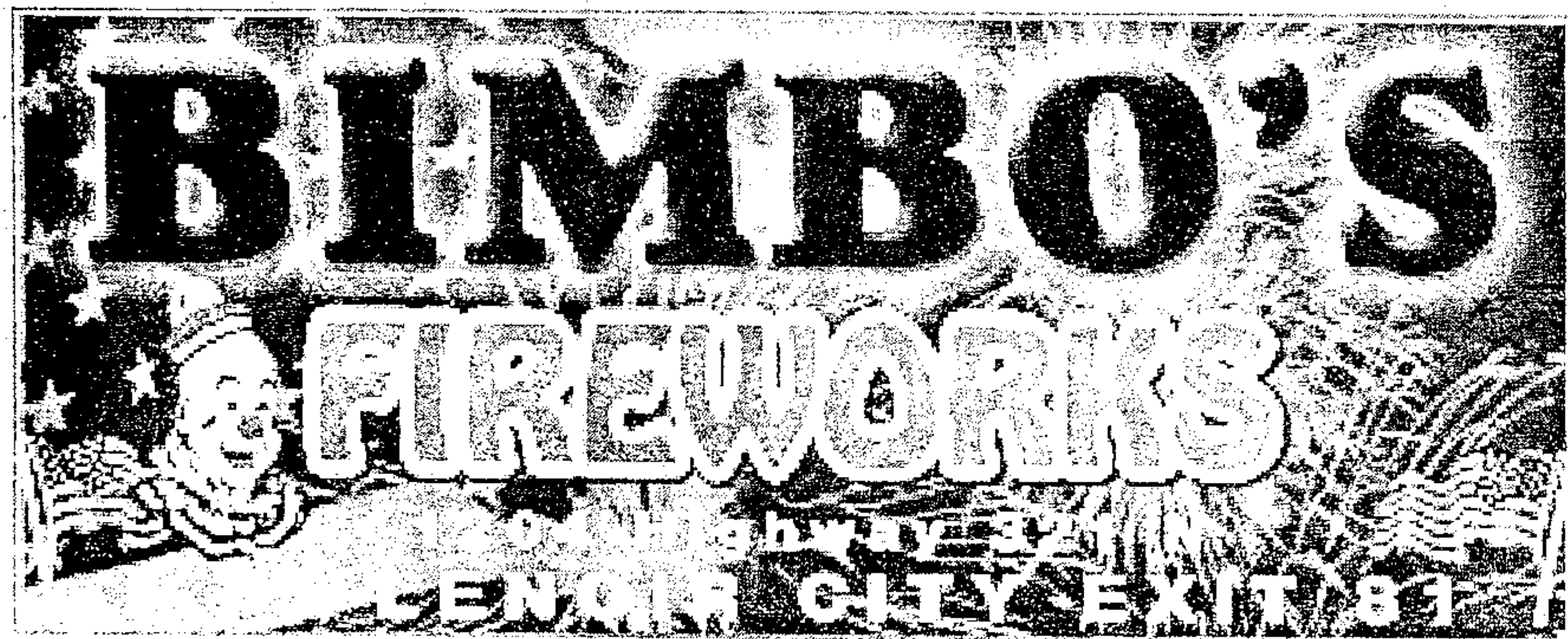
The 9th District Drug Task Force has not had an audit finding since Johnson took over as district attorney general September 1, 2006. "We are fortunate to have good people working in our DTF," Johnson said. The DTF did have findings under the prior administration for missing funds of over \$1,000 that were never recovered and for which the responsible agent was never prosecuted, "so I have worked hard to maintain administrative oversight and integrity," claimed Johnson.

The 9th DTF has been successful over the years in a number of major drug interdiction cases that have had multi-state connections and that have resulted in larger scale federal prosecutions including cocaine trafficking, methamphetamine, crystal meth and drugs with guns involved.

"The conference is dedicated to a fair and transparent criminal justice system which includes sound administrative practices of drug task forces. We are firmly committed to this effort," said William C. Whitesell, Jr, Executive Director of the Tennessee District Attorneys General Conference.
