Doggart has been charged with one count of soliciting others to violate federal civil rights laws by intentionally defacing, damaging or destroying any religious property, because of the religious character of that property, or attempting to do so. If convicted, the defendant faces a maximum penalty of 10 years in prison.

This case is being investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. It is being prosecuted by Civil Rights Division Trial Attorney Saeed Mody and Assistant U.S. Attorneys Perry H. Piper and Chris Poole of the Eastern District of Tennessee.

An indictment is merely an accusation, and the defendant is presumed innocent unless proven guilty.



Axley's Chapel Road.





Jeffrey Fields, 20, Merle Lane Knoxville, was charged with Underage DUL.

Deputy Kenneth Palmer LCSO, observed a 2013 Toyota Scion Silver, on Highway 321 near City Park Drive traveling the wrong way on the roadway. Deputy Burley, did respond to the location and make contact with the driver, Jeffrey Norman Field, who appeared to be somewhat confused and disheveled. Kerry Raper, 20, Rusty Way Maryville, ly the Deputy did make was charged with Underage Consumption, Public Intoxication, and Disorderly Conduct.

Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, did receive a dispatched call of a white male with no shirt walking in the area of Tennessee Avenue and highway 95 in town of Greenback yelling and screaming so loudly it could be heard blocks away.

This is a residential area and the subject had woke up multiple residents of the community causing them unnecessary duress and alarm. While attempting to locate this subject Deputy did make contact with two more individuals

who were frightened and alarmed by this male subject. Eventualcontact with the subject, who was shirtless, had blood covering his hands and arms and was screaming on Craigs Chapel Road near Highway 95 North.

Deputy was able to identify the male as Kerry Raper (age 20), who had red / watery bloodshot eyes, slurred speech and a strong odor of alcoholic beverage upon his breath.

Raper stated he had consumed "a fifth of whiskey" and was returning from a friends residence at Morganton Road in Greenback. Raper stated the blood on his person came from trying to cross multiple fields that had electrified fences. Raper was a clear danger to himself and others, given the blood on his fists and his inability to control himself while under the influence. Raper, who is under the age of 21 did consume alcohol illegal and did cause an unnecessary duress and alarm in a residential area where people were sleeping. Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, made the arrest.
