Tennesseans Invited to Comment on Charging to Inspect Public Records

The Office of Open Records Counsel (OORC) has been asked by the Tennessee General Assembly to review issues surrounding the inspection of public records, and the office is asking Tennesseans to weigh in.

Legislation was introduced in the 2015 Session of the 109th General Assembly that would permit charges for inspecting public records. While a records

custodian is permitted to charge for copies of public records, inspection is generally free of charge. The OORC will prepare a report with recommendations on this issue to the General Assembly by January 15, 2016.

The OORC has prepared brief online surveys to help gather input from citizens and government entities. The responses from these surveys will help

Yobany Saucedo, 30, Midway Road Lenoir City, was charged with Driving without a valid License.

Deputy Ronnie Reagan LCSO, observed a blue ford Ranger Pickup truck traveling in toward Lenoir City from Loudon driving off the right shoulder of the roadway it was obvious that the driver

was having difficulty keeping the vehicle in his travel lane. Deputy initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle at the intersection of South Hill Avenue and Broadway. Deputy approached the driver and found him to be an Hispanic Male whom Deputy was able to identify as Yobani Adan Herrera Saucedo. Mr Saucedo was not able to produce a valid drivers li-

cense. Mr Saucedo had also been consuming intoxicating beverages. Deputy attempted field sobriety testing but due to a language barrier and not having a spanish speaking officer available at the time Deputy was not able to successfully administer them. with the driver of the Cougar, later identified as Randi Thibault.

Officer Yates asked the passenger of the Jetta twice if they knew Ms. Thibault. He didn't acknowledge the first time only to state "no" on second inquiry. Yates noticed the occupants of the Jetta were paying particular attention to his interaction with Ms. Thibault, so much so that they forgot to pump fuel into their vehicle while they were parked at the pumps.

Officer Yates directed his attention to Ms. Thibault who was slow and lethargic to answering questions. He asked for a driver's license which she couldn't find. She thought it might have been in the trunk and opened it. Yates moved in close to look in the trunk and she immediately closed it. She gave him her name and date of birth. I checked her license status through dispatch and a return found them

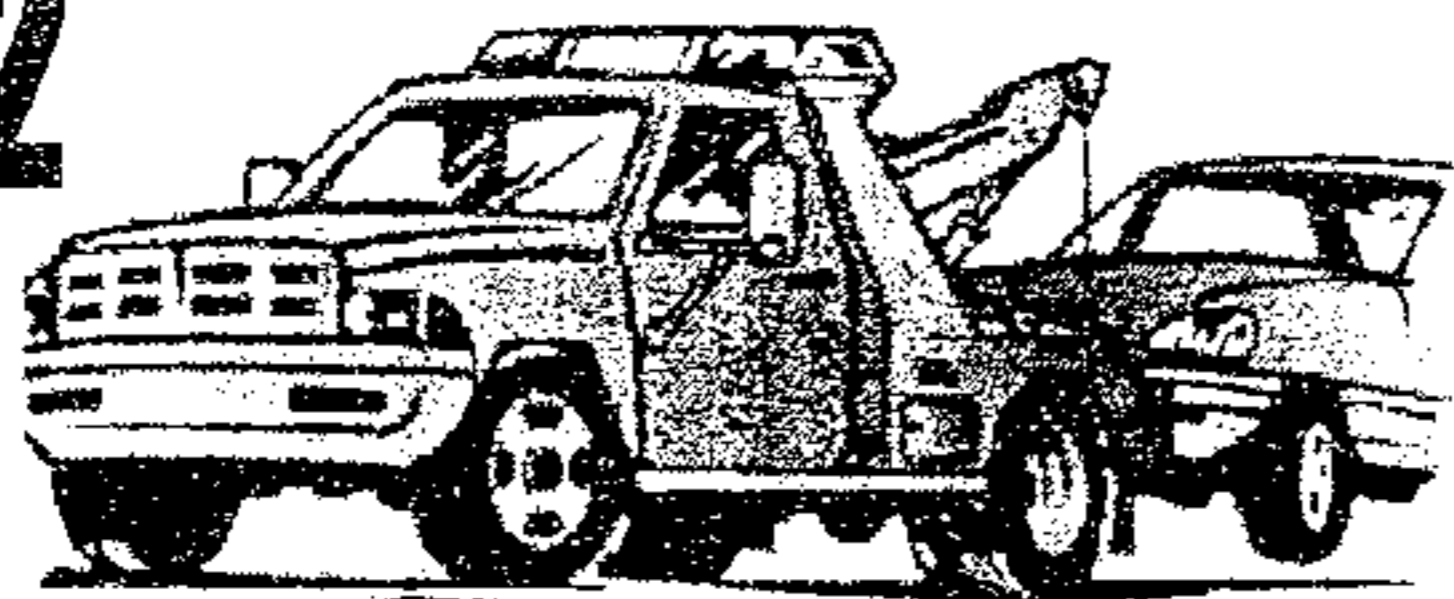

suspended for failure to provide insurance.

Officer Bennie Houser was then asked to conduct Field Sobriety Tests on Ms. Thibault. During these tests Officer Yates noticed the Jetta had moved to parking spaces in front of the store and that the driver was still con-

tinuing to pay close attention to their actions. Officer Yates again asked Ms. Thibault if she knew the men in the Jetta and she stated that she knew one of them. Suspicions continued to raise, so Officer Yates approached the men and they again denied knowing the female. They then both got into the Jetta and moved

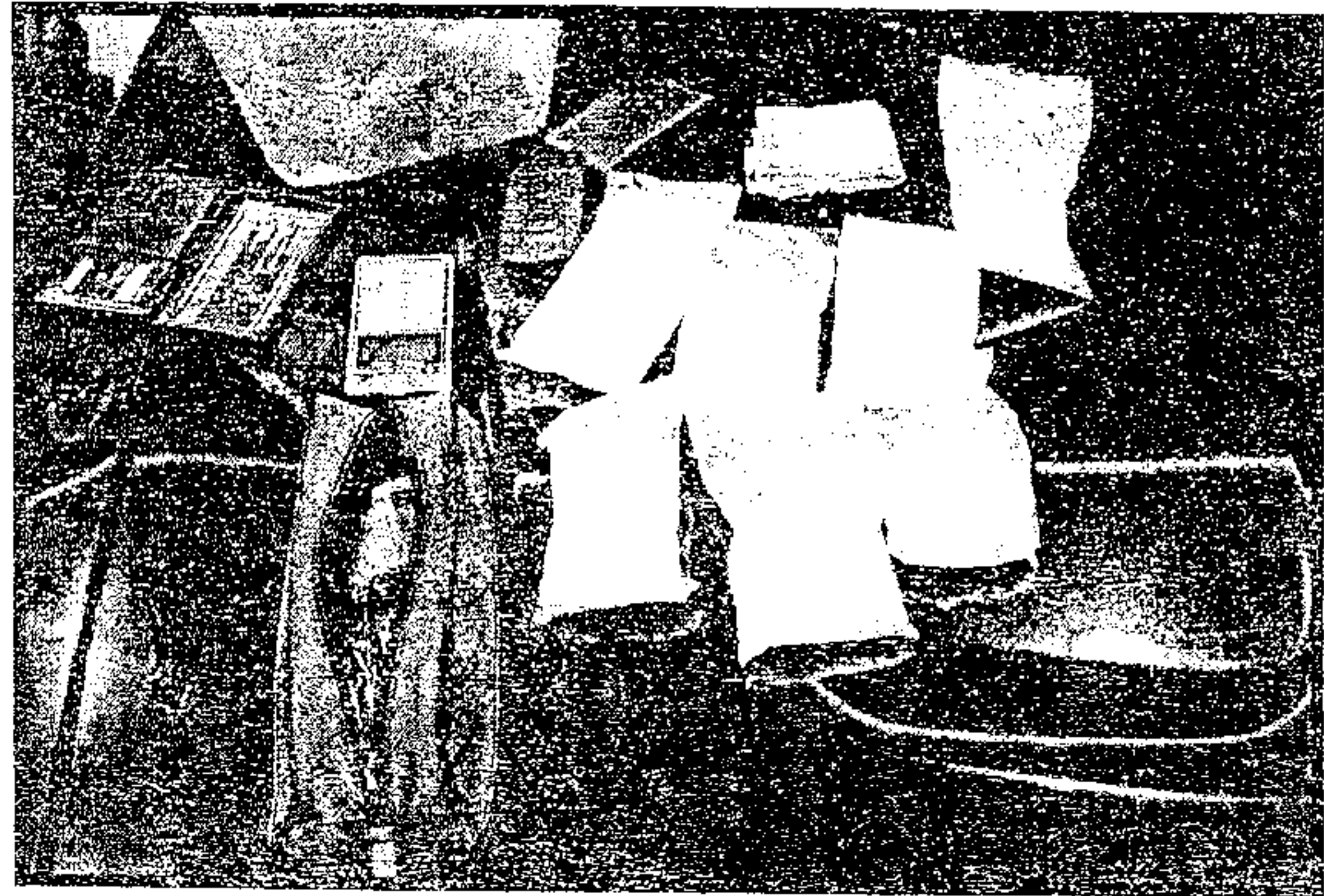
there car again. Officer Yates made contact with them and attempted to identify them. The driver Jason Hutchinson did not have a valid driver's license and was found to be armed with a loaded 380 caliber handgun in his back pocket. Hutchinson is a convicted felon in the State of Tennessee and cannot possess a firearm. Two bags of methamphetamine was also found in his pants pocket.

Officer Houser completed his Field Sobriety Tests and placed Ms. Thibault in custody for DUI. Jimmy Lowe, the passenger in the Jetta, who was still sitting on the curb, had made the comment that there was a "lot more

dope in the front seat of the white car" the Cougar that Thibault was driving.

Officer's began an inventory search of the Cougar at about the same time that Thibault gave Sgt. Mike Newman verbal consent to search the car. This search resulted in locating a glass pipe commonly used to smoke meth, a change bag with a bunch of black colored small zip lock bags. These small bags are common in the drug trade and are used to package and sell small amounts of narcotics. In the trunk

officers immediately found a firearm. It was a 9mm Highpoint pistol in a holster. Beside it was a large green bank bag with a black bag inside. Inside this bag was

a large amount of cash, what looked like crystal meth in six large, clear zip lock bags, several pills and more paraphernalia.
