Crimes Against Children Task Force (KPD-ICAC) and U.S. Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) learned that someone in the Gatlinburg area was circulating child pornography from a publicly open wireless router to undercover investigators in Queensland, Australia. KPD-ICAC investigators utilized an undercover persona to contact the suspect and glean more information about the source of the child pornography. During an undercover surveillance in the area of the public wireless router, investigators spotted the victims at a local fast food restaurant. Sammons was identified as the person who was making and distributing the child pornography and arrested.

This investigation was conducted by KPD-ICAC, HSI, and the Gatlinburg Police Department. Assistant U.S. Attorney Matthew Morris represented the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department


