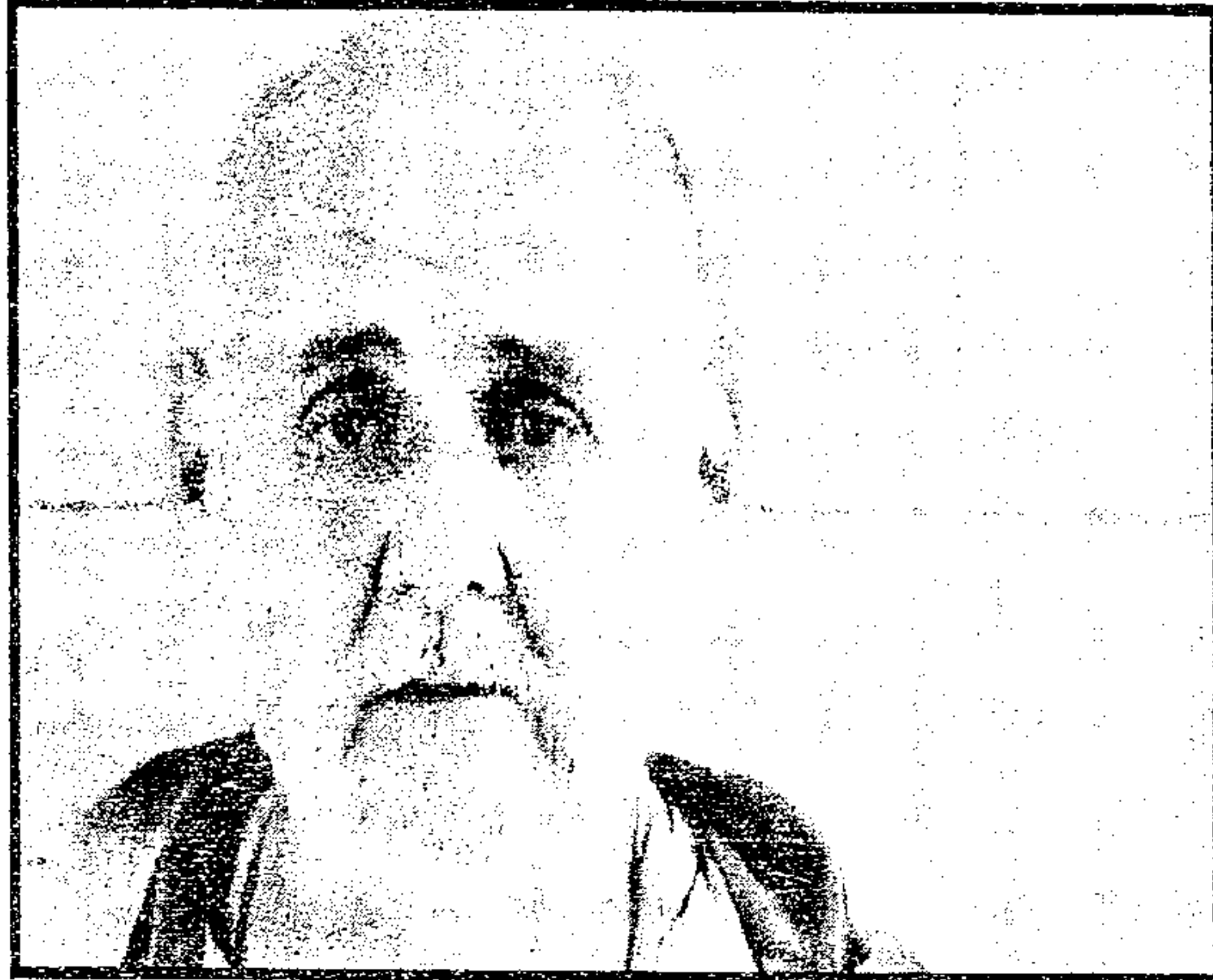

Eric Michael Johnson sentenced to 240 months in prison on federal child pornography and travel charges

On Sept. 3, 2015, Eric Michael Johnson, 29, of Jamesville, Wis., was sentenced in the by the Honorable Pamela R. Reeves, U.S. District Judge, to serve 240 months in prison for using a minor to produce child pornography and traveling interstate for the purpose of having illicit sex with a minor. Following his release from prison, Johnson will be supervised by the U.S. Probation Of-

fice for a term of 10 years and will be required to register with the sex offender registry in any state in which he resides, works, or attends school.

Johnson pleaded guilty in April 2015 to federal charges stemming from his October 2014 arrest in Knoxville. Johnson exchanged email messages with an undercover law enforcement officer in which he expressed

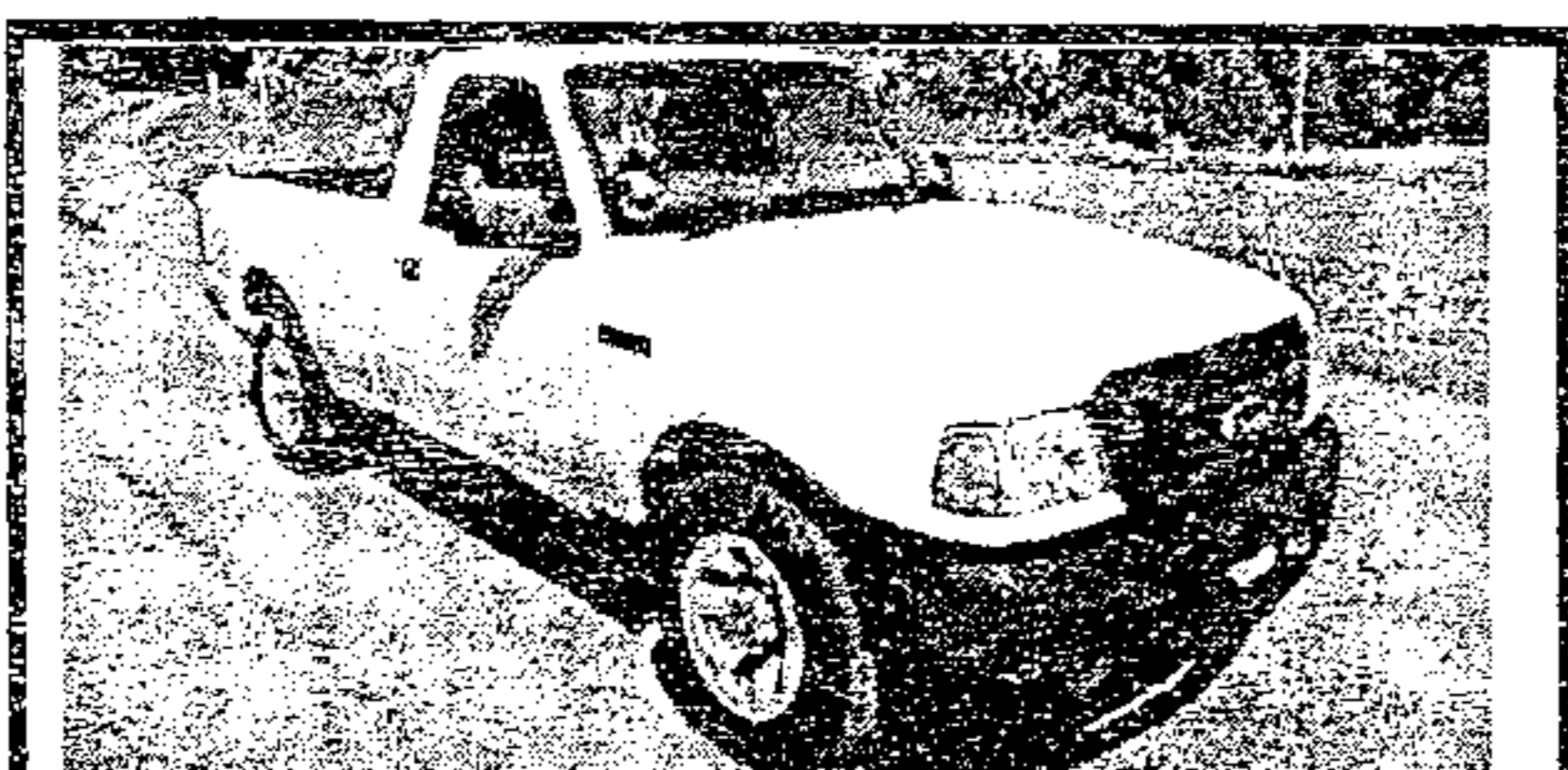

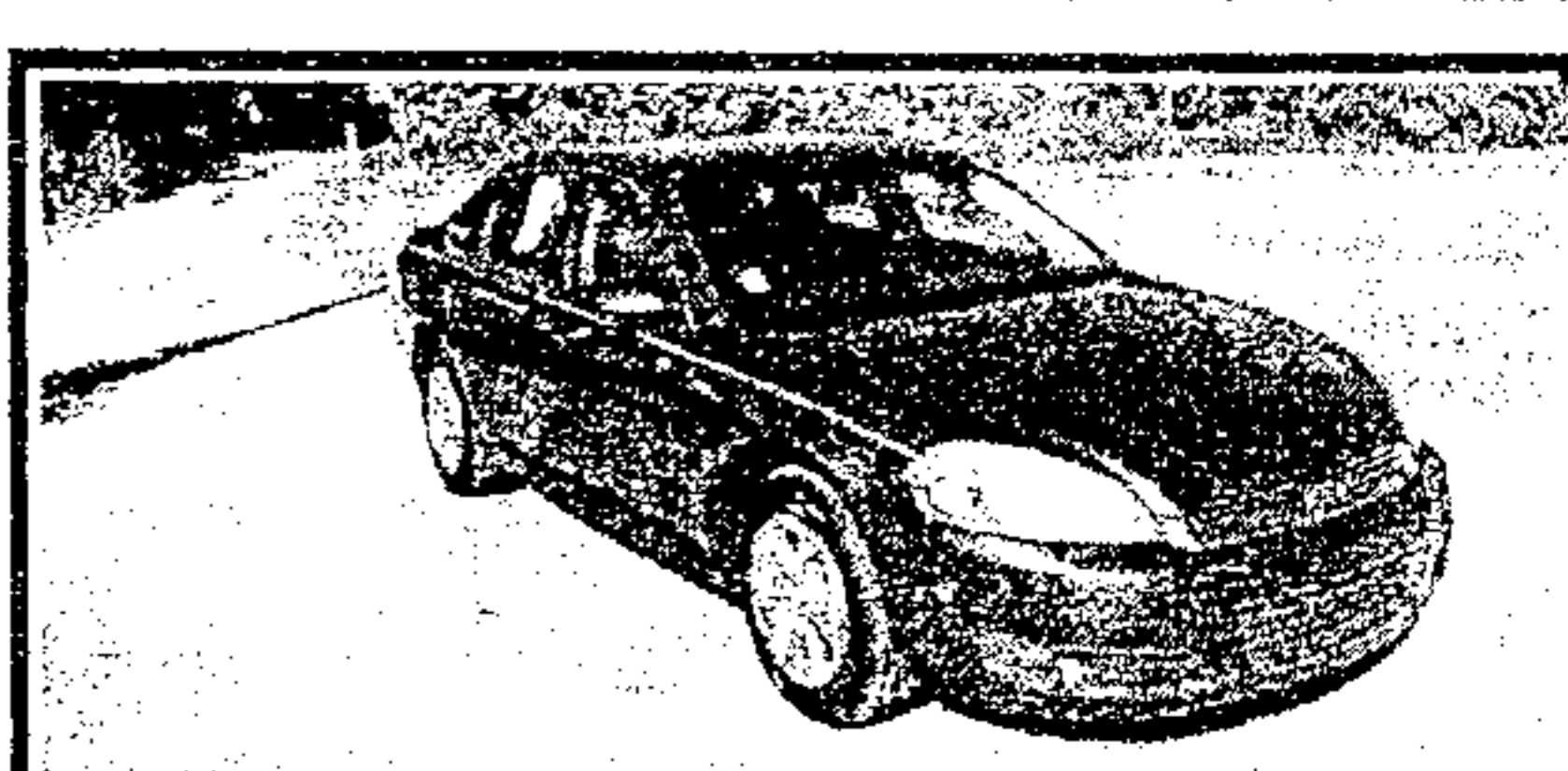

interest in having sex with a 12-year-old female. He drove from Wisconsin to Knoxville for the purpose of having sex with the girl. A search warrant for his cellular telephone revealed that he had previously sexually molested a minor female and made video recordings of the molestation, leading to additional charges pertaining to the production of child pornography.

This investigation was conducted by the Knoxville Police Department Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force and U.S. Homeland Security Investigations. Assistant U.S. Attorney Matthew Morris represented the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by U.S. Attor-

neys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section (CEOS), Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims. New Map Illustrates Teen Pregnancy Rates in Tennessee

The Comptroller's Offices of Research and Education Accountability (OREA) has added a new map to its website illustrating teen pregnancy rates in Tennessee.

The map is color-coded to reflect which counties have a pregnancy rate exceeding 19.5 per 1,000 females, ages 15-17. The map is based on the most current (2013) data published by the Ten-


nessee Department of Health.

Tennessee Code Annotated 49-6-1302 requires all school districts in counties with a pregnancy rate exceeding 19.5 to create and implement a family life education program. Currently, 37 Tennessee counties have rates exceeding 19.5.

The interactive map also includes pregnancy rates for previous years, allowing users to track trends over time.

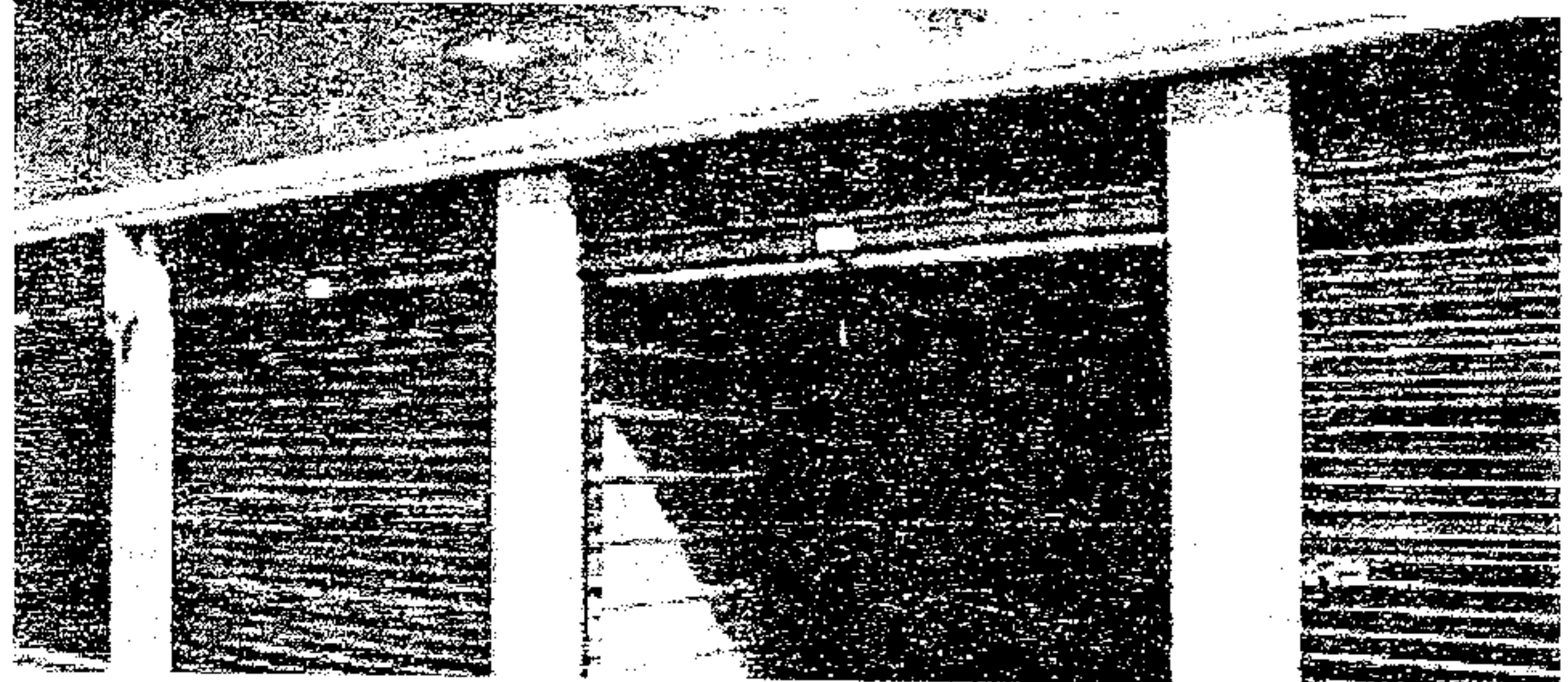

Federal jury convicts Juan Albreto Robles Zavala for attempting to entice a child under the age of 18 for sex using a facility or means of interstate commerce

Following a three day trial in U.S. District Court a jury convicted Juan Alberto Robles Zavala, a Mexico Nationalist working in Chattanooga, Tenn., of attempting to entice a child under the age of 18 for sex using a facility or means of interstate commerce.

Sentencing is set for 2:00 p.m., Jan. 20, 2016, in U.S. District Court in Knoxville, Tennessee. Zavala faces a mandatory minimum sentence of 10 years up to life in prison.

Evidence presented at trial showed that law enforcement placed a female profile on an adult sex website

"looking for right Dom needing a teacher for Taboo" for herself and her younger version. Zavala replied to the profile and learned that the younger version was a 12-year-old child. Over a four month period of time he emailed who he believed to be a mother and 12-year-old daughter with explicit details of his intent and desires to have sex with the child. Zavala was arrested when he arrived at the meeting location with condoms and a sexual aid.

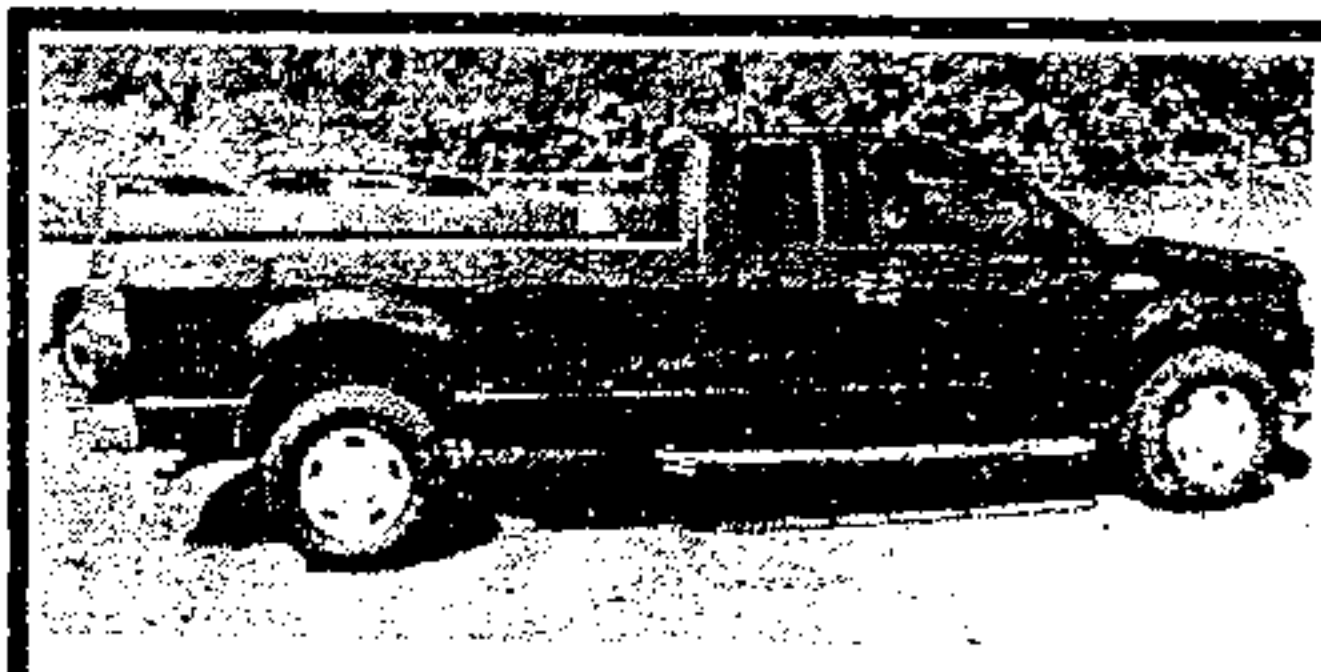

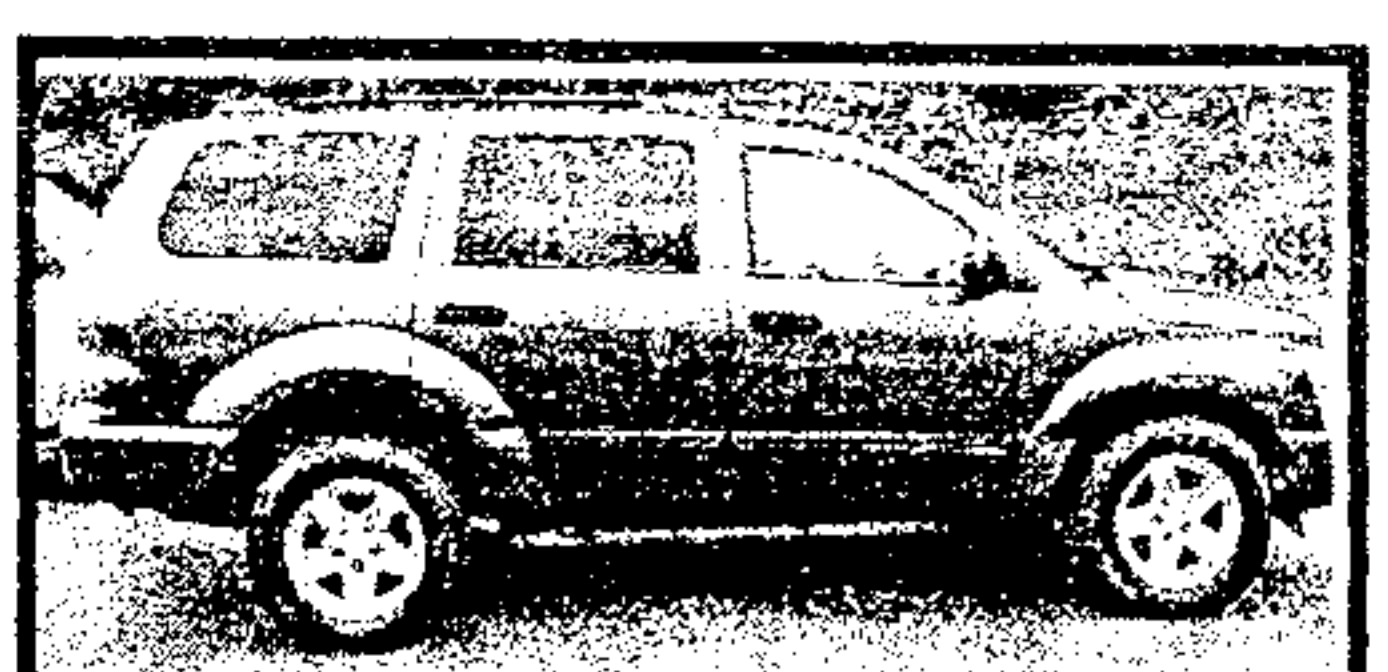
