

Con Artist Brought Arkansas to Justice

Arizona Woman Faked Cancer, Scammed Veterans

Fradulent Doctor's Letter Created by Chalice Zeitner

This fraudulent document, created by Chalice Zeitner and entered into evidence at her trial, falsely stated she had cancer and needed life-saving surgery by a certain date. She used this letter to receive a statefunded, late-term abortion.

sentenced to serve ove 24 years in prison for distributing crack cocaine

Marco Bobo, 39, of Forrest City, Ark., was sentenced on Nov. 21, 2016, by the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer, U.S. District Court Judge, to serve 292 months in federal prison. Upon his release from prison, he will be supervised by the U.S. Probation Office for five years. There is no parole in the federal system.

Bobo pleaded guilty in August 2016 to a conspiracy to distribute 280 grams or more of crack co-







but Zeitner was persuasive. Although the gala never took place, before the scam unraveled Zeitner stolen identities from the man and his family and used them to obtain credit cards to run up \$25,000 in personal charges. Another veteran's charity in Arizona was also scammed out of \$15,000.

The FBI caught up with the con artist in May 2015. She had fraudulently changed her name to Al Serkez and was living in Georgia. After her arrest and return to Arizona, she was indicted by the state on 11 counts related to the health care fraud. A few months later, a separate state indictment charged her with defrauding the veterans' charities.

Zeitner was deemed competent to stand trial. In both cases she mounted no defense but maintained her innocence. In April 2016, she was found guilty on the health care charges—among them, faking cancer to receive a government-funded, late-term abortion. In August 2016, after a separate trial, a jury convicted Zeitner on seven additional felony counts for scamming the veterans' charities. In September, an Arizona judge sentenced her to more than 25 years in prison.



Burn ban in effect for East TN

the Loudon From County Government, Office of the Mayor

Currently, East Tennessee weather has produced dry conditions with little or no rain fall, temperatures in the 80's, wind and low humidity for several weeks. Counties in our area have varying levels of drought conditions and these factors have created an increased brush and forest fire risk.

Because of this increased risk, Loudon County Mayor, Roland "Buddy" Bradshaw, in consultation with the state forestry office and TEMA has requested a Ban on Open Burning" in Loudon County from the state Commissioner of Agriculture. As approved, this ban is effective immediately and will remain in place until further notice.

Until our region receives appreciable rain fall, this increased fire risk will continue and the ban will remain in effect.

For the safety of all persons, livestock and property, we are asking our citizens to voluntarily comply with this ban.
