worked in the biotech industry, was hired by the medical research firm ICB International (ICBI) to identify investors who could fund its research. The San Diego-based company is developing technologies for early diagnosis and treatment of diseases such as Parkinson's and Alzheimer's.

"Basically, the company's founder invested his blood, sweat, and tears trying to come up with a cure for Parkinson's disease," said Special Agent John Roberts, who investigated the case from the FBI's San Diego Division.
