eral law is administered fairly, equitably, and effectively. We were directed to target the most serious offenses, prosecute the most

direct assistance to crime 'hot spots,' and pursue new ways to promote public safety, deterrence, efficiency, and fairness. This initiative from former Attorney General Holder came to be known as Smart on Crime.

We knew we had excelled for many years at these tasks, but we saw the challenge of finding new ways to look at deterrence, efficiency and fairness. We were also challenged to facilitate the successful reentry of former offenders, who have paid their debt to society through incarceration.

In 2015, the U.S. Attorney's Office developed its Smart on Crime Initiative by devoting a fulltime Assistant U.S. Attorney, Brooklyn Sawyers, to coordinate the initiative across East Tennessee. Our initiative includes a crime prevention program in which the U.S. Attorney's Office provides a live presentation about positive living and choices and consequences to iuvenile offenders in Knox County Juvenile Court and the Richard Bean Juvenile Detention Center. One goal of the prevention program is to dismantle the proverbial schoolto-prison pipeline in East Tennessee. The initiative also includes rigorous prosecution of criminals who violate federal law and whose bad acts will likely only be curtailed through a federal prison sentence.
