

Major drug trafficking organization members indicted for methamphetamine and firearms charges

On May 10, 2016, a federal grand jury returned an 80-count indictment, charging 27 individuals with conspiracy to distribute and possess with the intent to distribute more than 50 grams of methamphetamine. Six were charged with possession of firearms in furtherance of drug trafficking offenses.


Putting the Brakes on Intellectual Property Crime

In 2011, representatives from Mercedes-Benz contacted the FBI's Intellectual Property Rights Unit to report their suspicions that the diagnostic system had been compromised. The Bureau later sent an undercover operative to one of Vellozzi's automotive repair seminars, where the pirated units were being openly sold.

"Mercedes was rightfully concerned about its intellectual property," Parsons said, explaining that the diagnostic system could be used to modify and control a variety of critical features on automobiles, including air bags and braking systems.

"Vellozzi and his colleagues knew what they were doing was illegal," Parsons added. "Although the units were being sold openly at seminars he held around the country, Vellozzi didn't advertise the systems on his website or list them anywhere in his business records—and neither did Wittich and
