





#### Tax Free Weekend to be held in July for First Time


After years of complaints from shoppers that the annual sales tax holiday weekend came too late for them to actually do back-toschool shopping, this year is different.

Tennessee's sales tax holiday will now be one weekend earlier - before school starts - thanks to the Legislature changing the law

and setting the holiday on the last weekend in July instead of the first weekend in August.

So get ready to shop next weekend. Starting Friday, July 29, at 12:01 a.m. through Sunday, July 31, at 11:59 p.m., you'll save 9.75 percent on clothing, school supplies and computers, along with other items classified by the Tennessee


The Mason Place was built by Thomas Jefferson Mason, a river boat captain and a Union sympathizer. William Cassada, who was the contractor, Mason's son-in-law and a Confederate sympathizer, built into the upstairs porch balustrade the stars and stripes of the Confederate flag. Prior to the Civil War and construction of the house, slaves had made and stacked a quarter million bricks for the home. During the conflict, the bricks were used for a gun replacement at Fort Hill. Rather than wait for replacement bricks, Captain Mason decided to build the house out of heart-of-pine. The house originally sat on


