Tennessee Gov. Bill Haslam and Department of Veterans Services Commissioner Many-Bears Grinder today announced the state received nearly \$6 million dollars in federal funding from the National Cemetery Administration (NCA) for the construction of the future Tennessee State Veterans Cemetery at Parkers Crossroads.

The 132-acre cemetery will be located at 693 Wildersville Road and will serve more than 45,000 veterans and their families within 7 counties in west Tennessee.
