

the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel yesterday that 20-year-old Tyler Peterson came to his door in the hours after the rampage and calmly explained what he had done.

"He wasn't running around crazy or anything. He was very, very sorry for what he did," Mike Kegley told the paper, adding that he gave Peterson coffee and food and then called 911.

Peterson told Kegley that he had gone to his ex-girlfriend's house early Sunday morning in hopes of patching up the relationship after a recent breakup. He said Peterson lost control when an argument erupted and other people started ridiculing him as a "worthless pig."

Police, who declined to provide details of the argument, said Peterson stormed out, retrieved an AR-15 rifle from his car outside and burst back into the house firing 30 shots that killed all but one of the people at the party.

According to records, Deputy Mike Williams, LCSD, responded to the call along Jackson Bend Road and arrived to find heavy smoke coming from the entire structure. The homeowners and all occupants were outside.

Greenback Fire Department responded to the location and made entry, discovering fire in a downstairs bedroom. The fire was extinguished.

The officer reported the house was occupied by Toni Shaw and her mother. The elder woman suffers a medical condition and was transported to Ft. Sanders Loudoun Hospital by Rural Metro due to not feeling well.

Shaw reported no one had been downstairs prior to the fire and she first noticed the smoke upstairs coming from the air vents.

Records indicate the

cause of the fire was unknown at the time of the preliminary investigation, but the point of origin was determined to have been the downstairs bedroom. The house suffered fire and water damage downstairs and smoke damage throughout.

The officer concluded his report by noting Investigator Chris White responded and the investigation was turned over to him as well as Greenback Fire Chief Ronnie Lett.

Recycling Equipment Grants are available to local governments and non-profit organizations working with local governments. They may be used to purchase key equipment to establish new recycling programs, to improve existing operations or

to prepare recyclable materials for transport or sale. This grant program was authorized by the Solid Waste Management Act of 1991 and is supported by the Tennessee Solid Waste Management Fund. The Fund, which is administered by Environment and Conservation, receives its revenues from a state surcharge on

each ton of solid waste disposed in landfills and from a fee collected from new tires sold in Tennessee. Equipment purchased through Recycling Equipment Grantsude rolloff containers, skid loaders, shredders, balers, scales and other items.

Tennesseans who change their own motor oil generate more than 1 million gallons of used oil each year, which can pollute soil and water when not properly disposed. The General Assembly authorized the Used Oil Collection Act of 1993 to assist local communities in collecting used oil and reducing its negative effects on the environment, Grant

funds are provided through a two-cent fee collected from every quart of oil sold within Tennessee. The first priority for grant funding is to establish collection sites in underserved areas. Other grants will fund improvement or replacement of equipment in existing public and private facilities. 
