

Standoff

On Wednesday a standoff between 35 year old Billy Seiber and the Loudon County Sheriff's Department took place on Taylor Drive after a domestic violence call was placed to the Loudon County 911 Emergency Communications Center.

Officials from the LCSD, Loudon County Rescue, Rural Metro Ambulance Service and the Blount County SWAT team were dispatched to the scene where they encountered Seiber, who refused to leave the house on Taylor Drive and claimed to be armed with a weapon.

The suspect reportedly had broken the windows out in his girlfriend's vehicle and told her that he would kill any law enforcement officials, as well as her, if police were called to the scene. The girlfriend, who was unidentified, reportedly left the house and notified the E-911 center.

The suspect reportedly was armed with a knife and has a history of violent criminal activity. A check of his name by the LCSD revealed that Billy Seiber has a lengthy criminal history out of Knox County with a conviction for aggravated robbery as well as other charges, and spent four years in the state penitentiary under the custody of Tennessee Department of Corrections.

Seiber reportedly contacted the Loudon County Justice Center requesting to speak with officials during the standoff. Corporal Paul Curtis responded to the request and he and Assistant Chief Deputy James Davis II approached the house to speak with him.

Through communications with the suspect, Sheriff's Department officials were able to convince Seiber to give himself up and come out of the house without any unnecessary violence. He was then placed into custody.

Billy Seiber was transported via unmarked Sheriff's car to Ft. Sanders Loudon Medical center for medical evaluation after being secured at the scene.

The Blount County SWAT team was then called to stand down from the location before any kind of forced entry was executed on the dwelling.

Detectives from the Loudon County Sheriff's Department are currently investigating the crime scene and charges against Seiber are pending awaiting the conclusion of their investigation.

No serious injuries were reported during the standoff.

traveler information system. Phase II improvements include 19 new closed circuit traffic cameras, eight dynamic message boards, 80 speed detection devices and the addition of a citywide Highway Advisory Radio (HAR) system.

Approximately 60% of all congestion is caused by non-recurring incidents like traffic crashes. and these improvements will help TDOT find and respond to and clear incidents faster, said TDOT Commissioner Gerald Nicely. We are also placing more information at the hands of motorists which allows them to plan ahead or look for an alternate route when lanes are closed on the interstate.

The 19 new traffic cameras and nine new dynamic overhead message boards are located along I-440, I-40, I-65, and I-24 and can be viewed on the TDOT web site at: www.tennessee.gov/ tdot/tdotsmartway. Just click on Nashville to view all traffic

cameras available in the city.

Motorists also have a new way to access roadway information through the new citywide HAR system. When a traffic lane will be blocked for an extended time. flashing beacons located on signs across Davidson County will activate, alerting motorists to tune their radio dials to AM 1680. The system is currently being tested, but should be fully operational by the end of the week. It is important to note that daily rush hour congestion and short term lane closures will not be reported on the HAR system.




