

and Mr. Lewis pulled a gun from a holster and put the weapon to his head. The complainant stated he tried to stop Lewis from harming himself but when the complainant moved toward Mr. Lewis he shot the gun and fell to the ground making it appear he had committed suicide.

The reckless firing of the weapon in a residence area with houses close by placed the complainant in fear and the complainant then went to call 911 and he stated that Mr. Lewis got up and ran across the street to his residence and that was the last the complainant saw of him.

Upon arriving on the scene Deputy

Stanley and Deputies Scarbrough. Blakney, Wells, Ezell, Corporal Estes, Sqt. Wiggins, Asst. Chief Davis, and K9 handlers Watkins and Jenkins performed a thorough search of the area. Mr. Lewis was located hiding in the brush near his residence. On at least two prior occasions, deputies have been called to Mr. Lewis' residence on similar complaints

After receiving an undetermined amount of money, the robber left the bank on foot. Witnesses described the man as a white male. 60-65 years old, with gray hair and wearing glasses, he had on a dark ball cap, a light blue denim longsleeve shirt over a striped polo shirt, and blue jeans. He had several days' growth of facial hair but no actual beard or mustache. The same individual is believed to have also been the one who robbed the same bank on October 1 of this year. In the previous robbery, he claimed to be armed. No firearm was observed during either robbery.

be accompanied by a non-hunting adult, 21 years of age or older. The non-hunting adult does not need a license, but both youth and adult must wear 500 square inches of fluorescent orange.

Participating youth hunters 10 years of age and older are required to carry proof of successful completion of a Hunter Education Course. Adults who accompany the youth must be close enough to take immediate control of the hunting device (gun or bow).

The bag limit for this first segment is: Unit A & L (Middle and West Tenn.) – 1 antlered deer and 2 antlerless deer; Unit B (East Tenn.) - 1 deer either-sex. Antlered

deer taken on this hunt count toward the statewide limit on antlered deer. Antlered deer are defined as deer with antlers 3 inches long or longer.

Some of TWRA's Wildlife Management Areas will also be open for this hunt. A list of all WMAs and hunt dates can be found in the 2007 Tennessee Hunting and Trapping Guide.

Hunters, ages 6 through 12, do not need a hunting license but must purchase a permit if hunting on WMAs that require a permit. Resident hunters, ages 13 through 15, must have the Junior hunting license and permit if hunting certain WMAs or

Lifetime Sportsman License. Residents that are already 16 (when they purchase the license) must purchase adult licenses and permits.

Parents should remember that in order to check out a deer, the youth hunter needs to have available a TWRA ID Number or if the youth is under the age of 13 and does not have a license or hunting under landowner exemption, a Social Security Number is required.

Another segment of the Young Sportsman's Deer Hunt will be January 12-13, 2008. More details can be found in the 2007 Hunting and Trapping Guide.


