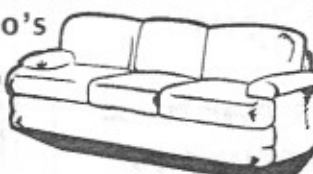

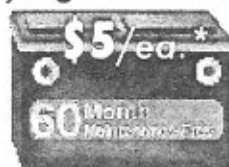

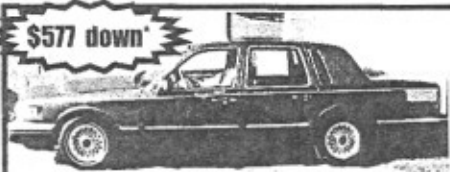

## Keep Your Veggies Light

Vegetables start out low-fat but can end up fat-laden by the time they hit your table. Consider these tips to keep your veggies light:

\*Sauté vegetables with liquid instead of oil - broth, juice, wine or water - in a covered, nonstick pan.

\*Steam, stir-fry (in a

nonstick wok or skillet), simmer, or microwave your vegetables.

\*Puree or mash potatoes, sweet potatoes and other vegetables with low-fat milk or reduced-sodium chicken broth.

\*Add a small amount of butter just before serving. Cooking dilutes butter's flavor, so you will use less if you add it last.

\*Sprinkle Parmesan or Romano cheese on vegetables for flavor

and not much fat.

\*Roast or grill vegetables as a low-fat way to bring out the flavor.

Keep your veggies light during cooking by making easy changes to your preparation.

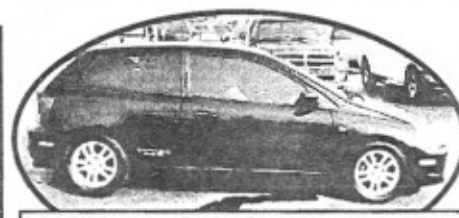
