Bust

While searching the front passenger seat Joseph Green the officer discovered 3 to 4 grams of marijuana in his groin area.

While searching the back passenger, Levi James Lester a small amount of marijuana was discovered on his person. While placing Lester under arrest for simple possession he fled the scene on foot. Levi Lester was pursued on foot for several blocks and was apprehended by Deputy Michael Watkins and his K9 partner Denoro.

Agents with the Loudon County Sheriff's Department Narcotics Division served a search warrant at a residence on Grimes

Road in Loudon. While searching the location a stolen AK 47 assault rifle was discovered outside of the residence. While interviewing the subjects living at the residence Yelverton advised he purchased the weapon from Levi Lester for \$100. The AK 47 rifle was stolen from a home burglary that happened several days prior in Lenoir city. Also found in Yelverton's room was approximately 19 grams of marijuana, a set of digital scales and two handguns.

Detective Jonathan Sartin, LCPD then filed charges on Lester following his investigations of several burglaries that occurred in Lenoir City. Accord-

ing to the warrants, on October 11, Levi Lester broke into the Mexican Store on B Street after entering the store he stole \$300 and scales.

On October 12 Lester broke into the Mexican store on B Street and stole \$10 out of the candy machine inside.

On October 24, Lester broke into a residence on Kingston Street and took several guns and cash.

On October 25 Lester broke into another Kingston Street residence and took several DVDs and a digital camera. All of this was done without the owners permission or knowledge.

Data collected on this date will provide agency wildlife biologists important information on the status of the deer herds in Tennessee.

Antler size and age of bucks, plus the age of does taken on opening day is very important for wildlife biologists in formulating season proposals for future deer hunting sea-

sons. In addition to the age of bucks, length of the main beam, circumference of the main beam, and greatest outside spread measurements will be taken on antlered bucks. In addition, deer will be checked for evidence of EHD.

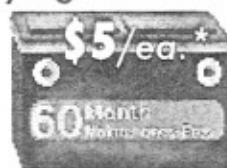

Tennessee's deer hunting units, according to the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA).

Due to the extended period of hot temperatures, fewer archery hunters took to the woods this fall and the harvest during archery season was off by more than 600 deer. This reduction in harvest during archery and the lack of abundance of acorns should mean a good harvest for muzzleloader hunters.

Hunters are allowed the following bag limit during this segment of muzzleloader season: Unit A - 5 deer, no more than one antlered; Unit L - 2 antlered (only one

antlered deer per day) and 3 antlerless deer per day; and Unit B (East Tennessee) - 1 deer antlered only (Except either-sex during Nov. 3-7).

This year, there have been two days added to the time antlerless deer can be taken by muzzleloader hunters. Last year, hunters were allowed either-sex deer during only the first 3 days of the muzzleloader season. The last 4 days were antlered-only. Hunters are still allowed to take one deer during the 7-day muzzleloader season, but they have 5 days to hunt either-sex, with the last two days being antlered-only.

For the exact boundaries of the different deer units

consult a 2007 Tennessee Hunting and Trapping Guide, available where hunting and fishing licenses are sold and at all TWRA offices.

Muzzleloading firearms of .40 caliber minimum plus long bows, compound bows and crossbows are legal hunting equipment for this season.

Resident hunters ages 16 through 64 must possess, in addition to other appropriate licenses, an annual big game license for the equipment used. Lifetime Sportsman license, Junior Hunt/Trap/Fish, Adult Sportsman license and Permanent Senior Citizens license holders are not required to pur-

chase supplemental big game licenses.

In addition to private lands, including public hunting areas, several wildlife management areas (WMAs) will be open to hunters during this muzzleloader season. Hunters need to refer to the 2007 Hunting and Trapping Guide for a listing of these WMAs.
